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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This desk-based assessment considers land approximately 7 hectares in extent off Boroughbridge Road, Knaresborough.

In accordance with government policy (National Planning Policy Framework), this assessment draws together the available archaeological, historic, topographic and land-use information in order to clarify the heritage significance and archaeological potential of the site.

Scriven Conservation Area, extends to within c.50m (to the south-west of the site), but no effects on the setting or character are anticipated due to its immediate surroundings of late 19th century suburban dwellings.

Development of the site would not have any effect on any Listed Buildings, Registered Parks or Gardens or Registered Battlefields. In addition, the North Yorkshire Historic Environment Record (HER) does not record any designated or non-designated assets or other archaeological interest on the site.

This desk based assessment has considered the potential for as yet to be discovered archaeological assets and concludes that the site has a low/nil archaeological potential.

Nevertheless, despite this low/nil archaeological potential and the paucity of archaeological evidence in the wider area, due to the fact that similar sites in North Yorkshire have been the subject of archaeological evaluation, it is possible that further work may be required by the archaeological advisor to the Local Planning Authority. Given this archaeological background, this does not appear reasonable given the policy framework provided by the NPPF. However, in any event, any further archaeological work can follow planning consent secured by an appropriately worded planning condition.

1.0 INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE OF STUDY

- 1.1 This desk-based assessment has been researched and prepared by Paul Chadwick and Rachel Morse of CgMs Consulting on behalf of Gladman Developments Ltd.
- 1.2 The assessment examines a site, also referred to as the study site, off Boroughbridge Road, Knaresborough (Figure 1).
- 1.3 The study site is approximately 7 hectares in extent and comprises arable fields on the northern fringe of Knaresborough. It is bounded by Boroughbridge Road to the east (Plate 1), by a car salesroom and residential development to the south (Plate 2) by Dumb Pots Lane to the west (Plates 3 and 4) and by a field boundary and hedge to the north. The study site is centred at National Grid Reference SE 352 585 (Figure 2).
- 1.4 In accordance with government policy (National Planning Policy Framework) this assessment draws together the available archaeological, historic, topographic and land-use information in order to clarify the heritage significance and archaeological potential of the site.
- 1.5 Additionally, in accordance with the Standard and Guidance for Archaeological Desk-Based Assessments (Institute of Archaeologists 1999 [revised 2012]), the assessment includes the results of a site inspection, an examination of published and unpublished records and charts historic land-use through a map regression exercise. A site inspection was undertaken on 26th February 2013.
- 1.6 An initial pre-application consultation has been undertaken with Lucie Hawkins (Development Management Archaeologist, North Yorkshire County Council) and Louisa Matthews (Historic Environment Record Officer, North Yorkshire County Council).
- 1.7 As a result, the assessment enables relevant parties to assess the significance of heritage/archaeological assets on and close to the site and consider the potential for hitherto undiscovered archaeological assets, thus enabling potential impacts on assets to be identified along with the need for design, civil engineering or archaeological solutions.

2.0 PLANNING BACKGROUND AND DEVELOPMENT PLAN FRAMEWORK

2.1 In March 2012, the government published the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF), which replaces previous national policy relating to heritage and archaeology (Planning Policy Statement [PPS]5: Planning for the Historic Environment [2010]).

2.1.1 Section 12 of the NPPF, entitled 'Conserving and enhancing the historic environment' provides guidance for planning authorities, property owners, developers and others on the conservation and investigation of heritage assets. Overall, the objectives of Section 12 of the NPPF can be summarised as seeking the:

- Delivery of sustainable development
- Understanding the wider social, cultural, economic and environmental benefits brought by the conservation of the historic environment
- Conservation of England's heritage assets in a manner appropriate to their significance and
- Recognition of the value that heritage makes to our knowledge and understanding of the past.

2.1.2 Section 12 of the NPPF recognises that intelligently managed change may sometimes be necessary if heritage assets are to be maintained for the long term. Paragraph 128 states that planning decisions should be based on the significance of the heritage asset, and that the level of detail supplied by an applicant should be proportionate to the importance of the asset and should be no more than sufficient to review the potential effect of the proposal upon the significance of that asset.

2.1.3 Heritage assets are defined in Annex 2 of the NPPF as:

A building, monument, site, place, area or landscape positively identified as having a degree of significance meriting consideration in planning decisions.

They include designated heritage assets (as defined in the NPPF) and assets identified by the Local Planning Authority.

2.1.4 Annex 2 also defines archaeological interest as:

A heritage asset which holds or potentially could hold, evidence of past human activity worthy of expert investigation at some point. Heritage assets with archaeological interest are the primary source of evidence about the substance and evolution of places, and of the people and cultures that made them.

2.1.5 A designated heritage asset comprises a:

World Heritage Site, Scheduled Monument, Listed Building, Protected Wreck Site, Registered Park and Garden, Registered Battlefield or Conservation Area.

2.1.6 Significance is defined as:

The value of a heritage asset to this and future generations because of its heritage interest. This interest may be archaeological, architectural, artistic or historic. Significance derives not only from a heritage asset's physical presence, but also from its setting.

2.1.7 In short, government policy provides a framework which:

- Protects nationally important designated heritage assets (which comprise World Heritage Sites, Scheduled Ancient Monuments, Listed Buildings, Protected Wreck Sites, Registered Parks and Gardens, Registered Battlefields or Conservation Areas)
- Protects the settings of such designations
- In appropriate circumstances seeks adequate information (from desk-based assessment and where necessary field evaluation) to enable informed decisions and
- Provides for the excavation and investigation of sites not significant enough to merit in-situ preservation.

2.2 In considering any planning application for development, the planning authority will be mindful of the framework set by government policy, in this instance the NPPF, by current development plan policy and by other material considerations.

2.3 The Localism Act (November 2011), contains provisions which will result in the abolition of regional strategies. However, their abolition will require secondary legislation and until such time as this is introduced they remain part of the development plan.

- 2.4 The strategic development plan policy framework is provided by the Regional Spatial Strategy (RSS) for Yorkshire and the Humber (2004). Policies relating to the historic environment are contained in Policy N2:

POLICY N2: HISTORIC AND CULTURAL RESOURCES

Local planning authorities should include in their development plans policies and proposals for the preservation and/or enhancement of the historic environment. In addition to those areas, sites and buildings identified either nationally or internationally as being of archaeological, architectural or historic importance, local planning authorities should:

- a) Identify areas, sites and buildings of regional or local historic or cultural importance, and include policies for their preservation or enhancement.**
- b) Promote the appropriate management of areas, sites or buildings of historic or cultural importance, including where appropriate, improved access for education or recreation.**
- c) Ensure that new development reflects the need for good design in accordance with Policy S4, respects or enhances local character and distinctiveness and does not detract from the historic environment of the region.**
- d) Identify opportunities for the provision of new facilities, buildings, features or parks that can help to facilitate culturally led renaissance.**

- 2.5 Until the adoption of the Local Development Framework (LDF), the relevant development plan framework is provided by the Harrogate District Local Plan (2001). The Plan contains the following 'saved' policies which provide a framework for the consideration of development proposals affecting Conservation Areas. Policies relating to Listed buildings (HD1) and archaeology (HD4 and HD5) were not 'saved' and ceased to be a part of the LDF from 2007.

POLICY HD3 CONTROL OF DEVELOPMENT IN CONSERVATION AREAS

Development which has an adverse effect on the character or appearance of a conservation area will not be permitted and this includes the following forms of development:

- (A) The demolition of non-listed buildings which make a positive contribution to the character or appearance of conservation areas.**
- (B) The erection of buildings out of scale with their surroundings.**
- (C) Proposals involving the loss of open space, which contributes to the character of the conservation area.**
- (D) The combination of adjoining buildings to create large open plan offices or shops.**
- (E) Proposals which would have an adverse effect on the historic form and layout of passageways and plots.**

Applications for development in or visually affecting conservation areas will be expected to contain sufficient information to allow a proper assessment of their impact on the character and appearance of the conservation area to be made.

Where the loss of a non-listed building is acceptable in principle, conditions will be attached to the grant of consent for demolition to ensure that no demolition shall take place until a contract for the carrying out of works of redevelopment has been made and planning permission for those works has been granted.

- 2.6 There are no designated assets (Scheduled Monuments, Listed Buildings, Registered Parks and Gardens or Registered Battlefields) or non-designated assets within the study site boundary.
- 2.7 The eastern extremity of Scriven Conservation Area is located on the immediate south-west perimeter of the site, but separated from the site by Dumb Pots Lane and residential development on the north side of Green Gate Lane and on the west side of Dumb Pots Lane (Figure 3). The Conservation Area is subject to policy HD3 in the Harrogate District Local Plan (2001).
- 2.8 One Grade II* building, Home Farmhouse [North Yorkshire HER DNY5779; Appendix 2], is located c. 200m to the west of the site in Scriven Conservation Area. The Listed building is subject to Regional Spatial Strategy Policy N2.

- 2.9 Twelve Grade II buildings Park Corner [North Yorkshire HER DNY5703; Appendix 1]), Oak Lea [HER DNY5704; Appendix 2], Rose Cottage [HER DNY5705; Appendix 2], Corner Cottage, with Nos. 1 and 2 Village Terrace to rear [HER DNY5707; Appendix 2], Ice House in Ice House Wood [HER DNY5710; Appendix 2], Roundells Manor [HER DNY 5776; Appendix 2], Oak View with Garden Wall [HER DNY6391; Appendix 2], Pear Tree Cottage [HER DNY6392; Appendix 2], Former Dog Kennels with Yard Wall on south side [HER DNY6393; Appendix 1], Wheelwright Cottage [HER DNY6671; Appendix 2], Spinney Croft [HER DNY6680; Appendix 2] and Scriven Hall [HER DNY6975; Appendix 2] are located between c. 200m and 400m to the west of the site and all located within Scriven Conservation Area. These are all subject to Policy N2 in the Regional Spatial Strategy.
- 2.10 The Listed Buildings are all situated within Scriven Conservation Area and are separated from the site by late 19th century suburban dwellings and therefore no impact upon their settings or heritage significance is anticipated. Accordingly, they are not considered further here.
- 2.11 In light of the above, this assessment will consider designated and non-designated archaeological assets and, in accordance with NPPF, assess the potential of the site to contain as yet to be discovered archaeological assets.

3.0 GEOLOGY AND TOPOGRAPHY

3.1 Geology

- 3.1.1 The study site comprises Devensian Till deposits of Diamicton. These superficial deposits are underlain by Dolostone of the Cadeby Formation, Mudstone, Siltstone and Sandstone of the Millstone Grit Group and Sandstone of the Upper Plompton Grit Formation.

3.2 Topography

- 3.2.1 The study site is located on the northern fringe of Knaresborough and to the east of Scriven. It contains three arable fields, bounded by well-tended hedges and low fences (Plate 5). All three fields are generally level, with a very gentle slope up to the north-west corner of the site between c. 57m and c.60m Above Ordnance Datum.

4.0 ARCHAEOLOGICAL/HISTORICAL BACKGROUND AND ASSESSMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The timescales used in this report are as follows:

4.1 Introduction

- 4.1.1 This assessment is based on a consideration of evidence in the North Yorkshire Historic Environment Record (HER) for the study site and a zone 1 km in extent surrounding its boundary. North Yorkshire HER, North Yorkshire County Record Office, West Yorkshire County Record Office (the site was formerly in the West Riding) and Knaresborough Local Studies Library were also visited in order to examine historic maps and aerial photographs relating to the site.
- 4.1.2 There are no designated or non-designated archaeological assets (i.e. archaeological finds and features) on the site. Designated and non-designated assets within the wider study area are reviewed below, detailed in the Gazetteer (Appendix 1) and their locations shown on Figure 3.
- 4.1.3 This chapter reviews existing archaeological evidence for the site and the archaeological/historical background of the general area and, in accordance with NPPF, considers the potential for as yet undiscovered archaeological assets on the site.

- 4.1.4 Chapter 5 subsequently considers the site conditions and whether the theoretical potential identified in this chapter is likely to survive.

4.2 **Prehistoric**

- 4.2.1 There are no recorded prehistoric archaeological assets within the study site.
- 4.2.2 The only record of prehistoric activity in the surroundings of the site are the finds of a polished stone axe of Neolithic date [HER MNY 18895 on Figure 3; Appendix 1] c. 300m to the north-west and a stone axe (perforated) of Bronze Age date [HER MNY18876 on Figure 3; Appendix 1] c. 500m to the south.
- 4.2.3 Three undated possible enclosure systems identified as cropmarks are recorded in the surroundings of the site between c.500m and 900m to the north and east of the study site. [HER MNY 19002, MNY 19011 and MNY 19012 on Figure 3; Appendix 1] which could be of prehistoric date, but could equally be of Roman or Saxon/Medieval date.

4.3 **Roman**

- 4.3.1 There are no recorded Roman archaeological assets within the study site.
- 4.3.2 There are two records of Roman activity in the surroundings of the site, a coin hoard [HER MNY 18880 on Figure 3] 700m to the south-east of the study site and a pottery urn [HER MNY19041 on Figure 3; Appendix 1] c. 700m to the south-west of the site.
- 4.3.3 The principal Roman site in the locality is that of Aldborough, over 10km to the north-east of the study site, which over-looked the crossing of the River Ure on the main north-south route through Yorkshire (Jennings 1970).

4.4 **Saxon/Medieval**

- 4.4.1 There are no recorded archaeological assets of Saxon or Medieval date within the study site. There is one recorded asset of Medieval date in the surroundings of the site, lynchets [HER MNY18938 on Figure3; Appendix 1] c. 100m to the west of the study site.

- 4.4.2 The name Scriven is a derivative of the old English "Scraef-ing" meaning a place at a cave or hollow. This name probably refers to the quarries and gravel pits on the north side of the Scriven and the study site.
- 4.4.3 Scriven was entered as "Scrainage" in the Domesday Survey (1086) under the Lands of the King in "Eurvicism" (Yorkshire), where it is recorded that the King owned six caracutes of land. Scriven [HER MNY18884 on Figure 3; Appendix 1] was one of the eleven berewicks (subdivisions) of the Manor of Knaresborough. The history of the village and town has remained intertwined, with the proximity of the two places meaning that no church or other place of worship was ever built in Scriven.
- 4.4.4 Scriven with Tentergate was a Forest Liberty Town of Knaresborough. This meant that woodland in the area was owned by the King and the lord of the manor of Knaresborough was given powers to protect it.
- 4.4.5 Scriven Hall [North Yorkshire HER MNY 18885 on Figure 3; Appendix 1], partially rebuilt in the late 1600's and again c. 1730, was the seat of the Slingsbys. This was the administrative centre of Scriven Manor and was supported by rents from tenant farmers and the proceeds of timber production and quarrying in the manor.
- 4.5 **Post-Medieval/Modern (including map regression exercise)**
- 4.5.1 There are no recorded archaeological assets of Post-Medieval date within the study site or wider study area.
- 4.5.2 Knaresborough is represented on Speeds Map of Yorkshire published in 1610 (Figure 4), with Scriven represented on Jeffrey's Map of Yorkshire published in 1776.
- 4.5.3 The earliest available map which denotes the study site in detail is the 1839 Scriven with Tentergate Tithe map (Figure 5). The site comprises three fields whose boundaries had possibly been established long before; Field 394 Little Dumb Pots (grass), Field 395 Great Dumb Pots (grass) and Field 396 Cuddy Close (arable). Dumb Pots Lane bounds the site to the west, Boroughbridge Road bounds the site to the east and open fields to the north and south of the site.
- 4.5.4 Subsequent maps show that no significant change has taken place in the layout of the study site to the present day and the study site has continued as managed

agricultural and pastoral land and is not thought to have been put to any other use in the historic period.

4.5.5 The Ordnance Survey 1890 edition (Figure 6) shows a small field/enclosure in the north-west corner of Field 109 with mature trees along its southern boundary and a pond to the immediate south. A footpath is shown from Boroughbridge Road to Dumb Pots Lane towards the southern boundary of Field 109. Trees are shown demarcating field boundaries and the west side of Dumb Pots Lane.

4.5.6 The Ordnance Survey 1909 edition (Figure 7) shows little change other than the small field/enclosure in the north-west corner of Field 118 no longer shown and the tress demarcating boundaries no longer shown.

4.5.7 The Ordnance Survey 1932 edition (Figure 8) no longer indicates a pond or footpath in Field 118. Residential development is shown on the north side of Green Gate Lane, marking the start of the suburban development of New Scriven. The study site itself has not changed since this edition to the present day.

4.6 **Assessment of Significance**

4.6.1 There are no designated assets (Scheduled Monuments, Listed Buildings, Registered Parks and Gardens, Registered Battlefields or Conservation Areas) or non-designated archaeological assets within the study site boundary.

4.6.2 The available HER evidence shows that there are two finds of prehistoric date within the 1km study area around the site, and given this modest background of prehistoric occupation in this area, a low/nil potential is identified for prehistoric evidence on the site.

4.6.3 There are two finds of Roman date within the study area which indicate a low density of Roman artefacts in the surrounding area, but no evidence of settlement. A low/nil potential is identified for settlement evidence of Roman date.

4.6.4 There is one asset of Medieval date recorded in the study area. Cartographic and documentary evidence suggests that the study site has been used as pasture/arable fields. A low/nil potential is identified for Saxon/Medieval evidence.

- 4.6.5 There are no recorded archaeological assets of Post-Medieval date within the study site. Cartographic and documentary sources and present day use of the site as arable fields suggests low/nil potential for the Post-Medieval period.

5.0 SITE CONDITIONS, THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT AND IMPACT ON HERITAGE ASSETS

5.1 Site Conditions

5.1.1 A site visit was undertaken on 26th February 2013. As described above, the study site is approximately 7 hectares in extent. It contains three arable fields which occupy gently sloping land from north-west to south-east at between c. 60m and 57m Above Ordnance Datum (AOD).

5.1.2 No earthworks or evidence to suggest buried archaeological features was noted during the site inspection.

5.2 The Proposed Development

5.2.1 The site is proposed for residential development. No Illustrative Masterplan is available at present.

5.3 Impact on Heritage Assets

5.3.1 Development of the site would not have any impact on Listed Buildings, Registered Parks or Gardens or Registered Battlefields; nor would it impact any non-designated assets recorded in the HER.

5.3.2 Development has a theoretical potential to effect the setting Scriven Conservation Area c. 50m to the south-west. However, the Conservation Area is immediately surrounded by late 19th century suburban dwellings and it is unlikely that the proposed development would be visible from the Conservation Area. No additional effect on the setting or significance of the Conservation Area is anticipated.

5.3.3 This assessment has considered the potential for as yet to be discovered archaeological assets and concludes that the site has a particularly low archaeological potential.

5.3.4 Nevertheless, despite this low archaeological potential and the paucity of archaeological evidence in the wider study area, because similar sites in North Yorkshire have been the subject of archaeological evaluation, it is possible that

further work may be required by the archaeological advisor to the Local Planning Authority, although this does not appear justified within the policy framework provided by the NPPF. In any event, any further archaeological work could follow planning consent secured by an appropriately worded planning condition.

6.0 SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

- 6.1 This desk-based assessment considers land approximately 7 hectares in extent off Boroughbridge Road, Knaresborough.
- 6.2 In accordance with government policy (National Planning Policy Framework), this assessment draws together the available archaeological, historic, topographic and land-use information in order to clarify the heritage significance and archaeological potential of the study site.
- 6.3 No significant effects on the setting of Scriven Conservation Area are anticipated.
- 6.4 This assessment has considered the potential for as yet to be discovered archaeological assets and concludes that the site has a low/nil archaeological potential.
- 6.5 Nevertheless, despite this low/nil archaeological potential and the paucity of archaeological evidence in the wider area, due to the fact that similar sites in North Yorkshire have been the subject of archaeological evaluation, it is possible that further work may be required by the archaeological advisor to the Local Planning Authority. It is suggested that the archaeological evaluation can follow planning consent secured by an appropriately worded planning condition.

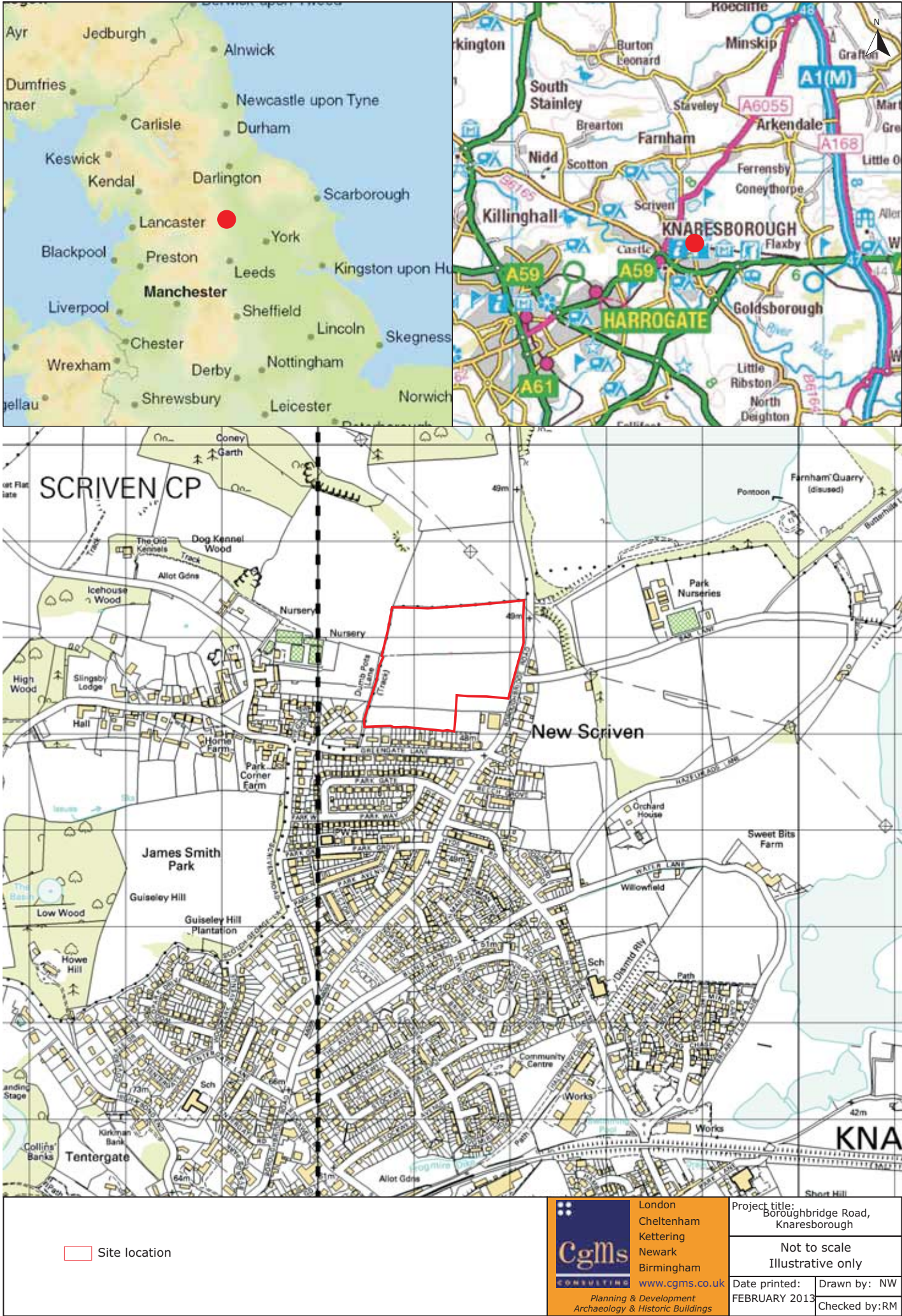
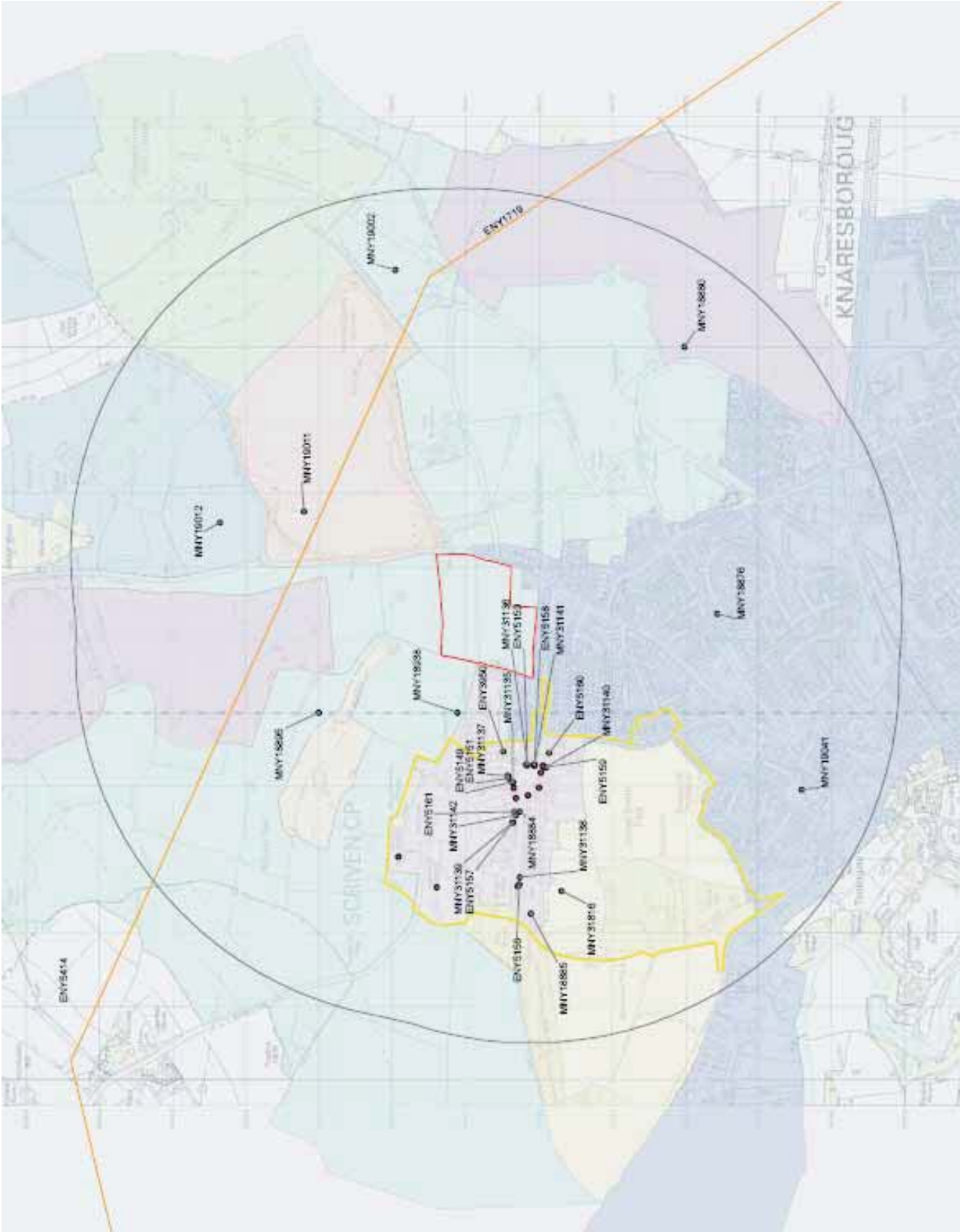


Figure 1: Site Location

Figure 5: 1839 Scriver with Tentergate Tithe Map

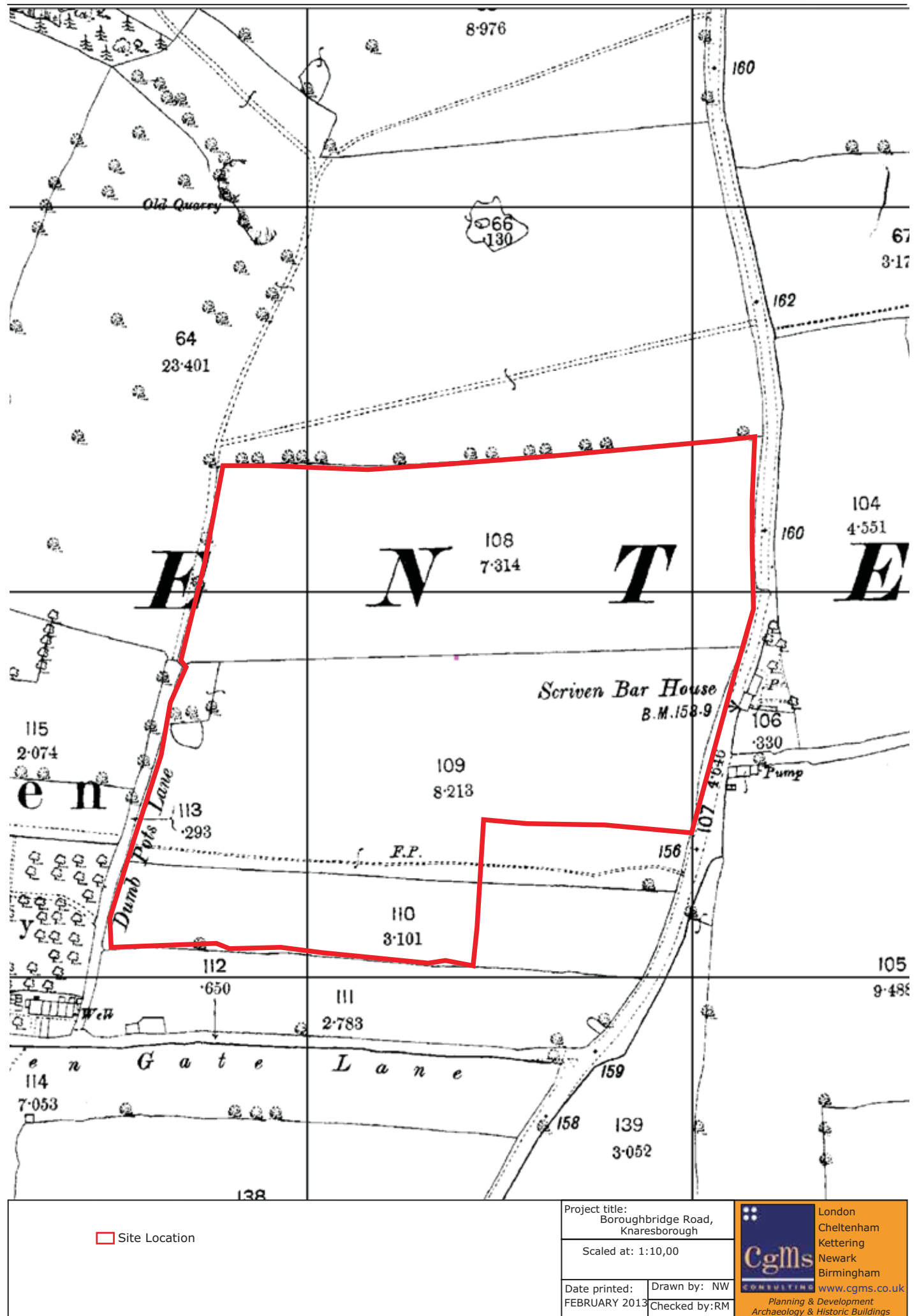
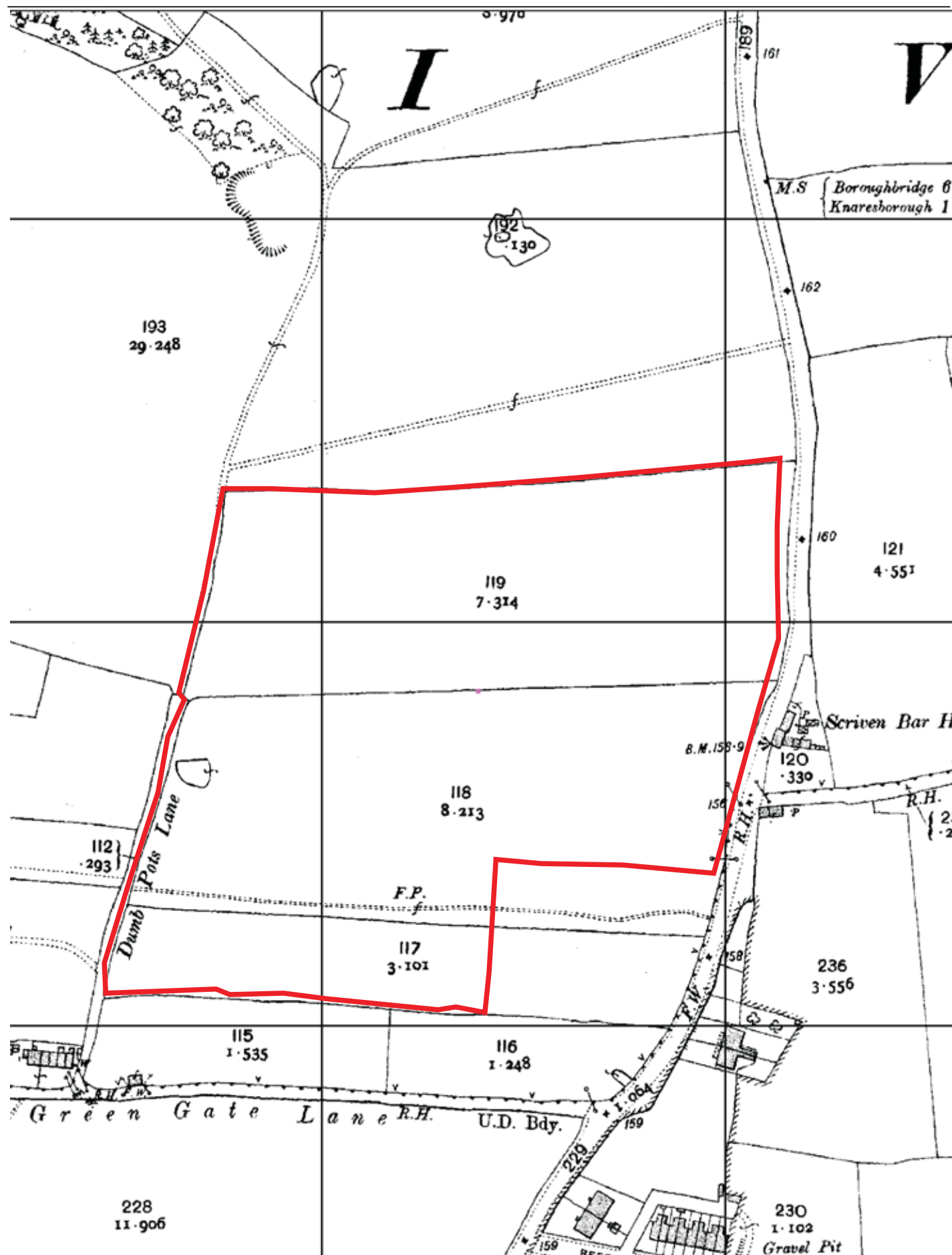


Figure 6: 1890 Ordnance Survey Map

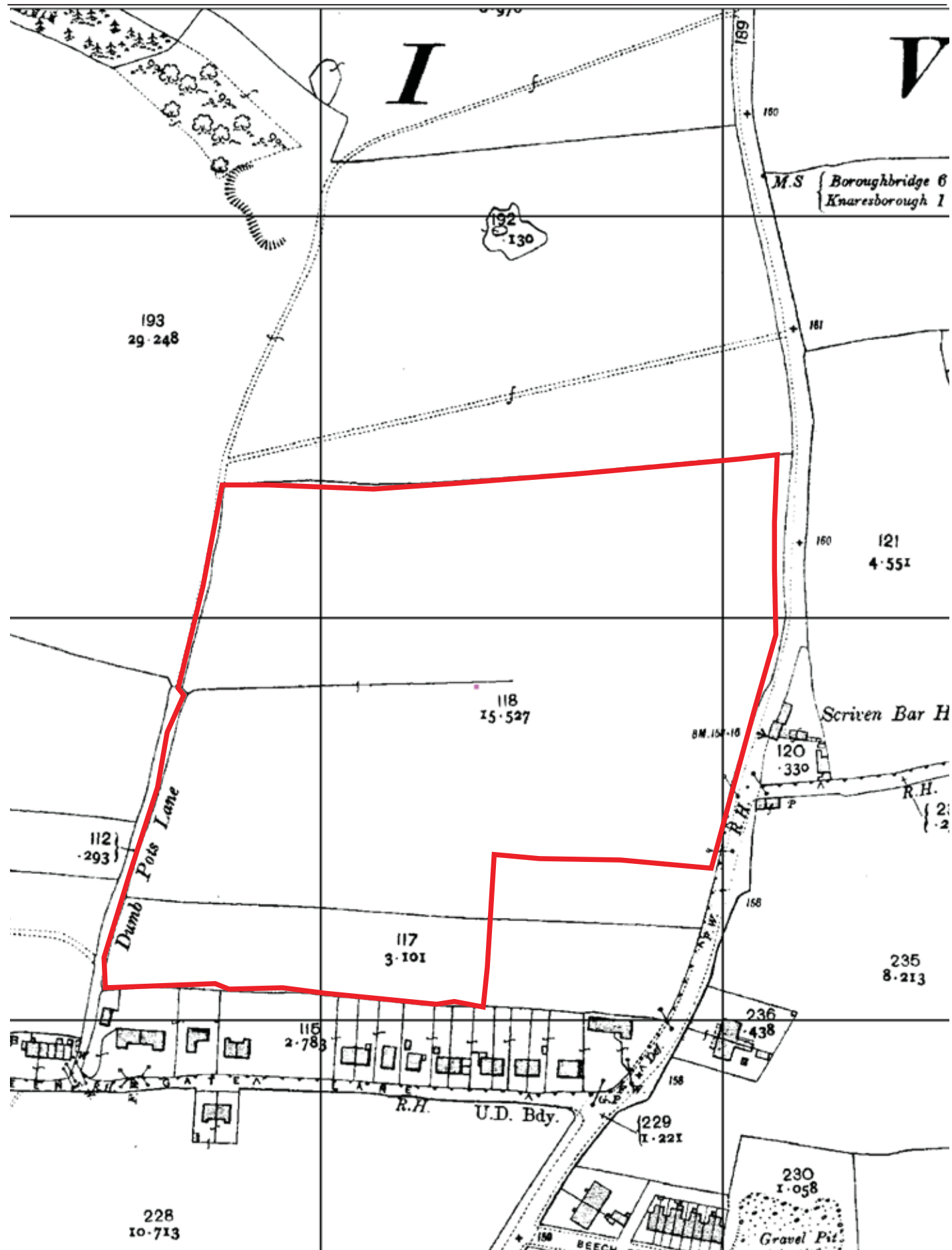
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Figure 7: 1909 Ordnance Survey Map
