Mr. C. H. Bothamley sends the following corrections and additions to his article on *The Walled Town of Aigues-Mortes* (vol. lxxiii, pp. 218-294):

p. 218, fig. 1.—The names of the towers and gates are: 1. Porte de Nîmes (Vieille or de la Gardette). 2. Tour de Sel. 3. Porte St.-Antoine. 4. Tour de la Mèche. 5. Tour de Villeneuve. 6. Porte des Cordeliers. 7. Porte de la Reine. 8. Tour de la Poudrière. 9. Porte de l' Arsenal. 10. Porte de la Marine. 11. Porte des Galions. 12. Porte des Moulins. 13. Porte de l'Organe. 14. Tour des Bourguignons. 15. Porte de Montpellier.

p. 223, l. 6 from bottom.—After 'case' insert 'except Villeneuve-le-Roi (Yonne).'

p. 229, fig. 3.—2 is the embattled opening over the postern passage.

p. 239, note 1.—'extreme' should be 'exterior.'

p. 242, l. 2.—'east' should be 'south-east.'

p. 244, l. 26.—'north-east' should be 'south-east.'

pp. 247-250, fig. 4.—(a) is on the N.E. curtain S.E. of the Porte de Nîmes.

(b) is on the N.E. curtain between Porte St.-Antoine and Tour de la Mèche. (c) is on the N.E. curtain near the S.E. end. (d) is on the S.W. curtain S.E. of Porte des Galions. (e) is on the S.W. curtain N.W. of Porte de l'Organe. (f) is on the S.E. curtain between Porte de la Reine and Porte des Cordeliers. (g) is on the S.E. curtain N.E. of Tour de la Poudrière. (h) is on the S.W. curtain between Tour de la Poudrière and Porte de l' Arsenal. (i) is on the N.W. curtain towards the S.W. end, and (k) is on the N.W. curtain near the N.E. end. The scale of the reproductions is 1:128.

p. 251, l. 10.—'chemin de ronde' should be 'chemise de ronde.'

p. 260, fig. 8.—2 is a hinge of the Porte de Nîmes.

p. 261, fig. 9.—'first and second floors' should be 'upper chamber and roof.'

p. 262, l. 3 from bottom.—'south' should be 'south-west.'

p. 271, fig. 12B.—The smaller drawing is a plan of the lower chamber in the N.E. turret, somewhat above rampart level.

p. 273, fig. 13A.—The upper drawing is a plan of the garderobe and passage off the newel stair between the lower and upper chambers.

Plate XI.—4 is Porte de la Marine.

Plate XII.—2 is Porte des Moulins.

p. 283, fig. 14.—This loop is in the Tour de la Poudrière: the drawings from left to right are:—plan, interior elevation, vertical section, exterior elevation.

p. 289, l. 5 from bottom.—'south' should be 'south-west.'
