




Doulting capital A133




Doulting shaft A61

Two fragments in blue coarse lias stone. 2" – length. 1½ - 2" width (varying)




Blue lias moulding A145

Fragment of Doulting stone. Width $5" \times 4"$ length. Curved surface. Large bead pattern.




Doulting moulding A113

Probably curve of arch of rood screen.



Measurements of sculpted surface length.






Doulting sculpture A132






Doulting moulding A144



Projection below bead moulding. 1" curved surface above. 1" in height above bead moulding. Probably a corbel.





Blue lias moulding A123 I


