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### The Friary, Richmond North Yorkshire

#### **Archaeological Evaluation**

#### Introduction




Figure 1. Site Location.

During October 1997 a series of trenches (Trenches 1-5) were excavated within the grounds of The Friary, Richmond (NZ 170 010 : Fig. 1). The purpose of the scheme of works was to determine the presence or absence of archaeological features within an area which is to be re-developed in association with the refurbishment of The Friary building. Exterior development would consist of car parking areas, footpaths, landscaping and service trenches.

#### **Historical Summary**

In 1285 Ralph FitzRandal founded a Franciscan Friary elements of which, such as the accommodation and graveyard, are believed to lay within the proposed development site. The only surviving above ground structural element of The Friary is the 15th century bell tower (Greyfriars Tower).

#### **Excavation Methods**

Five trenches were laid out, four of which (Trenches 1-3 and 5) were in lawned areas to the east and south-east of The Friary and one (Trench 4) was to the rear of the building in an area of hard standing. All the trenches measured no more than 6m in length and 2m in width. In each trench the overburden was removed by machine using a toothless bucket under archaeological supervision. Excavation continued when the first archaeological deposits were encountered. Archaeological horizons thereafter were hand cleaned and features sampled and recorded at appropriate scales. Plans were drawn with reference to surrounding property boundaries and buildings. Archaeological features were recorded on proforma record forms (Appendix 1). Plans and sections were drawn at 1:20 and 1:10 respectively (Appendix 3). A photographic record was also maintained (Appendix 4).

#### **Excavation Results**

Five trenches were excavated in total.

#### Trench 1

Situated in the north-eastern area of the Friary Grounds, excavation showed that beneath the topsoil and subsoil (contexts 1001 and 1002) was a deposit of silty sand with limestone (context 1004). Excavation ceased at a depth of 0.40m. At this depth context 1004 was still visible in the north of the trench but was separated from a deposit very similar to 1004 (context 1005) by a ridge of natural sand (context 1003). The nature of contexts 1004 and 1005 suggested that they represented demolition dumps.

Finds from this trench consisted of pottery and animal bone from context 1003, animal bone from context 1004 and 13th -14th century pottery from context 1005.

#### Trench 2

Removal of the turf and topsoil (context 2001) immediately revealed contexts 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2005 at a depth of 0.42m from present ground level. Context 2002 represented a linear structure aligned north to south, constructed of limestone with a rubble core. On the western face traces of plaster were seen adhering to the stonework.

To the west of wall 2002 was a deposit of mortar with small limestone inclusions. As this deposit butts upto the wall it is likely that it represents an associated floor surface. On the eastern side of Wall 2002 was a similar deposit (context 2004). The absence of any cut for a foundation trench for Wall 2002 in either contexts 2003 or 2004 suggests that Wall 2002 was not inserted into these deposits, but was contemporary.

In the eastern portion of the trench was a fairly substantial deposit composed of limestone blocks (context 2005). The angle of deposition (c. 30°) suggests that it represents tumble from a wall, but it is not possible to say for certain that this material came directly from Wall 2002.

Within deposit 2005 excavation located a piece of worked stone, possibly part of a window mullion (SF 1). No other finds were recovered from this trench.

#### Trench 3

Excavation in Trench 3 provided the deepest stratigraphical sequence within the test trenches (0.98m). A series of contexts were recorded (contexts 3001-3004) which represented modern path make-up (3001), a possible demolition layer (3002), further demolition or levelling ( 3003) and a deposit of natural silting (3004). This final deposit covered an area of limestone paving (context 3005). Excavation ceased at this level.

Finds from this trench were confined to context 3004 and consisted of brick/tile, shell, animal bone and pottery of 14th-16th century date.

#### Trench 4

Trench 4 revealed that beneath the modern concrete were two courses of limestone mortar bonded walling set into a foundation trench (context 4003). This wall lay directly upon a deposit of dark silty sand (context 4004) which may represent an old turf line.

Excavation ceased at 0.70m at context 4005, a deposit of dark silty sand which may represent household waste redeposited in a yard area. Approximately 0.34m had been removed of this deposit, sufficient to determine its nature. The true depth of 4005 is unknown and the absence of finds makes accurate dating difficult.

No finds were recovered from this trench.

#### Trench 5

Below contexts 5001 and 5002 excavation located a linear feature (context 5005). Aligned north to south it cut through deposit 5006 (natural) and was filled with a silty sand (context 5004). Although it was not excavated medieval pottery of 12th - 13th century date was recovered from the uppermost fill (Appendix 2).

### Conclusions

There is evidence of medieval activity in Trenches 1, 3 and 5. The high quality of wall construction in Trench 2 and the presence of the architectural fragment suggests a prestige building, and one most probably part of The Friary complex. A number of demolition deposits recorded within the trenches also indicated the possibility of further buildings within the grounds of the Friary.




Figure 2. Location of Trenches 1 to 5.






Figure 3. Trench 1 - plan and section.








Figure 5. Trench 3 - plan and section.

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




Figure 6. Trench 4 - plan and section.

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




Plate 4 Trench 3. Facing south.




Plate 5. Trench 4. West facing section. Facing east.
