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- Standing Building Survey -

1. Background

- 1.1 A standing building survey was required for a steading at Myreside Farm, Raemoir, Banchory, Aberdeenshire, prior to its alteration and extension to form three dwelling houses.
- 1.2 The archaeological condition was applied in the context of planning legislation (PAN 2/2011, SPP, SHEP), which states that it is necessary for developers to arrange for archaeological work to take place prior to development, in appropriate circumstances. Planning Application Numbers: APP/2016/1733. Condition 4.
- 1.3 A Level 1 Standing Building Survey was required which includes measured plans and elevations, a written account of the building's plan, form, function, age and development sequence in addition to a photographic survey of the interior and exterior of the building.
- 1.4 Murray Archaeological Services Ltd was commissioned to undertake the work by Mr David Clark. The site element of the survey was completed on the 12th December 2016.

2. Desk-top survey

2.1 A search was carried out in the Sites and Monuments Record, Archaeology Service, Aberdeenshire Council and in the National Monuments Records of

Scotland at the Historic Environment Scotland (HES) through Canmore and Pastmap.

- 2.2 The 1st and 2nd edition Ordnance Survey maps were consulted.
- 2.3 The plans and elevations were supplied courtesy of Mr David Clark and annotated by MAS Ltd.


3. The Site

3.1 The site, which extends to c. 7000 sq m, lies on a private track just N of the B977 and lies at c115m OD on the S slopes of the Hill of Fare. It was originally part of the Raemoir prioperties of Dunecht Estates.



Illus 1 Detail of OS map.Ordnance Survey © Crown copyright (2002) All rights reserved. Licence number (100049810). Site indicated by red circle.


4. Documentary evidence

4.1 **1864 Kincardine Sheet II.13 1864 (pub 1868)** shows an L plan steading with N range and W range with horsemill at NW. A second building lies to the N, parallel with the N range. The house is to the E of the track.

4.2 **1901** By the 2nd edition 25"/mile Ordnance Survey of 1901 (published 1903. Kincardineshire Sheet 005.09) the steading has been developed into a U-plan open to the S, with an new E range. A small building forms part of the S side of the dung court. The building to the N remains. The house has been extended on the N side.




5 Methodology



Building 1

<u>Dimensions</u> 34.4 x 16.8m externally

Present/recent use Derelict

Original use

N range Byre

E range Stable and cart bays with loft above.

Wrange Barn with grain loft

<u>Walls</u> E range and S wall of court: walls of squared blocks dark red granite with small black flecks.

N and W ranges: walls of squared granite with greater range of colours buff-pink.

Roof N range roof now collapsed (not as in drawing dated 2015). E and W ranges slate roofs with ceramic ridge and metal skylights. E range both gables pitched. W range /junction to N range at NW roof hipped.

Doors and windows

W range S wall

D1 W: 1.01m H: 2.01m. Wide pink granite lintel that also forms lintel of W1 and is the sill of D2. Wall stones form rybats. Plank door (Painted dark Buckingham green which was for many years the Dunecht estate 'colour' for their properties). Iron pivots to either side of door.

W1 W: 0.80m H: 1.10m. Concrete blocked

D2 W: 0.94m H: 1.9m. Grey granite lintel. Plank door

W range E wall

D3 W: 2.75m H: 2.97m Concrete and red granite on S side, red granite walling on N side, steel lintel. Clearly widened and raised.

N range S wall

D4 W: 1.18m H: 2.05m Granite lintel. Wall stones form rybats at sides of door.

F1 Possible stone blocking- very unclear.. Appears to be door width but not visible for full height.

D5 W: 1.20m H: 2.05m. As D4.

W2 W: 0.62m H: 0.62m Grey granite lintel

D6 W: 1.20m H: 2.05m. As D4.

W: 0.62m H: 0.62m Grey granite lintel. 4 pane fixed window.

E range W wall

W4 W: 1.0m H: 1.70m. Red granite lintel and sill. Base of window 1.10m from ground.

E range S wall

D10 W: 1.31m H: 2.82m. Plank door with 4 –pane fanlight above. Red granite lintel. Tiny horse-shoe on door.

D11 W: 0.93m H: 1.35m. Plank door. Red granite lintel and sill.

E range E wall

D12 W: 1.07m H: 2.13m red granite lintel and sill. Plank door.

W5 W: 0.73m H: 1.40m Red granite lintel and sill. Concrete blocked.

D13 Cart bay. W: 2.43m H: 2.20m Red granite lintel.

D14 Cart bay. W: 2.43m H: Lintel removed and replacement steel lintel at wall head

S wall

D7 W: 1.23m H: 2.20m Concrete lintel. Plank door.

D8 W: 2.45m H: 2.20m, blocked with concrete blocks to 1.54m.

D9 W: 4.9m. Double metal gates.

Interior

The interiors were empty and little detail survived.

Wrange Loft floor almost fully removed. Concrete floor. No detail.

N range Derelict. Not safe to enter.

E range Loft floor removed, stubs of joists only. Concrete floor. No detail.

Walls Squared blocks dark red granite with small black flecks.

<u>Roof</u> Main area pitched slate roof. Lower, lean-to slate roof at E end.

Doors and windows


D15 W: 0.91m H: 1.92m. Granite lintel and sill.

D16 W: 2.30m H:2.45m. Wide granite lintel. Metal doors. Iron hinge pivots.

D17 W: 2.44m H: 2.45m Wide granite lintel. Metal doors. Iron hinge pivots.

D18 W: 2.75m H: 2.45m. Red granite lintel. Metal door.


Interior. No detail. Main area divided in two sections.

7 Discussion


This is a fairly good example of an estate-built steading with generally good, well-dressed stonework. The more mixed granite of the N and W ranges is clearly the earlier construction confirming this is the original L-plan steading shown on the 1864 OS map. The horse-mill on the map indicates that the barn and grain loft were always in the W range. The dark red, speckled, granite of the E range and S wall of the court correspond to the buildings on the 1901 OS map, which extended the steading. As the new E range included stables and cart bays, it is possible that these functions were originally in the freestanding building to the N. The N building (Building 2) may also have been rebuilt between 1864 and 1901 as it is constructed on the same dark red, speckled, granite as the E range of Building 1. It is however on the same footprint as the building shown here in 1864.
