Description of works				
<b>Description of works:</b> An archaeological trench evaluation and historic building recording was undertaken by Oakford				
Archaeology in March 2012 in advance of development at Moorshead, Deancombe, Devon (SX 7129)




Fig. 1 Location of site

6340). The site (Fig. 1) is part of a Dartmoor longhouse, probably built during the middle of the 15 <sup>th</sup>				
century, and fallen into ruin during the 20 <sup>th</sup> century. The work was required under a condition attached to the grant of planning permission (ref. 0135/11).




Fig. 2 Plan of Moorshead Manor House and location of building elevation and evaluation trench.

Results (figs. 2-3, pl 1-2):				
Prior to commencing works the south-west elevation of the longhouse was drawn. Unfortunately this				
had been re-pointed in anticipation of the works. Little information could be gathered from this, other than that the south-east corner of the building had been partly re-built in recent years to support the roof				
over the garage.				
The evaluation comprised the excavation of a sin				
0.35m deep. Trench 1 was archaeologically sterile. The area had previously been reduced and infilled with concrete rubble and soil (101), thereby removing any potential archaeological remains.				
Discussion:				
The evaluation has demonstrated that the area of the proposed development is archaeologically sterile. No features or deposits were found to indicate archaeological activity within the trench. The area had				
been reduced by the previous owners sometime in the 1980's. The lack of pottery and lithics from the				
site, despite examination of spoil heaps, further indicates that the potential for significant archaeological				
survival is low. As a result, it was agreed with the DNPA Archaeologist that no further archaeological				
site work was necessary. This is the only report o	n these w	Orks.




Fig. 3 South-west elevation of Moorshead longhouse and section through development area.
