EIGHTY-FIRST REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

FOR THE YEAR 1922.

The Council have the honour to present their report for the year 1922.

During the year the Institute lost ten members by death, of whom four had been life-compounders, and twelve by resignation; seven libraries have also ceased to subscribe. On the other hand thirty-one new members were elected and eleven new libraries were added to the list, thus making a net gain of thirteen members and libraries.

Among those who have passed away the Council especially regret to record the names of the Rev. F. J. Eld, M.A. F.S.A, R. P. L. Booker, M.A. F.S.A, and R. Coltman Clephan, F.S.A.

Another volume of the Archaeological Journal (vol. 1xxvi, 1919) is in print and will appear directly. The Council regret that their hopes of publishing yet another volume during the year have been disappointed, but arrangements are now being made whereby the arrears will be overtaken more rapidly.

In 1921 a successful and well-attended summer meeting, organized by Captain Cunnington and Mr. Gough, was held at Ripon, and Mr. Crowther Beynon arranged a one-day visit in the autumn to Dartford, Darenth and Stone churches in Kent. The net profit arising out of these two meetings amounted to f 10 7s. 5d.

A marked increase in the attendance at the afternoon meetings of the Institute appears to have justified the recent experimental change in the hour of meeting, which the Council, accordingly, propose to maintain.

As will be seen from the accounts, which are attached to this report, the Institute has closed the year with a profit of $\pounds 287$ 145. 11d. after making provision for the estimated cost of the publications in arrear. Part of the balance in hand on 1st January, 1922, has been applied to the purchase of $\pounds 1,800$ 3½ per cent. Conversion Loan, which can be realized when required for the cost of publications as they fall due.

The members of the Council who retire by rotation are Mr. W. M. Tapp, LL.D. F.S.A, Mr. W. W. Watts, F.S.A, Mr. Harold Brakspear, F.S.A, Mr. F. C. Eeles, Sir Henry Fletcher, C.V.O, the Very Reverend the Dean of Gloucester, D.D. F.S.A, and Mr. F. E. Howard.

To take their places and that vacated by the death of Mr. Maurice Drake, the Council propose the election of Mr. L. G. Bolingbroke, Mr. C. A. Bradford, F.S.A, the Rev. D. H. S. Cranage, Litt.D. F.S.A, Mr. D. Cory Wright, M.A. F.S.A, Mr. V. B. Crowther Beynon, M.A. F.S.A, Mr. F. C. E. Erwood, Mr. W. H. Godfrey, F.S.A, and Mr. Aymer Vallance, M.A. F.S.A.

The Council also recommend that Sir Henry Fletcher, C.V.O. be appointed a Vice-President and that Mr. W. M. Tapp be appointed Hon. Auditor.
