#### Review of activity during the year

The Group's activities (policy making, conferences and publication) have continued as before. The range of interests and issues is reflected in the content of the accompanying journal (*Medieval Settlement Research* 32) covering the year 2017.

#### **Result of the year**

There was a surplus of income over expenditure of £739 (deficit of £2,102 in 2015–16).

#### **Reserves policy**

#### Grant making policy
