

re Watching Bnef at Harelands Farm, Melsonby Planning Application no 1/32/158D/FULL



- 1) Ground works associated with the access and car parking for the above development took place on Saturday August 27th 2005 and were completed within one day. The work was undertaken by mechanical excavator under the supen/ision of myself, Vivienne Metcalf
- 2) An archaeological watching bnef was required because the development site lies within an area of considerable archaeological significance north of the line of a Roman road which roughly follows the course of the present A66 road Extensive remains of prehistonic and Romano-British field systems and settlements have been discovered in the fields around the Gatherley Moor and Melsonby area by aenal photography and archaeological fieldwork. There was the potential for the ground-disturbing works to encounter hitherto unknown archaeological remains of this penod.
- 3) In addition, the application site lies immediately west of a section of Scots Dyke, which is designated as a scheduled ancient monument under the 1979 Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act (National Monument no 28254) This is a site of national archaeological importance and there was the potential for evidence of associated features and activity to be present within the application area
- 4) The area of the driveway access and car park (see accompanying plan) was excavated by mechanical excavator to a depth of between 20cm and 60cm, increasing in depth towards the west. Removal of the plough soil revealed a thin subsoil composed of sands, clays and gravels originating from glacially-derived.

deposits, directly overlying a yellowy stony clay subsoil denved from the underlying sandstone, which outcropped in places to lie immediately beneath the ploughsoil. No earth-cut features were identified


- 5) A small number of finds were recovered dunng the excavations, mostly from the area immediately inside the gateway. These included a fragment of bnck, a sherd of blue-and-white pottery of probably twentieth century date, a piece of green bottle glass, a length of aluminium stnp, and vanous fragments of plastic including cnsp packet and fertiliser bag. Further towards the west two fragments of modern ceramic field dram were noted. All were discarded
- In summary, the area directly affected by the present development access and car park contained no features or artefacts of archaeological significance. An examination of the area to be affected by drainage works showed that the ground level had been reduced and disturbed during the construction and use of the now redundant farm buildings, to an extent that made the sun/ival of archaeological features, if any, unlikely ArcheType will be notified of the commencement of the drainage works by the developer
- 7) The field in which the development is situated is presently under pasture, but has theen ploughed regularly since the 1950s. While the presence of archaeological remains elsewhere in the field cannot be discounted, it is possible that any more ephemeral archaeological features have been destroyed by ploughing.




Proposed Site Plan
