


Fig. 9. Combined extracts from the Ordnance Survey maps of 1893 and 1896, with the study area highlighted (Ordnance Survey sheets 153 and 170)








Plate 1. The promontory on which Haverah Park Top and 'John of Gaunt's Castle' are located, looking south-east




Plate 2. Section of 'Bank Slack' to the east of Clay Pit Lane, looking east





Plate 5. Probable cultivation terraces to the west of Haverah Park Top, looking east




Plate 8. Small stone buildings built into the southern bank of 'John of Gaunt's Castle' on the northern side of Haverah Park Top, looking north-east
