'Mr Duncumbe for Groveburye Rent – £15 6s 8d'

Beds CRO KK 761, Terrier and Valuation of Jointure Lands

'A rental of the Two manors of Laighton Bussard made ... 1611 ... Groveburye pastures.'

Beds CRO KK 762, Rental of Jointure Lands

[Coleman believes that the latter refers to the main manor and the Prebendal manor]

'Gyles Duncumbe for his half yeare rent of Groveburye pasture – £15 6s 8d'

Beds CRO KK 726, 727, Bailiff's Accounts

1612      Bailiff's Account, James I

'Mr Duncumbe's rent for the pastures has been reduced to £15 3s 4d'

Beds CRO KK 731, Bailiff's Account

[Same in 1614.]

1620      Will, James I

[Robert Coxe of Grove, Bucks.]

'Residue to wellbeloved frend John Houghton the elder of Grove Burie ... whole executor overseer.'
