#### **INTRODUCTION**




Figure 1: Location map of Dumbarton Castle.




Figure 2: Trench location plan.

Under the terms of its PIC call-off contract Kirkdale Archaeology was asked to undertake archaeological monitoring on the digging of three small trenches as part of the installation of a new hand rail at the Spur Battery (see Figures 1 and 2). The excavation of the trenches was undertaken by Historic Scotland staff, and the work took place on 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2011.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

Trench 1, with its long axis aligned approximately NW/SE, measured  $600 \times 300 \times 250 \text{mm}$  in size.

Trench 2, which was square in plan, measured  $300 \times 300 \times 250$ mm in size, with one axis parallel to Trench 1, and the other (since the trench was square in plan), perpendicualar to the main axis of Trench 1.

Both trenches were dug through little more than turf and topsoil – a grey/black, humic loam, containing plant roots and decayed leaf material (001).

Nothing of archaeological significance was noted.

Trench 3, which was again square in plan, measured  $300 \times 300 \times 250$ mm in size, with one axis aligned NE/SW and the other NW/SE. It was dug adjacent to, and to the S of, the top step.




Figure 3: Context (002), the dressed sandstone block.

Almost immediately upon breaking the ground, a large piece of dressed, grey/blonde sandstone (002) – see Figure 3 - with a rebated edge was found, sitting in a compact matrix of pieces of broken brick, stone and dark grey silt (003). In order to remove this stone, the trench had to be enlarged to the NW and SW.

Upon enlarging the trench, it was seen that context (002) measured  $550 \times 350 \times 160$ mm in size. The rebated edge measured 30mm deep x 50mm high. There were signs of tooling marks on the stone.

Contexts (002) and (003) clearly represented a form of infill within the undulating bedrock, in effect creating a level surface for the path. The bedrock outcropped substantially to the SE, but also within, and at the level of, the current path within which Trench 3 was situated (visible just to the W of Trench 3, see Figure 2).

#### **CONCLUSIONS**

Context (002) – the dressed sandstone block – was the only thing of archaeological interest encountered during the current works, and was retained on site by Historic Scotland staff.

The discovery of this piece of stone – which presumably came from some preexisting substantial structure, possibly nearby – shows that even relatively shallow trenches have the potential for revealing material of interest, and it is recommended that any future ground breaking works of this nature be similarly monitored.
