EIGHTY-THIRD REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

FOR THE YEAR 1924.

The Council have the honour to present their report for the year 1924. During the year the Institute lost eight members by death, and six by resignation; on the other hand thirty-two new members were elected, two of whom have compounded, and four new libraries were added to the list, thus making a net gain of twenty members and libraries.

Among those who have passed away the Council regret to note the deaths of Canon S. E. Bartleet, William Brown of Sowerby, and H. R. H. Gosselin-Grimshaw, one time Secretary of the Institute.

Since the last report was presented, another volume of the Journal has been published (lxxviii.) Although the progress made is not so rapid as the Council had hoped, the arrears are being steadily made up and the amount of material available for publication is increasing.

In the autumn of 1924 a most interesting visit was paid to Maidstone and Allington Castle, and a well-attended Summer Meeting was held at Winchester. The cordial thanks of the Institute are due to all those who helped to make these meetings a success.

As will be seen from the accounts which are attached to this report the Institute has closed the year with a surplus of £353 4s. 7d. after making provision for the estimated cost of the publications in arrear.

From this year's Balance-sheet it will be observed that a change has been made in one of the Institute's investments, the sum of £1,000 5 per cent. War Loan Stock (1929/47) having been converted into £1,133 4½ per cent. Conversion Loan Stock (1940/44).

The members of the council who retire are: G. McN. Rushforth, M.A. F.S.A; A. Hadrian Allcroft, M.A; Prebendary W. G. Clark-Maxwell, M.A. F.S.A; A. C. Fryer, M.A. Ph.D. F.S.A; W. H. Knowles, F.S.A; and W. E. Miller, F.S.A.

To fill these vacancies the Council propose the election of: G. C. Druce, F.S.A; the Rev. J. K. Floyer, M.A. D.D. F.S.A; the Rev. E. H. Goddard, M.A; E. L. Guilford, M.A; S. D. Kitson, M.A. F.S.A; and Col. J. W. R. Parker, C.B. F.S.A.

The Council also recommend that Mr. R. Garraway Rice, F.S.A. and Mr. G. McN. Rushforth, M.A. F.S.A. be appointed Vice-Presidents, and that Mr. W. E. Miller, F.S.A. be appointed Honorary Auditor.
