






FIGURE 4A TRENCH 1 SOUTH FACING SECTION





FIGURE 4B TRENCH 2 NORTH FACING SECTION

TRAVIS'S BATHS.

This establishment situate at the entrance to the Cliff, was originally opened in 1798. It has since been re-built, and the interior fitted up with every attention to comfort and elegance. Every tide, these baths are supplied with pure sea water, and admit of ever variety of temperature. Rooms are also fitted up for steam, the Douche and Shower Baths.
