#### EIGHTY-SEVENTH REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

## FOR THE YEAR 1928

The Council have the honour to present their report for 1928.

During the year the Institute lost twelve members by death and sixteen members by resignation, and four libraries have ceased to subscribe. Twenty new members have been elected and seven new libraries have been added to the list. The total membership is as follows:—

414 Subscribing members.

133 Libraries.

Among those who have passed away the Council regret to record the deaths of Mr. Willis-Bund, Mr. Challenor Smith, Mr. C. Hugh Chalmers and Lord Braye.

In July Mr. Hardinge-Tyler resigned the Secretaryship of the Institute after a period of office of over twenty years, during which he had devoted himself with continued zeal to its interests. On his retirement Mr. W. H. Godfrey accepted office for a limited period and the Registered Offices of the Institute were removed from Bloomsbury Square to 18 Queen Anne's Gate.

The Summer Meeting was held at Shrewsbury and was organised by Mr. C. Soden Bird.

In the autumn a Meeting was held at Westminster Abbey, where the wall paintings, the Chapter House and the painted decorations on the tombs and furniture of the Abbey were inspected under the guidance of Mr. Lawrence E. Tanner, F.S.A.

#### EIGHTY-SEVENTH REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

During the year the Council decided to take effective steps to overtake the arrears in the Institute's publications. An Editorial Committee of three was formed, each member undertaking to produce one volume. Mr. Hardinge-Tyler consented to complete Volume 81 (1924) which was already in progress. The three subsequent volumes were allocated as follows:—

Of these Volume 82 was issued before the end of the year and the others are in the press and will be published before the Summer Meeting.

The audited accounts for the year are attached to this report. It will be seen that after making provision for publications in arrear there remains a surplus of £134 19s. 1d.
