# THE ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTEENTH REPORT OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR 1956

The Council has the honour to present its report for the year 1956.

During the year the Institute has lost eight members by death, fourteen have resigned, and two have been amoved for non-payment of subscriptions. Fifty-nine new members have been elected. Ten new libraries have become regular subscribers to the Journal and two have withdrawn their subscriptions.
