

## NINETY-THIRD REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

FOR THE YEAR 1934

The Council has the honour to present its report for the year 1934.

During the year the Institute has lost nineteen members by death, and eighteen members by resignation, and one library has ceased to subscribe, while twelve members have been removed for non-payment of subscriptions over a number of years. Fifty-six new members have been elected and two new libraries. Among its losses the Council records with especial regret the deaths of Sir George Duckworth, C.B., F.S.A., Hon. Treasurer since 1932, and of Sir Harold Brakspear, K.C.V.O., F.S.A., F.R.I.B.A., a Vice-President and an outstanding contributor to the Institute's activities.

The total membership is as follows :—

119 Libraries.

The Summer Meeting was held at York, and was organised by Lt.-Col. B. S. Browne. The Institute is especially indebted to Mr. A. W. Clapham, C.B.E., F.S.A., Professor A. Hamilton Thompson, D.Litt., F.S.A., F.B.A., and Dr. W. Collinge, F.S.A., who acted as local Hon. Secretary, for their valuable help.

The Spring Meeting was held at Dorchester (Oxon) and Ewelme, and the Autumn Meeting at Ham House and Kingston, Surrey. The Institute is indebted to Dr. Lawrence Finney, F.S.A., for help at the latter meeting.

Wednesday, May 9th. 'The Second Harvard Archaeological Mission to Ireland: the Excavation of the Cemetery-cairn of Knockast and of the Ballinderry Crannogs.' By Dr. H. O'N. Hencken, F.S.A.

Wednesday, June 6th. *Annual General Meeting.* 'The Bishop's Palaces of St. David's and Lamphey.' By Mr. C. A. Raleigh Radford, F.S.A.

Wednesday, November 7th. 'The Chancery Court of the Cinque Ports.' By Miss K. M. E. Murray, B.Litt.

Tuesday, December 11th. 'Celtic Forts and Duns in Scotland.' By Professor V. Gordon Childe, B.Litt., F.S.A.
