Re: Watching Brief St Andrew's Church, Normanby

On 4th September 1997 I carried out a Watching Brief at the above site in Normanby Parish, North Yorkshire (SE 7346 8162).

A rear-acting JCB excavator was used to remove tree roots and grade earth at the south-east boundary of the churchyard, and also to remove the brick wall forming the churchyard's southern boundary and to excavate a shallow trench for the replacement wall. All ground disturbance took place under close archaeological supervision.

No human remains or other archaeological deposits were revealed. The deposits present on the north side of the retaining boundary wall were shown by associated modern pottery, glass and brick/tile to be of recent date. The recent origin of these deposits would seem to be due to infilling behind the wall after its construction, which may have coincided with the 1893-5 restoration of the church (VCH North riding Vol. 1. 542). The southern boundary of the churchyard has been in its present position since at least 1910 (OS 1910 Co. Series map, 1: 2500 scale).
