<u>Project Description</u> Archaeological watching brief on the excavation of two

trenches to house new signage outside the ticket office.

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1.0 INTRODUCTION

Under the terms of its PIC call-off contract Kirkdale Archaeology was asked to undertake an archaeological watching brief on the excavation of two trenches for new signage outside the ticket office at Bonawe Iron Furnace in Taynuilt.

Existing signage in the (same) locations had been removed, so the trenches were already partially disturbed. They were hand-dug by HS staff under archaeological supervision.




Figure 1: Locations of the two signs.

Trench 1 was dug to house 'Sign 2' (as defined on the HS Plan), while Trench 2 was dug to house 'Sign 1' (see Figure 1).

The work was carried out on 28th July 2010.

2.0 DESCRIPTION AND INTERPRETATION




Figure 2: Post-excavation plans of Trenches 1 & 2.

Trench 1 (see Figure 2) was 1.5m WSW/ESE x 0.75m SSE/NNW x 0.5m deep. The fills consisted of (101), a turf and mid-brown sandy silt 100mm thick over a 40-50mm thick drainage bed of pea gravel (102). Below (102) was a moderately compact levelling cap of brown silt (103), a maximum of 150mm thick. From within this layer small finds were recovered (see Appendix 1). These three (101,102 and 103) layers had been used to seal an undulating layer of industrial waste (104) comprising spent fuel and industrial slag. It appeared that the large slag heaps to the W and NW of the ticket office had been used to provide levelling material for the landscaping of the site in the 20th century. Nothing of particular archaeological significance was uncovered during the works.

Trench 2 (see Figure 2) was 1.7m WSW/ESE x 0.75m SSE/NNW x 0.45m deep. The fills consisted (to the WSW) of (201) a turf and mid-brown silt 100mm thick, while to the ENE was a gravel path (202) 150mm thick. Below these was a moderately compact brown silt (203), a maximum of 150mm thick - from within this layer was a single small find was recovered (see Appendix 1). The topsoil capped a layer of industrial waste and demolition debris (204), consisting of slag, clinkers and smashed red brick. This was only partially excavated so its full thickness was not revealed. Within the trench an electricity cable, 10mm in diameter (205) and a water pipe 250mm in diameter (206) were exposed. These were avoided during the placing of the concrete shuttering. The pipes and path were installed as part of the recent construction of the ticket office. Nothing of particular archaeological significance was uncovered during the works.

3.0 CONCLUSIONS

The location of the trenches, especially Trench 2 suggested that much of the make-up encountered could be attributed to 20th century landscaping and the building of the ticket office. Nevertheless it has to be recognised that the site is an important relic of the mid-18th century industrial landscape and as such should be subject to archaeological monitoring during any future ground-breaking works.
