Summary

Monitoring of groundworks during the excavation of foundation trenches for an extension to a farm cottage at Gray's Farm Spalding failed to identify any archaeological features or artefacts, despite the proximity of a Roman road which appears to run just north of the development site.

Introduction

Naomi Field Archaeological Consultancy was commissioned in April 2009, by Trevor Clay Architect, to undertake a programme of archaeological observation and recording at Gray's Farm, Spalding on behalf of Mr and Mrs J. Davis, in accordance with the general requirements set out in the *Lincolnshire Archaeological Handbook* (Lincolnshire County Council Archaeology Section, 2009) and the *'Standard and Guidance for an Archaeological Watching Brief'* (Institute of Field Archaeologists 1994 rev. October 2008).

The Site

Grays Farm is situated 3.5km south west of Spalding and Pode Hole on the west side of the North Drove Drain.

Planning Background

Planning permission was granted for a two storey extension to an existing dwelling. These works were subject to an archaeological watching brief being carried out during the groundworks phase of development.

Archaeological Background

Grays Farm was built after the First World War to encourage smallholders to return to the land. A Roman road runs through Grays Farm, which runs south-west to meet King Street south of Bourne. It was thought there was potential for Roman remains being present on the site.

Objectives

The purpose of the archaeological observation and recording was to identify and record any archaeological deposits disturbed by the groundworks.

METHOD

All below ground works associated with the site were monitored by an experienced archaeologist. NFAC operates a standard context recording system, developed by its staff over the past 20 years based on MOLAS and CAS models.

A full photographic record was made during the progress of the groundworks, to cover each feature together with general site views.

Results

Excavation was undertaken to the north-east of the farm cottage. The work was undertaken in torrential rain and ground conditions were very wet and muddy. The area was stripped of vegetation and then trenches 0.70m wide and 0.50m deep, were excavated for the raft foundations. The extent of the plot was c.7mx 7.5m. The whole area was badly disturbed by tree roots. The topsoil **100** was a dark brown silty clay and was 0.30m thick. It overlay the mid brown-grey silty clay subsoil **101**, which was 0.25m deep. This subsoil overlay a natural orange brown silt **102**. Tree roots extended into the natural deposits.

Discussion and Conclusion

The aerial photographic evidence shows that the Roman road passes through the property to the north of the farmhouse and while there are extensive cropmarks indicating settlement to the east of the farm (Google Earth maps 2010) no archaeological features or Roman pottery were encountered. In conclusion, the foundation trenches did not disturb any archaeological remains.




Fig. 1 Location of Gray's Farm Spalding (C based on the 2006 Ordnance Survey 1:25,000 Explorer map 248. © Crown copyright, reproduced at reduced scale with the permission of the Controller of HMSO. NFAC Licence No. 1000049154).




Fig. 2 Gray's Farm Spalding. Trench location. Based on plan supplied by Trevor Clay Architect. Scale 1:200
