THE ONE HUNDRED AND FIRST REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

FOR THE YEAR 1942

The Council has the honour to present its report for the year 1942.

During the year the Institute has lost six members by death and eight subscribing members by resignation. Three subscribing members have been elected and one library. Among its losses the Council records with especial regret the deaths of Mr. J. A. Gotch and Mr. R. V. Berkeley.

No Summer Meeting and no visits to places of interest were organized during the year but the usual programme of afternoon meetings in London was arranged and the following papers were read :

Volume XCVIII of the *Journal* was published in August.

No grants in aid of excavations were made during the year but £15 was contributed to the Lord Mayor of Bristol's Fund for the preservation of the Theatre Royal, Bristol.

The Senior Vice-President, Colonel C. de W. Crookshank, J.P., D.L., F.S.A., retires and the Council recommends that he be appointed an Honorary Vice-President and that Mr. E. S. M. Perowne, F.S.A., be appointed a Vice-President in his place.
