
- 1. Background
- 1.1 As part of the preparation for submission of a planning application for an aggregates quarry at Rainieshill, Newmachar, Aberdeenshire an assessment of the Historic Environment was carried out.
- A desktop survey was undertaken, followed by a walkover survey of the site. This Walkover Survey was undertaken on 1st March 2019.
- 1.3 The archaeological work was undertaken in the context of planning legislation (PAN 2/2011, SPP, HESPS), which states that it is necessary for developers to arrange for archaeological work to take place prior to development, in appropriate circumstances.
- 1.4 Murray Archaeological Services Ltd was commissioned to undertake the work by Johnson Poole and Bloomer Ltd on behalf of JKR Contractors Ltd.

2. The Site

Grid Reference (central) NJ90599, 20570

Parish : Udny


2.1 The site , which is also called Beauty Hill, is situated to the W of the B999 and c.2km NE of Newmachar. It is directly S of Braeside of Balnakettle.

- 2.2 At the time of the survey, the lower part of the proposed site was improved cultivated ground, with the upper part of the hill in rough grass with stony outcrops and some patches of gorse
- 2.3 The proposed site covers 13.9 hectares.
- 2.4 *Sites on the proposed site*
- i NRHE No: NJ92SW77 & Aberdeenshire SMR : NJ 92SW0017 Beauty Hill. Rig and Furrow centred on 9065 2043
- Aberdeenshire SMR: NJ92SW0087 Beauty Hill. Earthwork. Described as 'series of low mounds and banks in area without rigs' and thought to possibly relate to the flagstaff etc (Illus 5).

A search on Pastmap (<u>https://pastmap.org.uk/map</u> accessed 8/3/2019) revealed that there are 25 sites on the Aberdeenshire and NRHE sites and monuments records that lie within a 1km radius of the centre of the proposed sites A catalogue of the sites is in Appendix 2. They comprise:-

- 11 **farmsteads or cottages** that are shown on the 19th century OS maps and most of which survive.
- 6 **quarry pits** most of which appear on maps from c 1900
- 2 railway related features
- 1 **earthwork**, possibly related to the flagstaff on Beauty Hill
- 4 areas of **rig and furrow**

Prehistoric stone cup and 2 stone axes found in late 19th century in Logie
Buchan parish. Exact findspot unknown.

<u>Summary</u> There is little known evidence of prehistoric activity in the 1km area around the site, but this may to some extent reflect a lack of archaeological field walking or evaluation in the area as in general this area of Buchan, near to the Ythan valley appears to have been well used throughout prehistory.


There is considerable evidence of medieval or post medieval rig and furrow cultivation which is also reflected by the considerable areas of cultivation shown on Roy's military map of 1747-55.

The remaining features all relate to the 19th century settlement of the area, with small quarries which are of late 19th/early 20th century date and were probably used to quarry stone for the farmsteads. Two features relate to the dismantled railway of the former Great North of Scotland Railway's Buchan and Formartine line which was built in 1858, and shut in 1966.


- 3 Methodology
- 3.1 All mapping was done with an Ordnance Survey Aventura GPS.
- 4 Desktop Survey
- 4.1 A search was carried out in the Aberdeenshire Sites and Monuments Record, Archaeology Service, Aberdeenshire Council and in the Sites and Monuments Records of the Royal Commission for Ancient and Historic Monuments in Scotland (RCAHMS, now HES) through Canmore and Pastmap.
- 4.2 The 1st and 2nd edition Ordnance Survey maps were consulted. The Ordnance Survey Name Book was consulted on-line at https://scotlandsplaces.gov.uk/digital-volumes/ordnance-survey-name-books
- 4.3 The British Newspaper archive was searched for references to the property. www.britishnewspaperarchive.co.uk

5 Documentary Background

1747-55 Roy's Military Map of 1747-55 shows Raingshill (sic) as a cluster of buildings with the rig and furrow of cultivated ground extending up the lower W/SW slopes of the hill.

1865-71 The OS Name Book described Beauty Hill as 'Applies to a large hill feature a little south east of Braeside of Balnakettle'. Possibly owned by Kings College Aberdeen. (OS1/1/91/91 <u>www.scotlandsplaces.gov.uk</u>

1869 12th Company 2nd ARV (Aberdeen Rifle Volunteers) held a competition match at the company's range at Beauty Hill. (*Aberdeen Press and Journal* 18th June 1869).


1871 ARV (Aberdeen Rifle Volunteers) held a competition match at the range on Beauty Hill. (*Aberdeen Press and Journal* 30th August & 11th October 1871).

1872 ARV (Aberdeen Rifle Volunteers) held a competition match at the range on Beauty Hill. (*Aberdeen Press and Journal* 11th September 1872).

1876 ARV (Aberdeen Rifle Volunteers) held a competition match at the range on Beauty Hill. (*Aberdeen Press and Journal* 22nd March 1876).

1887 Jubilee bonfire and picnic for Queen Victoria's jubilee on 21st June 1887 (*Aberdeen Press and Journal* 22nd June 1887). The picnic seems to have continued for a number of years.

1899 The 25"/mile OS map of 1899, published 1900 (Aberdeenshire LVI.6) shows little change, with the exception of a 'target' Mantel' (screen) and flagstaff.


1900 ARV (Aberdeen Rifle Volunteers) held a competition match at the range on Beauty Hill. (*Aberdeen Press and Journal* 24th November 1900).


1901 The annual New Years Day competition of the Culter-Cullen and Newmachar sections of C company 2nd VBGH took place at Beauty Hill range (*Aberdeen Press and Journal* 4th January 1901).

1914 Competition match on range on Beauty Hill range (*Aberdeen Press and Journal* 24th July 1914). [WW1 began on 28th July 1914].

1917 Rifle practice on Beauty Hill range (*Aberdeen Press and Journal* 21st September 1917).

Post 1936 Triangulation point on pillar. The Ordnance Survey erected the first trig point pillar in UK in 1936.

Features

- 1 Small quarry pit
- NJ 90412, 20479. Small quarry pit and waste heap.

2 Field clearance

NJ90701, 20589. Stone gatherings in corner of the improved ground, just beside modern post and wire fence. Recent.

3 Field clearance

NJ90679, 20656 Stone heap c 2m in diameter. This heap of stones was also near the new fence and appeared unstructured and more likely to have been fairly recent agricultural clearance rather than a cairn.

4 Rig and furrow

Between approximately NJ 90765, 20532 to NJ90661, 20507 (but possibly continuing further up the hill to the triangulation point).

The ridges of rig and furrow cultivation were apparent running NW/SE. the centres of the tops of the rigs were at 6 to 7.5m spacing and survived at best to c. 300mm height and between 3 and 4m in width.

6 Discussion

Rig and furrow

The rig and furrow known from air photographs is clearly visible on the ground. The rig and furrow recorded from air photographs (NRHE No: NJ92SW77 & Aberdeenshire SMR : NJ 92SW0017) is clearly part of this feature- although centered at NJ 9065 2043, slightly S of the rig observed on the ground. Although described as medieval in the SMR it is equally possible that this rig system may be of post-medieval date.

Rifle Range

There appears to have been a Rifle Range on Beauty Hill from at least 1869 to the end of WW1. Initially the range was created for the 12th Company 2nd ARV (Aberdeen Rifle Volunteers). The Volunteer Forces were created in 1859 after the Crimean War.

Eventually units became integrated in the Territorials. The 1899 OS map shows a Target, Flagstaff and Mantel (a bullet proof shield or screen) on the N flank of the field. No evidence was observed on the ground but it is likely these may have been ephemeral features. The SMR suggests that a series of low banks and mounds (Aberdeenshire SMR: NJ92SW0087) at NJ 9077 2068 may be related to the range. These could not be identified on site; however this area has considerable natural rock outcrop.

7 Impacts

7.1 An area of rig and furrow will be destroyed by the quarry. The extent, size and orientation of the rig and furrow is documented.
