

SUMMARY: Two small holes were excavated by hand for the installation of two new permanent survey points in an area of flat grass to the south of Rowallan Castle. There were no finds or features of archaeological significance.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

Under the terms of its call-off contract with Historic Scotland, Kirkdale Archaeology was asked to excavate two small holes near Rowallan Castle within the guardianship area. These were needed to allow the installation of two permanent survey points ('Feno' markers).

The work was carried out 24 August 2009.

2.0 DESCRIPTION

The first of the two markers was to be sited to the SE of the castle, in line with the steps leading to the Castle entrance, and close to the river which loops around the site. The hole excavated was only 1.1 m W of the bank adjacent to the river, and the required hole measured some 400 mm square. This was hand dug through dark brown, silty clay for 125 mm, after which the marker was inserted, and then hammered 400 mm down into the ground.

The second site was to the SW of the Castle, on the low-lying, flat, grassy area between the Castle and the river where it loops around the S side of the site. It was in line with the back wall (NW side) of the castle, and again measured 400 mm square. Dark brown, silty clay was again seen throughout its 125 mm depth, after which the probe was hammered 400 mm into the ground.

3.0 INTERPRETATION AND OBSERVATIONS

Neither of these two small holes revealed anything of archaeological significance. Both were located in flat grassy areas outside the castle, and there is a strong possibility that there were once gardens in these areas. This would be likely to mean a considerable depth of garden soil, although as the area is so remarkably level there may well be evidence for the preparation of this ground, with the raising of hollows,

and the levelling of protrusions. The ground is so flat next to the river that the whole area may well have been raised to alleviate the problems of flooding. The low bank that follows the river is presumably a flood defence, and indicates that this has been a problem in the past.
