Cheapside (CID90): identifications

Condition (for guide to length of time in circulation before loss): (A) - unworn; (B) - slight wear; (C) - "average" wear; (D) - fairly heavy wear; (E) - very heavy wear; (?) - not ascertainable, due to heavy corrosion.

AE = bronze/copper alloy, AR = silver

References: RIC = Roman Imperial Coinage, various volumes
LRB = Late Roman Bronze Coinage

All are final identifications: * represents the latest lot of coin identified, not appearing on previous lists.

Note: in the case of the Irregular Claudian coins, the better the Grade, the earlier is likely to be the date of manufacture, though translating this into absolute years is difficult.

- *685 3597 Illegible AE 10mm. 2 casting-sprues suggest irregular; unlikely Theodosian (late 4th C). Possibly later 3rd C, or a "Fallen Horseman" copy of Constantius II, ?c.270-365 (?)
- 764 2614 c.355-402 Uncertain AE 11mm; obv., bust r; rev. unc. (?D)
- *839 2629 ?c.340-400 Illegible AE 13mm, either irregular Constantinian (c.340-65) or Theodosian (379-402) (?)
- *1041 2762 Illegible, AE 16mm with high lead content. I would guess, on module, metal and 'feel', at House of Valentinian, possibly a cast copy. ?c.365-375 (?)
- *835 2629 Illegible AE c.22mm, corroded & broken
- *1056 2717 Illegible AE 11mm blob. Broken and distorted from corrosion. Possibly a copn of c.350-400, but might be a plain blob of high-lead copper alloy.
- 846 2641 Illegible AE fragment, not necessarily a coin
- 919 2641 Tiny 'chocolate-drop' shaped AE globule, flat on one side and slightly domed on the other. Unlikely a coin - metalworking residue?
- *1043 2711 AE/Pb disk, 11.5mm. This seems to be very high lead content for a coin, and I don't like the bevelled edge either.
- 61 2367 Silver penny of Edmund (939-946)
 obv. [E A D M] V N D + R E X
 rev. [.....] / + + + / E L M O (Moneyer's name, divided into two lines, separated by three crosses; first part missing, MO standing for MONETA, though the M might be one of the letters of his name as well. I have a list of the possible moneyers, but donot know which, or where he was minting. This coins should be given to a Saxon coin specialist for a full report.

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
