APPENDIX 1, KNOWN ARCHAEOLOGICAL AND HISTORICAL SITES

The locations of known historical and archaeological sites within and close to the study area are listed below. This information is derived from the National Monument Record and the North Yorkshire Sites and Monuments Record. Each site within the NMR is identified by a "unique identifier" and where applicable the equivalent record number in the SMR is also provided (these all have NYM as a prefix). Additionally there sites which are only recorded in the SMR. It should be noted that there are sites, usually which involve a number of elements, which are recorded slightly differently within the two systems, but effort has been taken to list all the relevant identifying numbers from both systems which are associated with any site.

There are three sites which have Scheduled Monument protection and one Listed Historic Garden which is also a part of the site with World Heritage Site status. The full areas covered by this protection within the study area are mapped (see Fig. 1).

Some of the sites have a statutory listed status and these will also be recorded in the full list of listed buildings see Appendix 3.

Listed Historic Gardens

85. Studley Royal, GD 1376

Fountains Abbey was one of the richest religious houses in England, following the Dissolution the buildings and some of the land was sold to Richard Gresham, who later sold them to Stephen Proctor. After several more changes of ownership the Abbey ruins and Fountains Hall were acquired by the Messenger family who sold them to William Aislebie. The principal entrance is from the west side of Ripon, south of Bishopton Bridge. A track leads south west through a finger of parkland to East Ripon Lodge (listed grade II*).

Studley Royal Park (NMR UI 51924) NGR SE 283 696

The Archbishops of York had formed a park at Ripon, and the existing park at Studley Royal is in the immediate neighbourhood and appears on Saxton's Survey of 1577. The present park was developed from an earlier park owned by the Mallories in the 17th century, but no ground evidence exists to delineate an earlier enclosure. This was landscaped by John Aislabie, but following the fire which burnt Studley Hall in 1716 a major reorganisaton of the landscape. Central to Aislabie's scheme was an enhancement of the River Skell. The valley sides were lowered and the bottom raised can canalised. On the east side of the canal a circular pond flanked by two crescent ponds (Moon and Crescent Ponds) were constructed.

Fountains Abbey which includes the monastic precinct, a mill, water management works, agricultural and industrial features and an 18th century water garden is also a Scheduled Monument (no. 26930).

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
