

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*SUMMARY: November 2009 - A watching brief was maintained to monitor the removal of two modern stone plinths at Barnhouse Neolithic Settlement, Stenness, Orkney (HY 3079 1271). These had been installed to carry information boards, but were now to be dismantled and the resulting holes filled with sand and turf. No new ground was disturbed during these works and there were no finds or features of archaeological significance seen.*

## **1.0 INTRODUCTION**

Under the terms of its PIC call-off contract Kirkdale Archaeology was asked by Historic Scotland to monitor the removal of two stone plinths at Barnhouse Neolithic Settlement, Stenness, Orkney (HY 3079 1271). These plinths were originally installed to carry information boards, but were to be demolished now after the recent installation of new information boards a little to the south.

The work was undertaken on 4 November 2009.

## **2.0 DESCRIPTION**




Fig. 1 : Location plan (1:1000)

The above ground elements of the plinths were removed prior to monitoring. The removal of the remaining courses of local flagstones was then monitored. Both plinths (holes 1& 2, Fig. 1) had two courses of cement bonded stone below ground level, with slabs up to 50 mm thick, separated by a layer of cement and bedded in sand, with a total depth of 130 mm in hole 1, 150 mm in hole 2. Hole 1 measured 700 mm NW-SE by 1.00 m SW-NE; hole 2 was 1.10 m NW-SE by 1.00 m SW-NE. Under the sand was fairly loose, mid to dark reddish brown silty clayey topsoil, none of which was removed. No excavation was carried out beyond the removal of the sand.

## **3.0 INTERPRETATIONS AND OBSERVATIONS**

The soil seen below the sand in each hole showed no obvious sign of having been disturbed during the installation of the plinths, although some soil must have been removed beyond the limits of the structures to allow their construction. It seems likely that this area was disturbed during the excavations on the site in the late 1980s. In any case, no new ground was disturbed during the removal of the two

plinths and so it is not surprising that that no finds or features of archaeological significance were seen.
