FOR THE YEAR 1943

The Council has the honour to present its report for the year 1943.

During the year the Institute has lost fourteen members by death, seven subscribing members by resignation, and the names of six members have been amoved for nonpayment of subscriptions. Five subscribing members have been elected and four libraries have become regular subscribers to the Journal. Among its losses the Council records with especial regret the death of Mr. W. H. Knowles.
