Glastonbury 1954
Trench west of monk's kitchen. Path to east of west face of walling (approx 4') parallel with wall of monk's kitchen (see sketch).

## Page 1 back

*A piece of pottery was found at * on plan under mortar layer (labelled in envelope) [F:BF1050].

## Description

At approx $6^{\prime}$ depth over southern half of trench area was found a mortar layer of varying thickness and consistency. This layer ceased at a point adjacent to the line of stonework (which began 3' from N face of trench), the layer was also seen in section in the southern face *.

At $6^{\prime}$ from Monks kitchen wall the rough face of a wall (a wall trench) was seen - from $6^{\prime \prime}$ to $1^{\prime} 6^{\prime \prime}$ from natural level (ie. top of trench). The bottom $6^{\prime \prime}$ of wall face contained loose stones surrounded by a dark clayey soil (see sketch).

## Page 2

At $1^{\prime} 3^{\prime \prime}$ to $2^{\prime} 3^{\prime \prime}$ from wall of monks kitchen and $4^{\prime}$ to $2^{\prime} 6^{\prime \prime}$ from $N$ side of trench \& at $1^{\prime}$ depth were a number of smaller stones with traces of mortar between them (shown on first plan as filled in areas). These did not continue to $S$ side of trench: were thus not seen in section in $S$ face of trench. The stones may have continued North under bastion (?)/ oven (?) - they were not followed under bastion (?)/ oven (?). A piece of pottery (labelled in envelope) was found just on top of these stones.

Beneath the modern wall of Monk's Kitchen no trace or original walling could be seen.


## Page 3

Glastonbury 1956

CL1. Sections 49 \& 51. 19'-22’6 from E face. Mortar layer slopes upwards from $17^{\prime}$ (depth $4^{\prime}$ ). At $22^{\prime}$ mortar layer is depth $2^{\prime}$.

Fragments of copper sheet found on mortar layer at $22^{\prime}$ depth $2^{\prime}-1^{\prime} 10$ from $S$ face. [F:SF3125].
Slag fragments found at various depths on mortar layer 19'-21'. [F:SF3100].

From fragments at $22^{\prime} 6^{\prime \prime}$ from E face.

Page 3 back

Depth 2'. 3' from $S$ face.

CL1. Sections 49 \& 51.

Mortar layer and post hole.

At $16^{\prime} 6^{\prime \prime}$ from E face, $2^{\prime}$ from $S$ face. Depth $4^{\prime}$ - suggestion of post-hole (therefore clay shape on floor of mortar)?
