## **Abstract**

*MOLA was commissioned by CgMs Consulting to undertake a fieldwalking survey on land south of Melton Mowbray, Leicestershire to characterise the artefactual content of the topsoil. ## **1 INTRODUCTION**

MOLA (Museum of London Archaeology) carried out a fieldwalking survey in March 2017. CgMs Consulting commissioned the survey on land south of Melton Mowbray, Leicestershire (NGR SK 76153 17405; Fig 1).

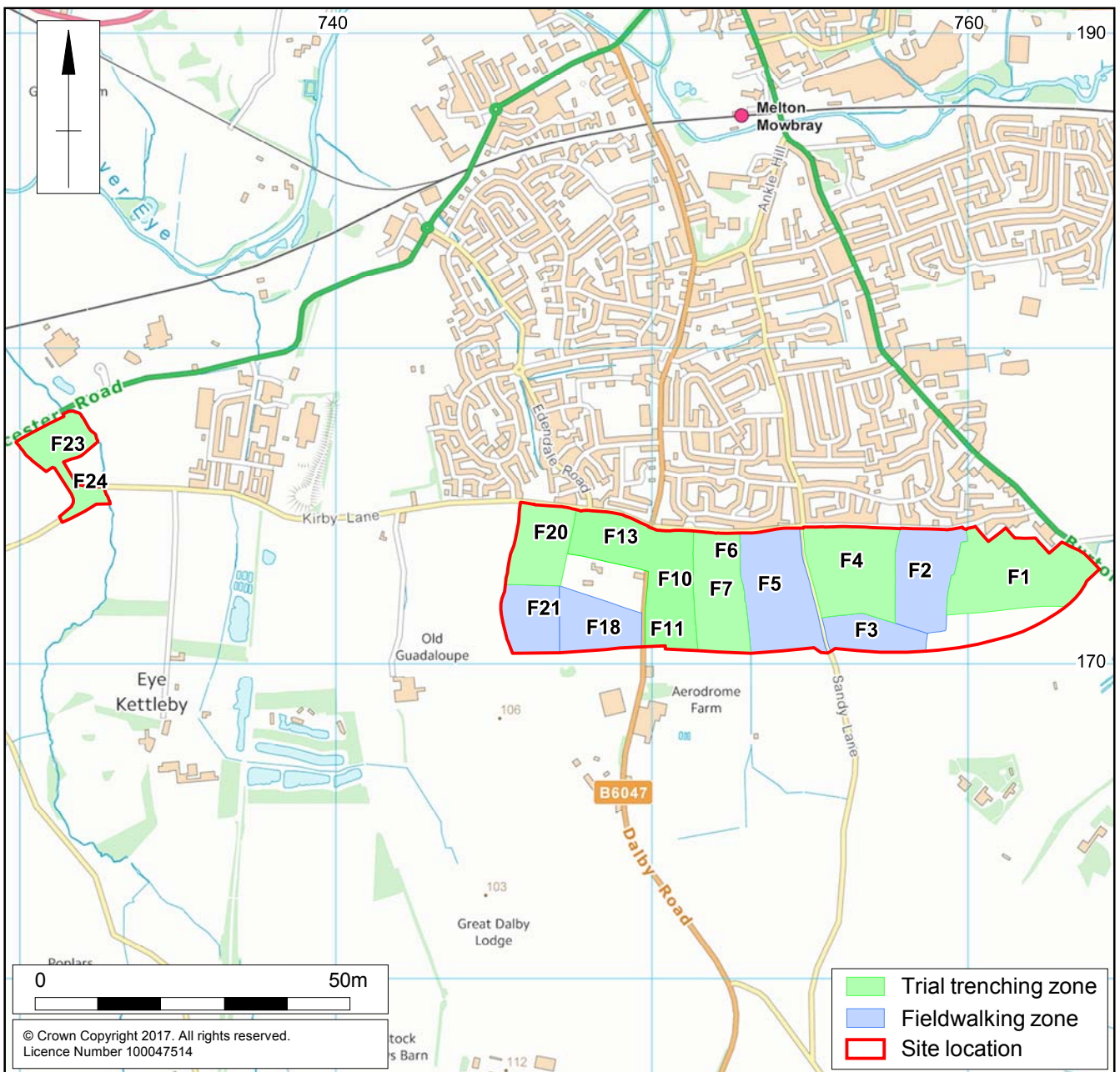
The Senior Planning Archaeologist for Leicestershire County Council has advised that a programme of archaeological evaluation works should be undertaken on the site (LCC 2014). This report details the fieldwalking evaluation which was undertaken to determine the nature and extent of any archaeological remains present in the topsoil within a proposed development area. This was to be carried out in order to inform decisions regarding the potential impact of the proposed development upon the archaeological resource in accordance with the National Planning Policy Framework (DCLG 2012; NPPF). A later phase of targeted trial trench evaluation is yet to take place and will be reported on separately. Works were carried out in accordance with an approved Written Scheme of Investigation (MOLA 2017).

The archive will be deposited with Leicestershire Museums under accession number **X.A19.2017** according to the guidelines of LCCMS (2013).

## **2 AIMS AND OBJECTIVES**

It is the principal aim of the archaeological evaluation to quantify the quality and extent of the archaeological resource and inform further decisions regarding the suitability of the site for development. The purpose of the work was to determine and understand the nature, function and character of the archaeological site in its cultural and environmental setting. In detail the work was:

- to determine or confirm the general nature of any remains present;
- to determine or confirm the approximate date or date range of any remains, by means of artefactual or other evidence;
- to determine or confirm the approximate extent of any remains, and;
- to determine or confirm the likely range, quality and quantity of any artefactual evidence present.

### **3 BACKGROUND**

#### **3.1 Topography and geology**

The proposed development area occupies at least 72ha of arable and pasture land on the southern edge of Melton Mowbray. It is divided into two portions: a small c 4ha block (Fields 23 and 24) on the western side sandwiched between Leicester Road and Kirby Lane, and a more substantial eastern block (Fields 1-7, 10- 11, 13, 18, 20 and 21) encompassing 68ha. The eastern side of this block is defined by Burton Road (A606), the northern edge by Kirby Lane and the current southern extent of Melton Mowbray.

To the south-west lie open fields. The evaluation area is subdivided by Dalby Road and Sandy Lane and the fields are defined by hedgerows.

The topographic and geological background has been thoroughly assessed as part of a Heritage Assessment undertaken by CgMs Consulting (Dawson 2016). The relevant points have been reproduced below.

The British Geological Survey indicates that the solid geology of the proposed development area comprises the Blue Lias Formation, a Sedimentary Bedrock formed approximately 190 to 204 million years ago in the Jurassic and Triassic Periods when the local environment was dominated by shallow seas. These rocks were formed with mainly siliciclastic sediments (comprising of fragments or clasts of silicate minerals) deposited as mud, silt, sand and gravel. The drift geology comprises Oadby Member diamicton; superficial deposits formed up to 2 million years ago in the Quaternary Period when the environment was dominated by ice age conditions and the geology formed in cold periods as glaciers scoured the landscape depositing moraines of till with outwash sand and gravel deposits from seasonal and post glacial meltwaters (BGS 2017).

The structure of the landscape can be described as broad ridge south of the River Wreake valley in an East Midlands region 'formed by lines of low hills running parallel with each other in a lazy curve from south-west to north-east, the backbone of which is the broad sweep of the Jurassic limestones which run in a great arc from the Cotswolds to the Humber' (Stocker 2006, 14).

The survey area occupies a very gentle south-facing slope at an elevation of c95m – 105m aOD.

#### **3.2 Historical and archaeological background**

A Heritage Assessment was carried out by CgMs Consulting in 2016 (Dawson 2016). This compiled a search of available historic maps as well as Leicestershire's Historic Environment Record (LHER). The results for the periods, which have been shown to have archaeological potential, are summarised below.

Scattered flint artefacts, dating from the Mesolithic and Neolithic period, have been found within the study area. Mesolithic flint was recorded to the north in an area of Melton Mowbray now developed for housing. Worked flint was recovered from the eastern part of the development area and has been dated to the later Neolithic. Further material west of Eye Kettleby has been recorded. No evidence exists within the development area for settlement activity during the Bronze Age period. However, evidence of settlement and funerary activity exists to the west of Eye Kettleby. Additionally, a barbed and tanged flint arrowhead was found close to the eastern boundary of the development area and part of a Bronze Age spear was discovered on the eastern edge of the development area. The potential for more than residual lithic material to be recovered within the development area has been characterised as low.



A detailed gradiometer survey undertaken in 2008 (Butler and Fisher 2008) and 2015 (Walford 2016) identified two areas of archaeological activity to the east and west of Sandy Lane (Walford 2016). To the east a 70m x 40m sub-rectangular enclosure contained four smaller rectangular enclosures and what appeared to be at least seven roundhouses. Combined with the evidence from surface finds it is likely that these features comprise a late prehistoric farming settlement, probably late Iron Age in origin. It is likely that by the end of the Iron Age most of the landscape was densely populated and intensively utilised by a mixed agricultural economy. The location of the geophysical survey data confirms the presence of Iron Age settlement with the proposed development area.

The number of individual finds, including those logged by the Portable Antiquities Scheme and pottery recovered through field walking in 1987 from the development area, dated to the Roman period and suggests a range of activities. Along the northern boundary of the proposed development site, Kirby Lane is probably a Roman road and this extends to the west. Within the proposed development area there are two settlements, the layout of which was confirmed by geophysical survey in 2008 (Butler and Fisher 2008) and 2015 (Walford 2016). The morphology of the settlements suggests both are probably early Roman in date, c1st-2nd century AD. Settlement is also likely on the periphery of the study area to the north, to the west and to the south-west. The size and implied density of the two settlements suggests that the sites are respectively a small rural hamlet and a farmstead. The farm extends over more than four hectares and the latter about one hectare.

In the early medieval period in Melton Mowbray there is significant evidence for the transitional period between the Roman occupation and the establishment of the Anglo-Saxon kingdom. A cemetery at Beck Mill (MLE 3911) and a 5th-century brooch on higher ground on the north-western edge of the modern town suggest an early settlement focus which is probably beneath the town (MLE 8845, 9039, 9481). Further Anglo-Saxon cemeteries lay north-east of Aerodrome Farm and a possible cemetery lies within the western part of the proposed development area (MLE 6212). A single 8th-century Anglo-Saxon sceatta (MLE 6210) was found close to Kirby Lane and also perhaps indicates that this route remained in use in the post-Roman period and later. Stafford (1985) has suggested that the proximity of Danish place names in the Wreake valley and the presence of early cemeteries such as that at Beck Mill indicates that later, Viking period settlement occurred in areas already established in the early medieval period. The later establishment of a minster church where ecclesiastical dues were collected (Everitt 1975), alone implies an early origin for the medieval centre.

Throughout the proposed development area there is ridge and furrow almost all running east to west. Melton Mowbray was inclosed by Act of Parliament in 1760-1 in a pattern which is reflected in the present-day field boundaries.

#### **4 METHODOLOGY**

MOLA is a Chartered Institute for Archaeologists (CIfA) registered organisation. This report has been prepared in accordance with current best archaeological practice as defined in the Chartered Institute for Archaeologists' *Code of Conduct and Standard and guidance for archaeological field evaluation* (CIfA 2014a and b), the Historic England procedural document *Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment (MoRPHE)* (HE 2015), and with local guidelines (LCC 1997, 2014).

Fieldwalking survey was undertaken across Fields 2, 3, 5, 18 and 21. The survey took place along parallel transects spaced 20m apart (Fig 2). No artefact clusters predating the post-medieval/modern era were identified and as a result a reduction to

10m wide transects was not required. Transects are located to Ordnance Survey National Grid using a Leica VIVA Global Positioning System (GPS) using Smartnet real-time corrections.

Each survey area (field) was walked systematically at slow pace along the parallel transects and surface finds were collected from a corridor extending about 1m to each side of the transect line (Fig 3). The overall sample of the surface area was approximately 10%. Standard MOLA Fieldwalking Record Sheets were used to record the results, including ground surface visibility and weather conditions.

All archaeological artefacts were collected except sharp glass, modern plastics and any other hazardous material. All members of the survey team were shown pictures of the quartzite 'choppers' previously found in and near the study area and reported through the Portable Antiquities Scheme. Furthermore, 'toolbox talks' from MOLA's prehistoric flint specialist were given, to ensure maximum retrieval of flint artefacts. Samples of brick, tile and slag were collected and any concentrations of these materials were noted.



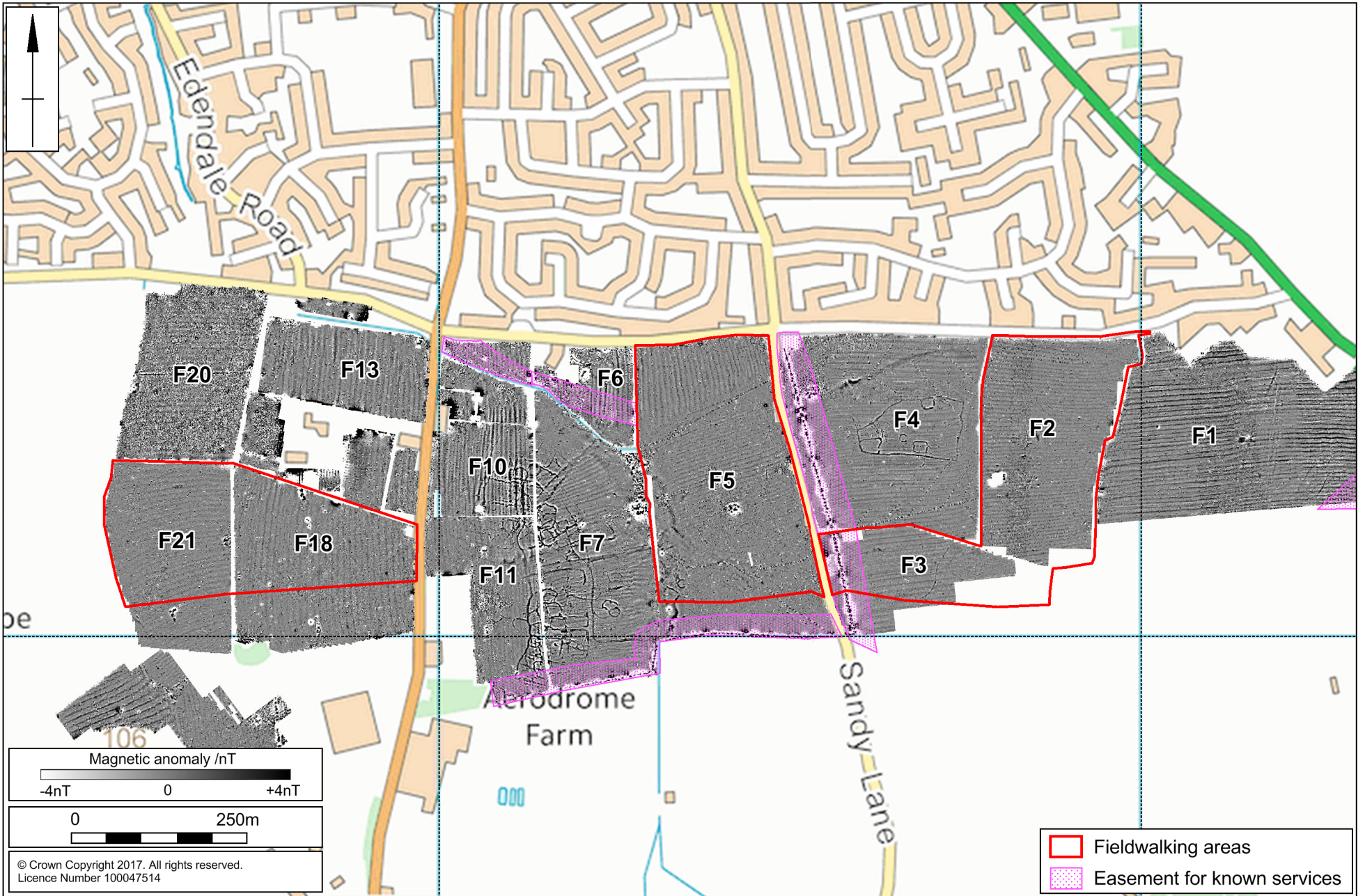

## 5 FIELDWALKING SURVEY

### 5.1 Ground conditions

At the time of the survey in early March 2017, all the fields were in a suitable condition to be walked, and were under a new crop (Fig 4). The weather was mostly cloudy with sunny spells. It had rained shortly before the survey was carried out; the ground was very wet and there was standing water in places in Field 5 (Fig 5). Visibility was good in Fields 18 and 21, moderate in Fields 5 and 3, and moderate to poor in Field 2 where the crop was at a more advanced stage.

## 5.2 Survey results

During the fieldwalking a range of artefacts were recovered, these are summarised in Table 1 and are discussed in the following sections. The results are plotted on a series of distribution plans (Figs 6-7 and 9-18).

## 5.3 The worked flint by Yvonne Wolfram-Murray

### *Introduction*

In total 55 pieces of worked flint were collected (Figs 6 and 7). Table 2 provides an overview of the flint types recovered arranged by field.

### *Method*

The lithics were collected by hand during the fieldwalking survey. Each object was macroscopically assessed and recorded onto an MS Access spreadsheet by type, condition, possible raw material and tool form.

### *Raw material and condition*

The condition of the assemblage is moderate to poor with all flints showing post-depositional edge damage. This had a detrimental effect on the recognition of intentional retouch or utilisation on the flint. The majority of the post-depositional damage was caused by ploughing and abrasion of the flint in the soil. Patination was present on just over half of the flint; this was notable as a slight blue-white discolouration or complete white discoloration of the surface. Heavy burning of the flint was noted on two flakes, one fragment and the scraper. This was apparent through thermal fracturing and crazing.

The quality of raw material was good. The vitreous flint ranged in colour from light to dark brown, grey and grey-brown. There were also a small proportion of grey opaque

and granular textured flints. The cortex ranged from light to mid brown and was on occasion grey in colour. The raw material came from local gravel deposits.

### ***Assemblage composition***

The worked flint comprised 55 pieces worked flint that included 48 flakes, two blades, one scraper fragment, summarised below in Table 3.

The largest proportion of the assemblage is made up of waste flakes and blades. In total 48 flakes, of which 24 were broken, and eleven blades of which five were broken, were recovered. Flakes with cortical striking platforms and hinge termination were existent in the assemblage.

One fragment of a possible scraper was present. It was heavily burnt, fragmenting it. There is abrupt retouch to distal end.

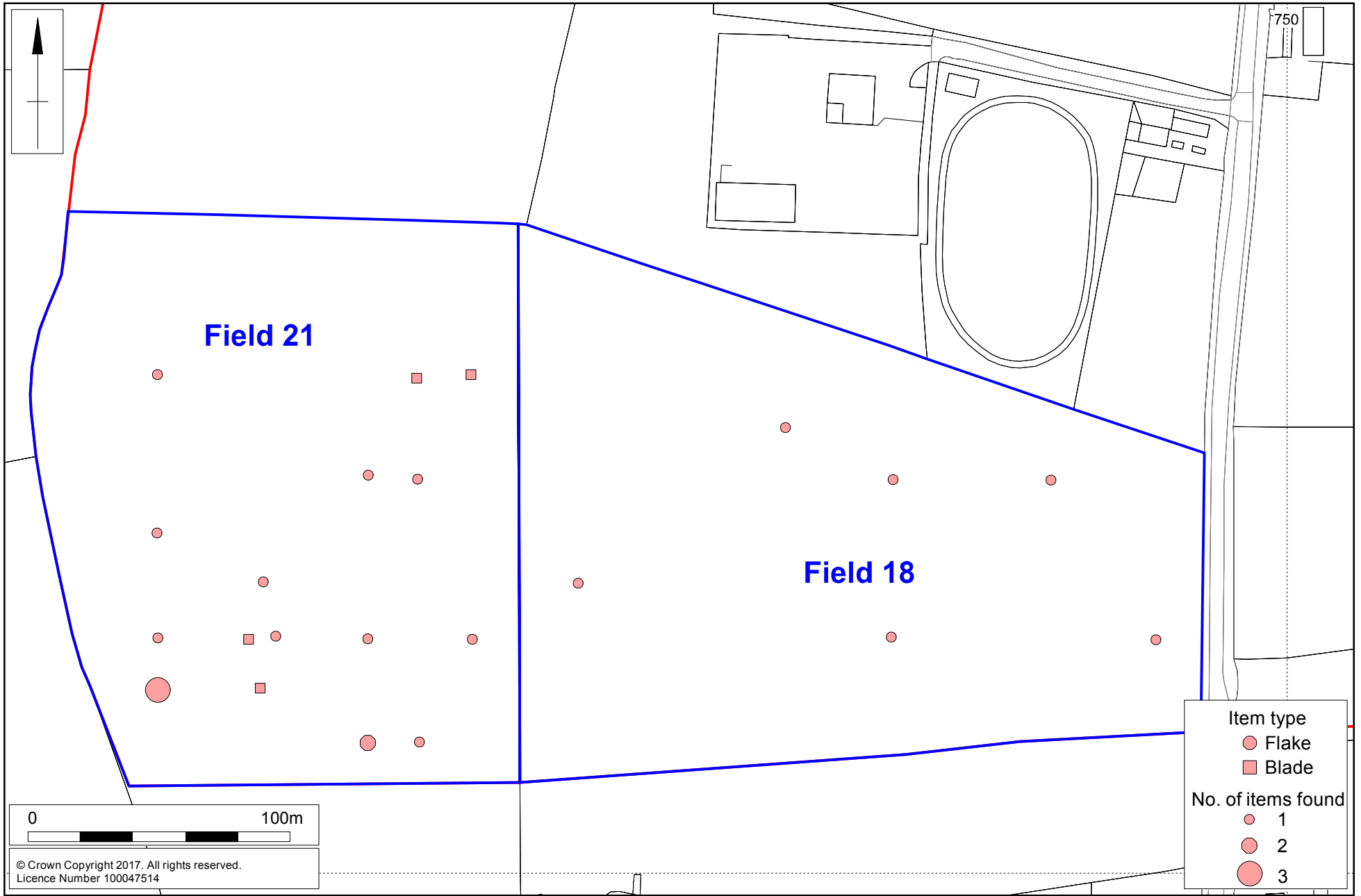
### ***Discussion***

The worked flint is not directly dateable; however technological characteristics of the worked flint indicate a Neolithic to late Neolithic/early Bronze Age date. The worked flint generally forms a non-specific scatter across the surveyed areas. However the majority was recovered from the western fields of the development area.

Distribution of worked flint in Fields 5, 3 and 2

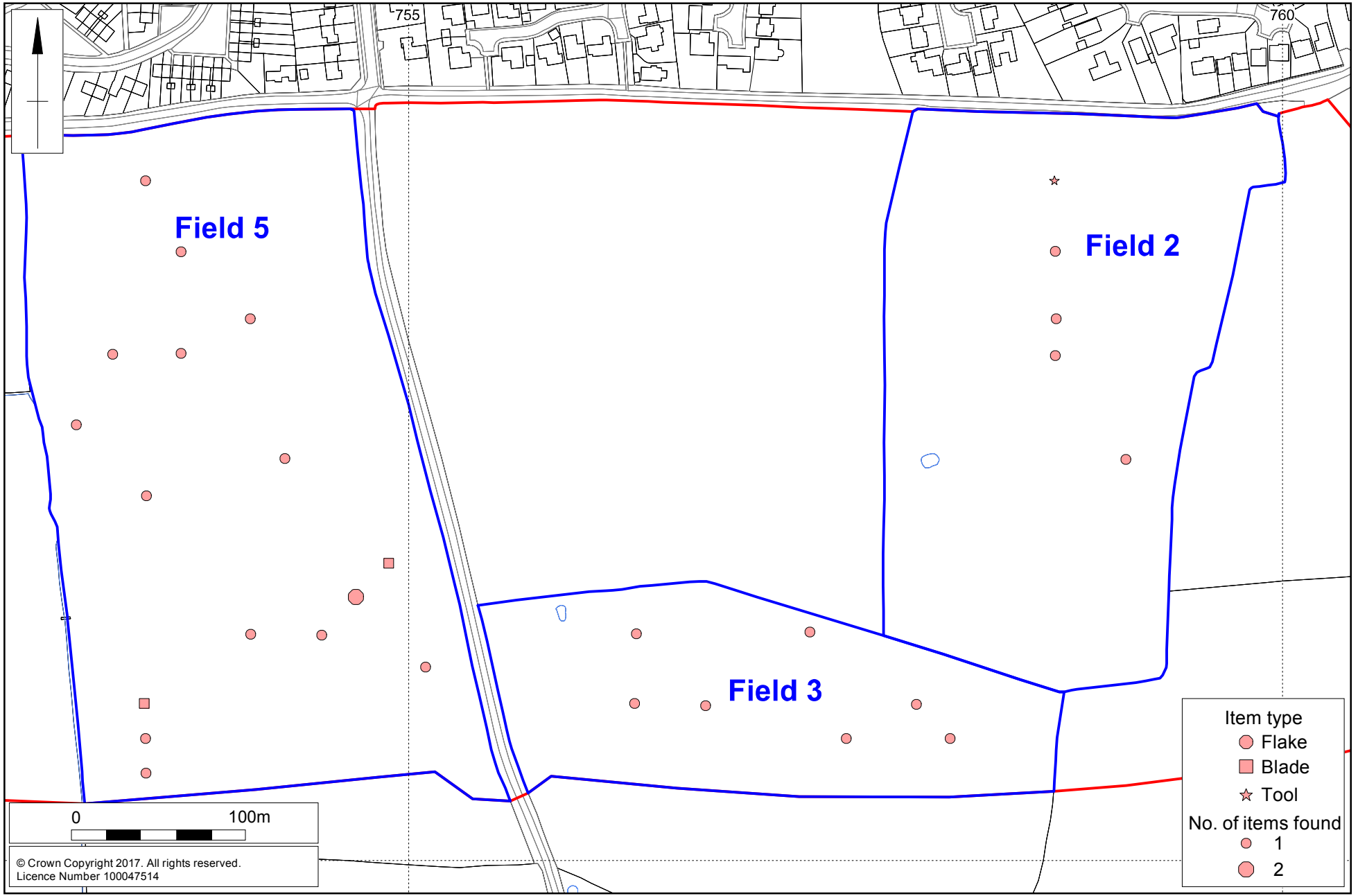

#### 5.4 The pottery by Paul Blinkhorn and Tora Hylton

The pottery was recorded using the conventions of the Leicestershire County type-series (Sawday 1994), (Table 5). A breakdown of sherd and weight is in Appendix I.

##### ***Romano-British***

A total of 13 individual sherds with a combined weight of 0.055kg were recovered from Fields 2, 3, 5, 18 and 21. The majority of sherds were recovered from Field 5 and adjacent Fields 2 and 3, suggesting that the focus of activity is concentrated on the eastern side of the area of investigation. The assemblage comprises mainly undiagnostic bodysherds which display signs of abrasion and wear and this is reflected in the in a mean sherd weight of 4.2g. The analysis included sherd count and weight by fabric type and where possible the fabric types have been broadly classified according to the Leicester and Leicestershire Pottery Fabric Reference Collection (L& L PFRC).

The fabric types represented suggest a late 1st to 4th century AD date. There are no diagnostic early sherds, however, the presence of locally produced grey coarsewares suggest a late 1st and 2nd century AD. Later wares are represented by a rim sherd from a Lower Nene Valley Colour Coat jar and this extends the date range to the 3rd/4th century. Imported wares are not represented.

##### ***Medieval***

A total of 79 sherds of medieval pottery were recovered from all the fields (Figs 11 and 12). There were no distinct concentrations of pottery; all surveyed fields had ridge and furrow. The assemblage is thought likely to represent manuring rather than below ground archaeological features.

##### ***Late medieval pottery***

During the survey a total of 148 sherds of late medieval pottery was recovered (Figs 13 and 14). The material was evenly distributed across the fields; however a small concentration was noted in the centre in Field 5. The assemblage may represent manure scatter associated with the ridge and furrow.

***Post-medieval /modern***

The post-medieval/modern pottery assemblage accounted 746 sherds (Figs 15-18). The assemblage appeared evenly distributed in Fields 2, 3, 18 and 21. A higher concentration of modern wares in Field 5 was observed, in the centre where the geophysical survey revealed two areas of disturbance/deposit of modern material (Fig 17). On the surface during the survey it was noted that there was also a concentration of fragmented bricks and tile (Fig 8). Although there was a higher concentration in the north-eastern corner, there is very little disturbance shown in the geophysical survey.



The location of the post-medieval/modern concentration in Field 5 Fig 8



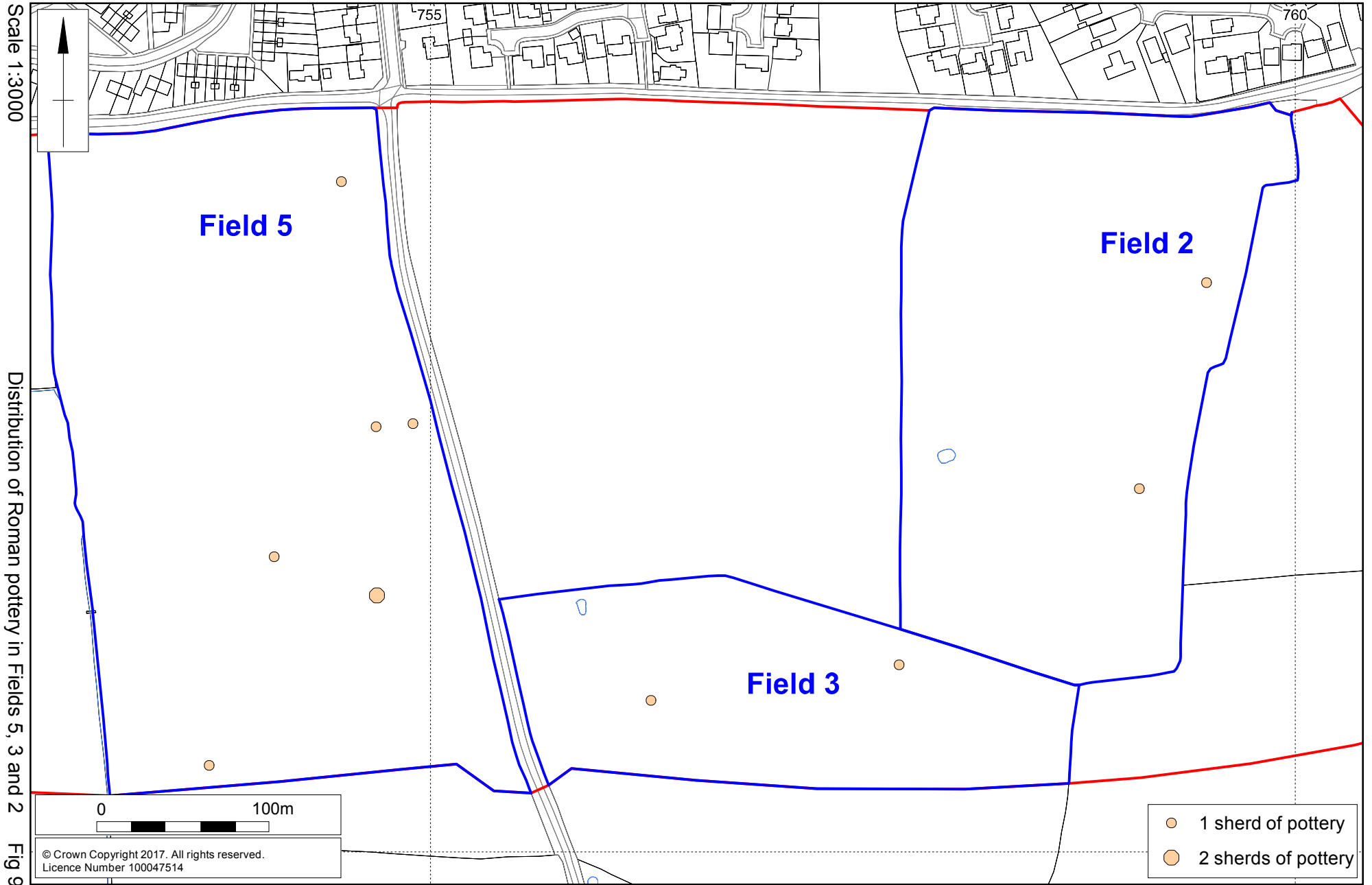
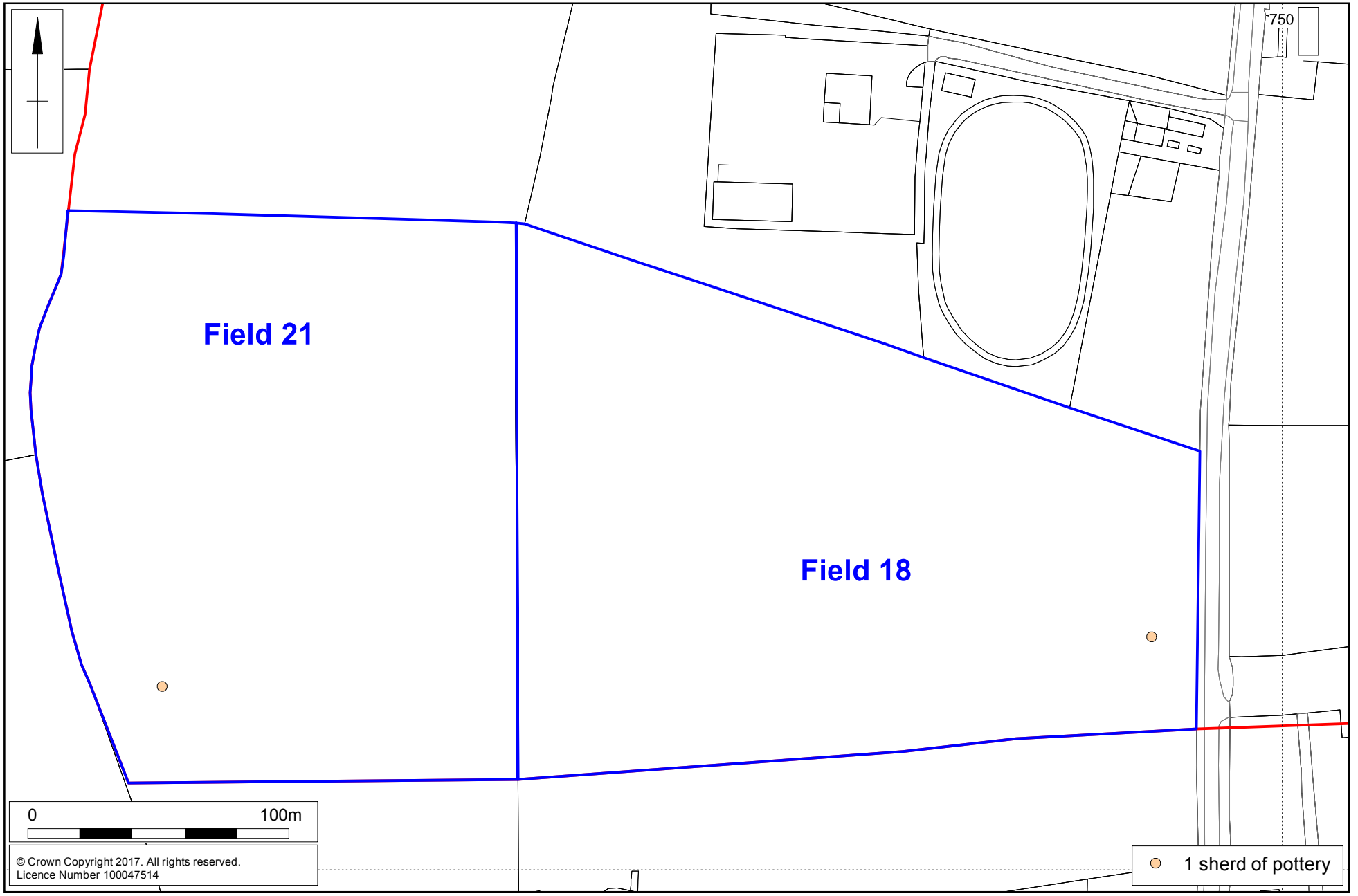

Distribution of Roman pottery in Fields 21 and 18 Fig 10



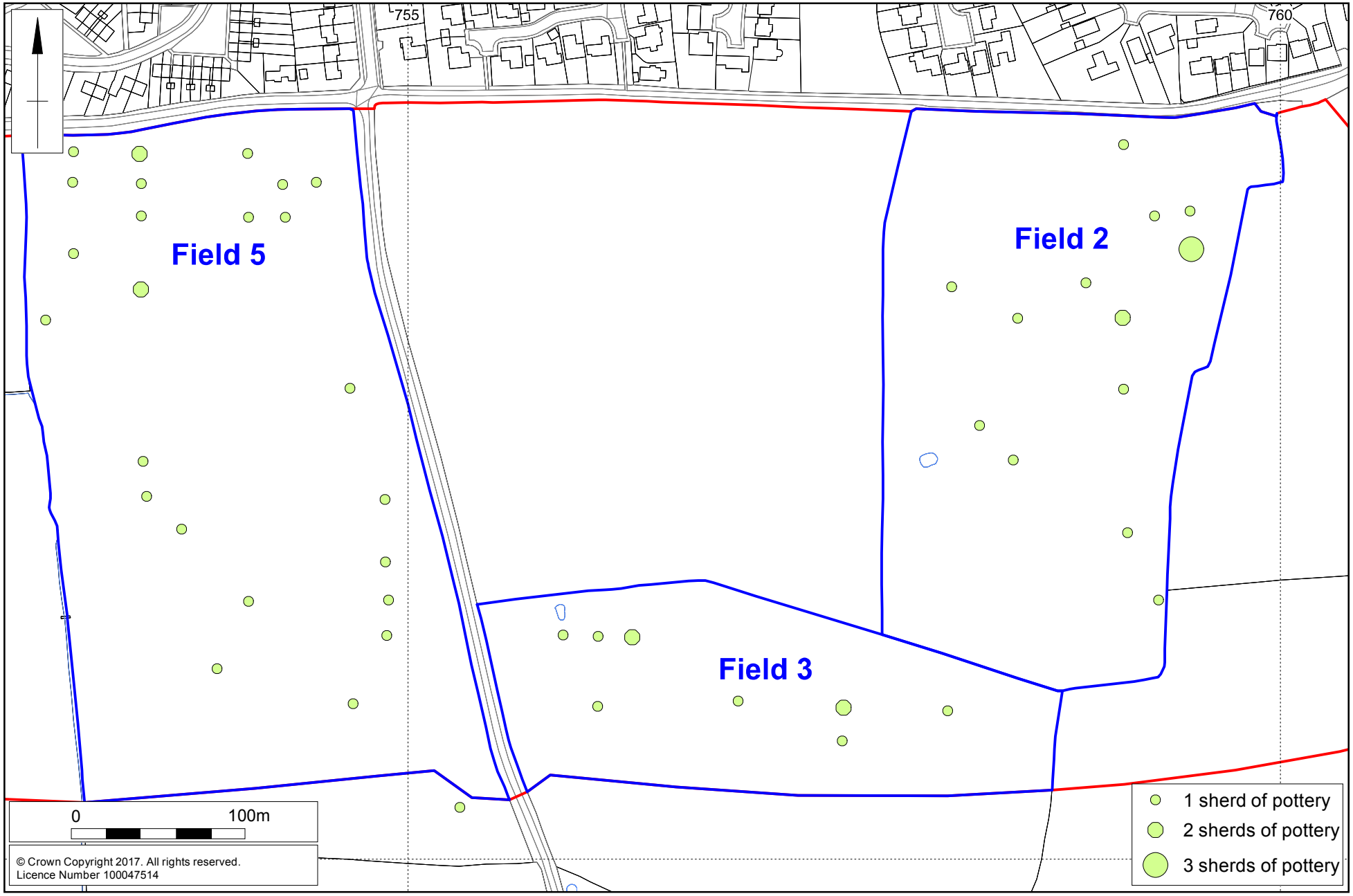

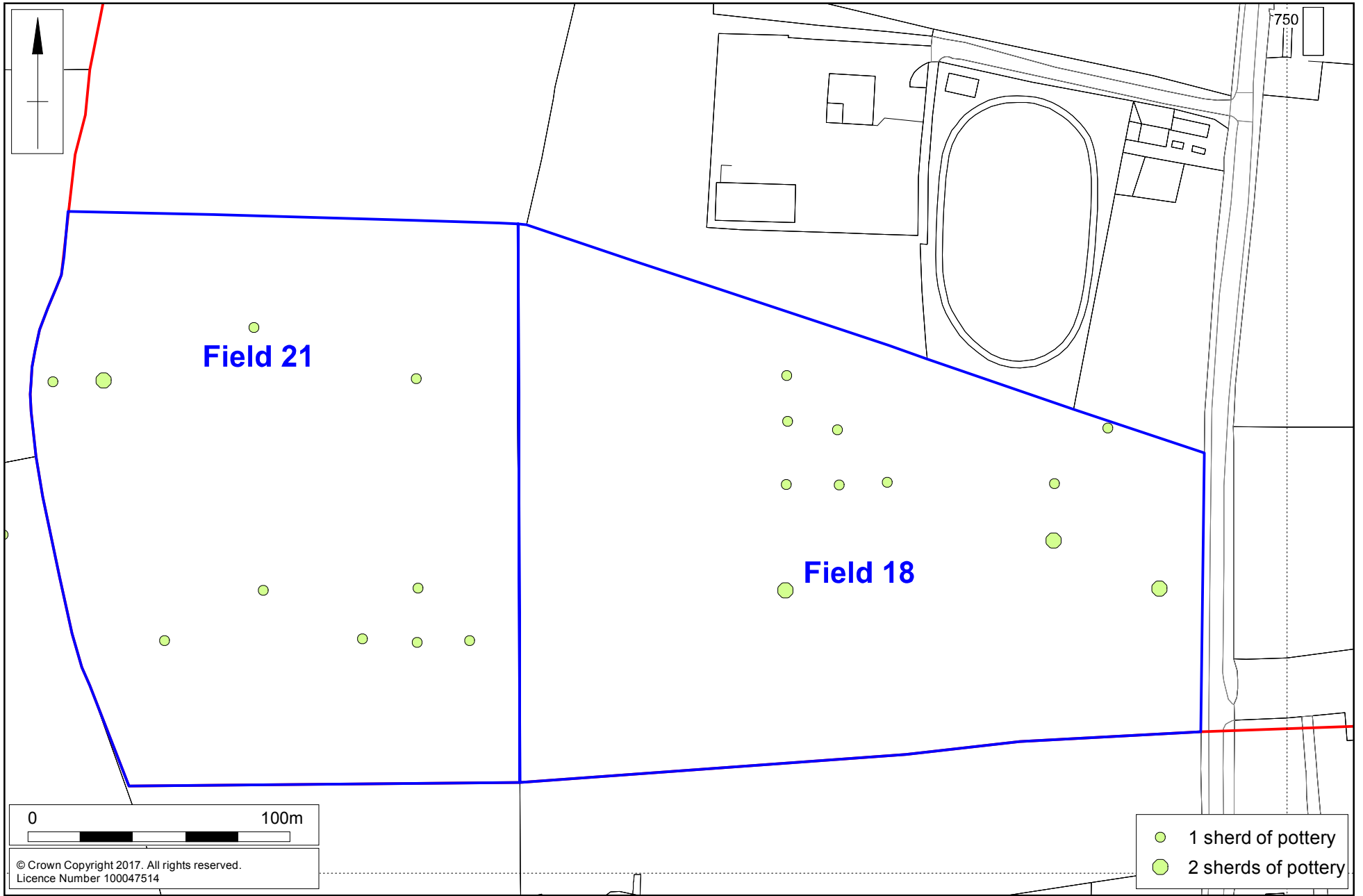
Distribution of medieval pottery in Fields 5, 3 and 2

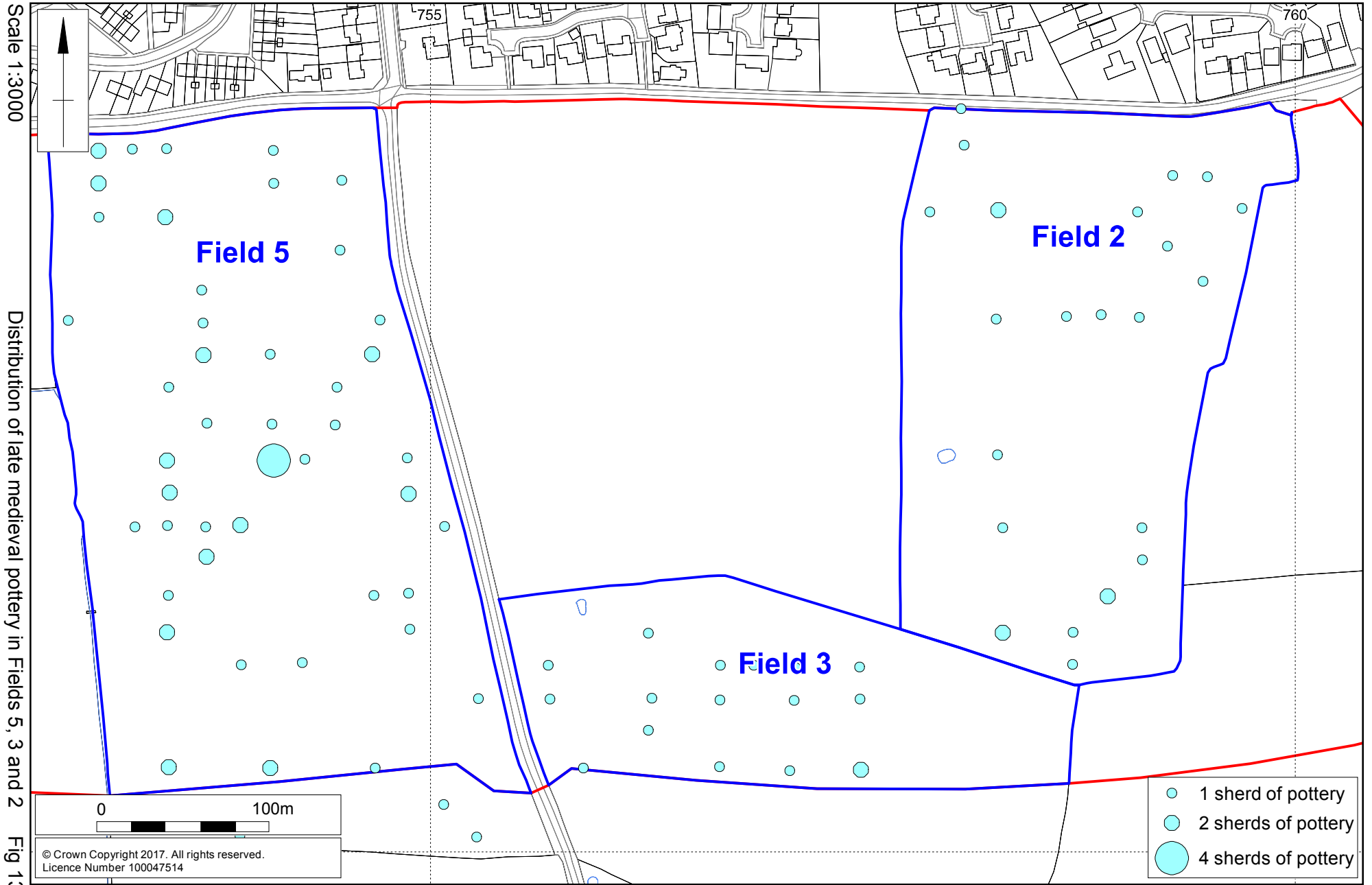

Distribution of medieval pottery in Fields 21 and 18

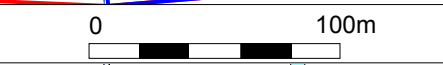

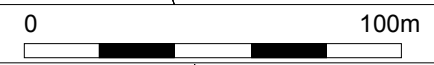
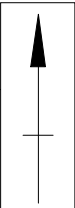
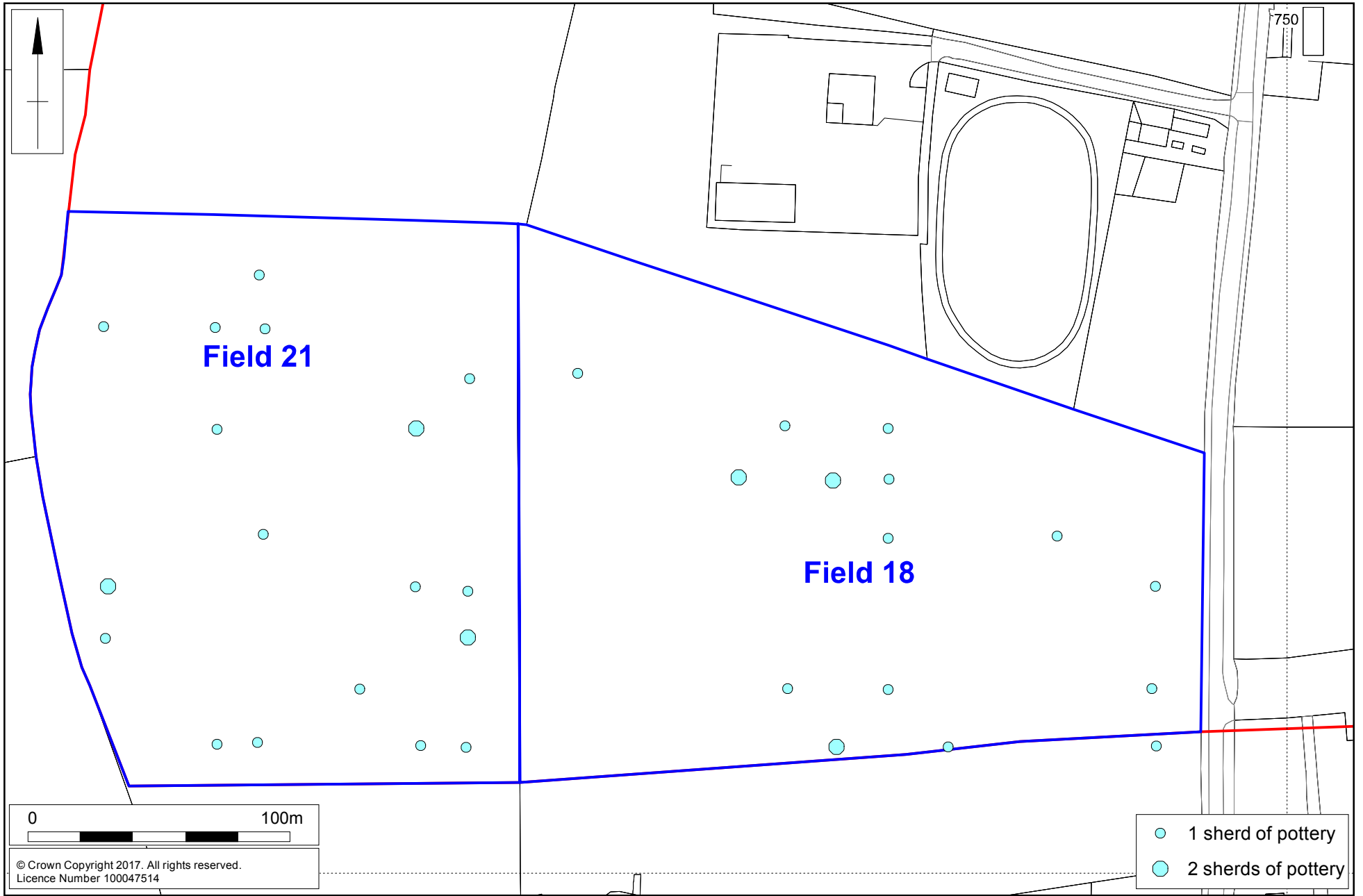

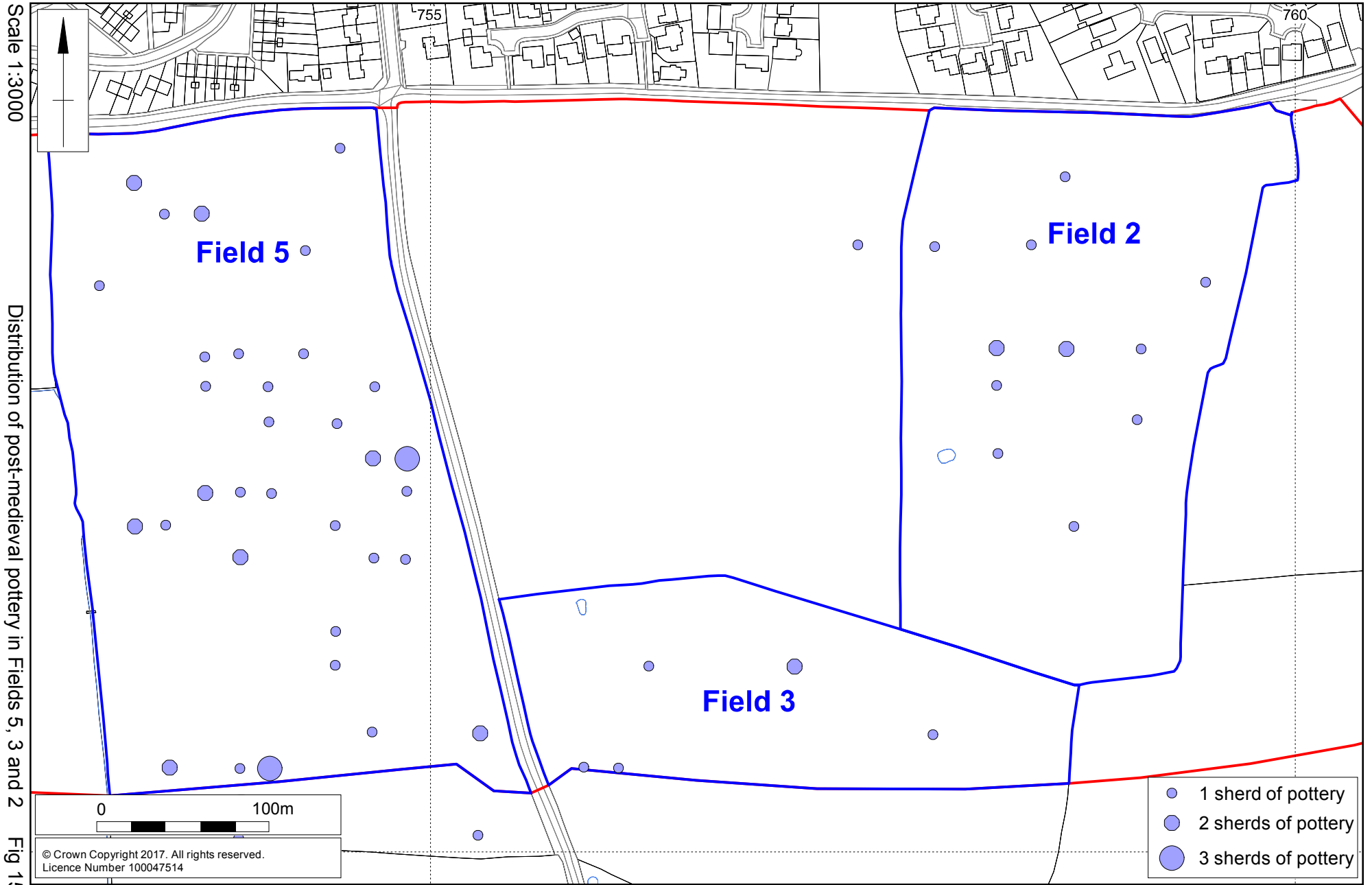
Distribution of late medieval pottery in Fields 21 and 18

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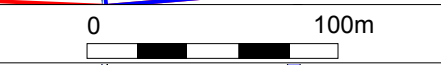

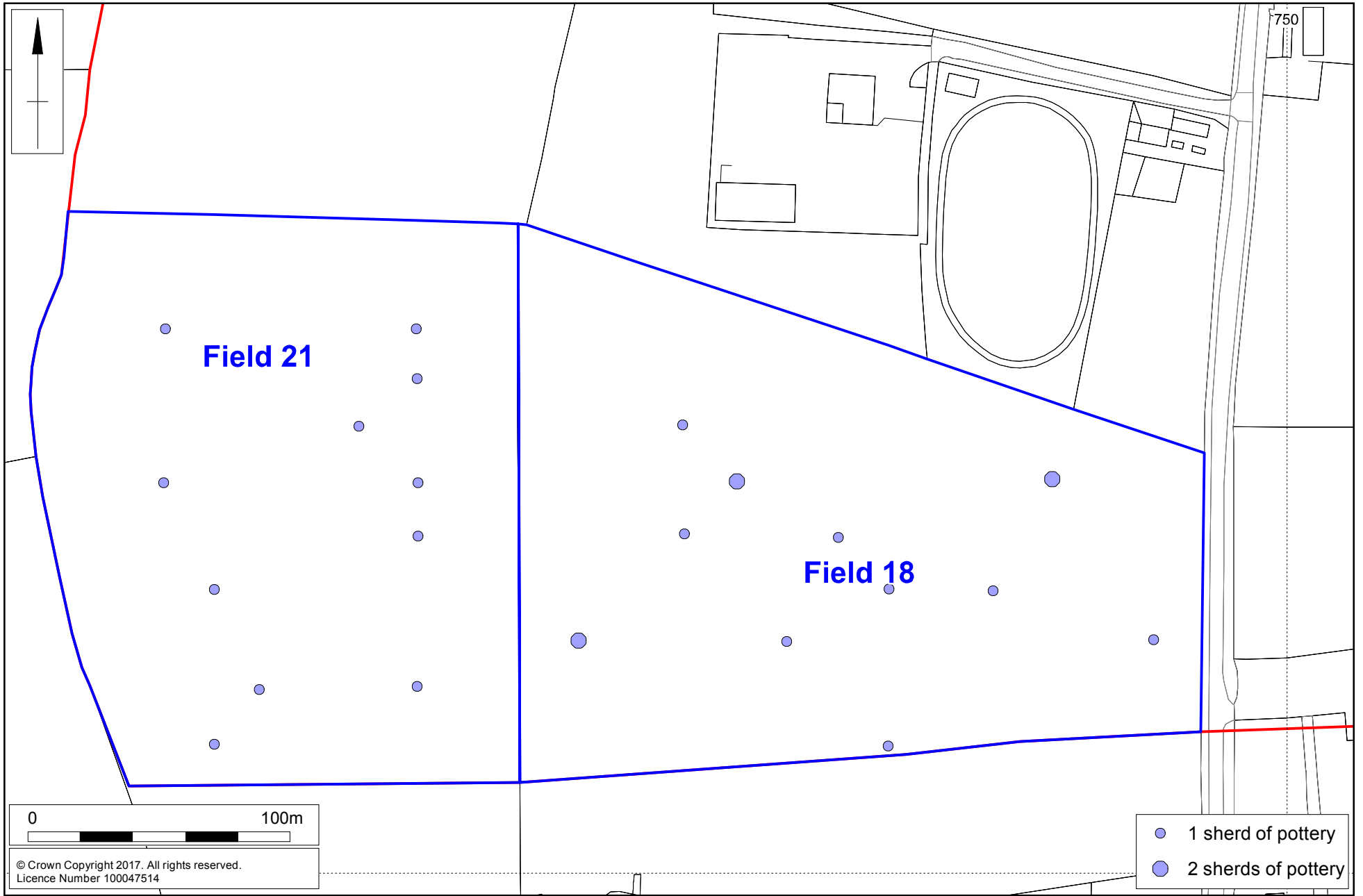

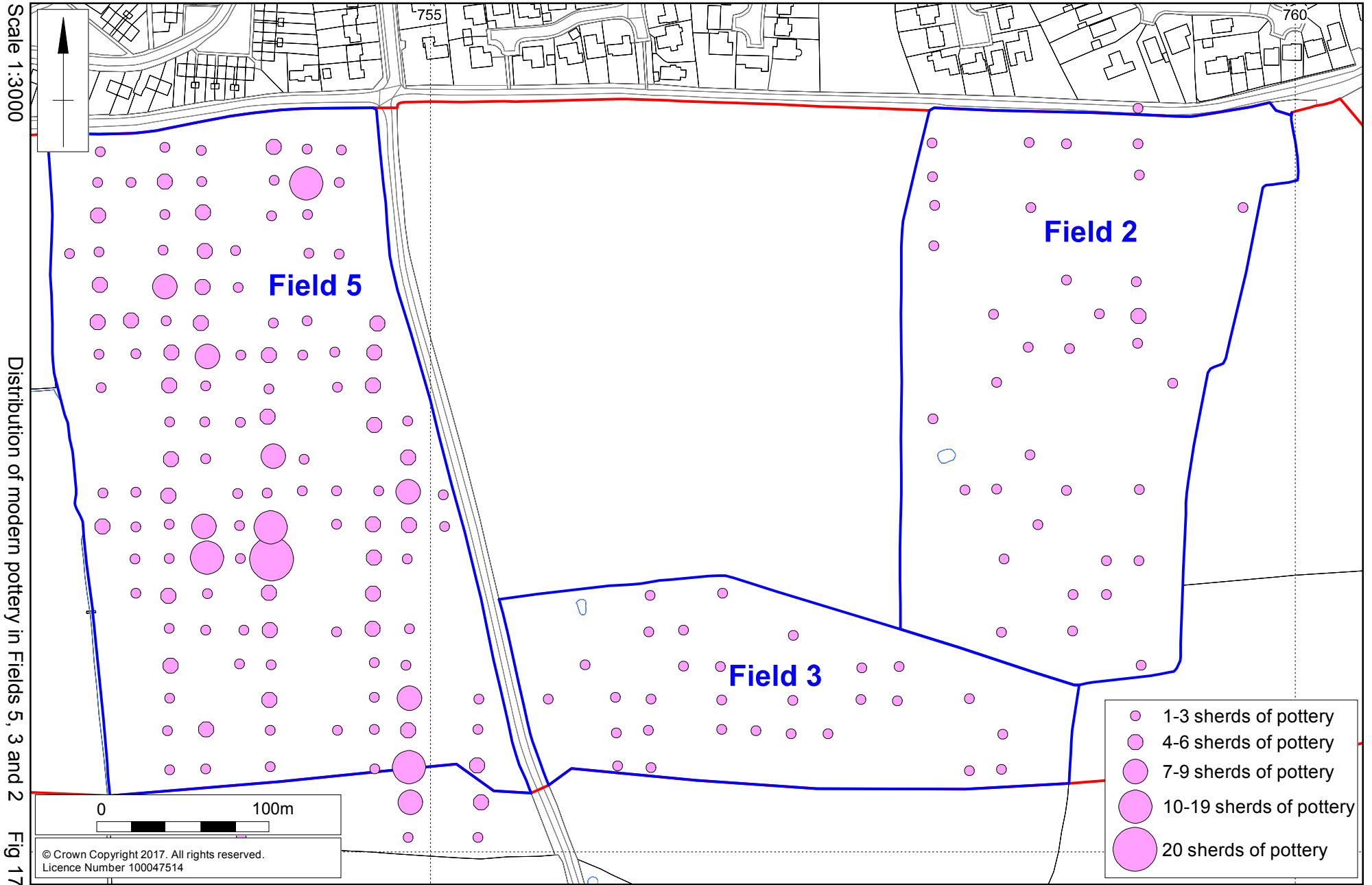
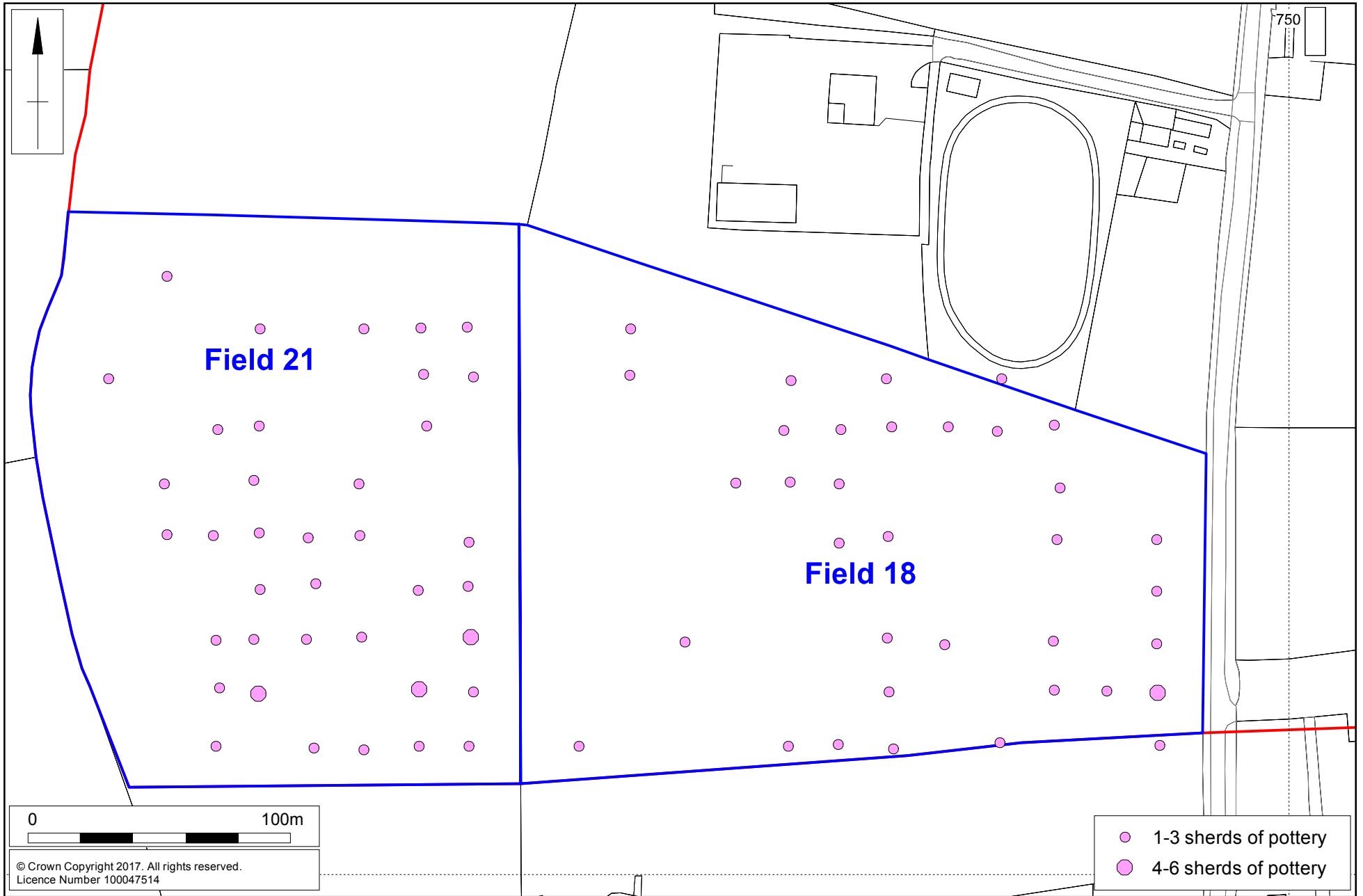

## 5.5 Clay tobacco-pipes

A total of 91 clay tobacco-pipe fragments were recovered from Fields 2, 3, 5, 18 and 21 (Fig 3). The assemblage comprises six fragmentary pipe-bowls and 85 stem fragments, which together span the mid-seventeenth to nineteenth centuries. Much of the assemblage displays signs of extreme abrasion, indicating that there had been much movement of soil/ploughing in the intervening years. None of the examples preserve maker's marks.

Although there are no complete bowls, the presence of certain stylistic features permits dating. Three and possibly four bowl fragments pre date c1700. Two of these are sufficiently complete to equate their form with those illustrated by Oswald in his simplified typology using bowl and foot/spur forms (1975, 37-41). They are bulbous in form and narrow slightly towards the lip and they display similarities to Oswald's Type G17, which dates to c1640-70. One other bowl fragment is furnished with the remains of a narrow groove set just below the lip, also suggesting a pre c18th century date. A further two bowl fragments represent examples of late 18th/19th century bowls, one is furnished with a foliate motif on the front of the bowl.

The stem fragments measure up to c48mm in length. Changes in manufacturing technique ensured that there was a reduction in the size of the bore and this change in bore size can be used as an indicator of date. There is a high proportion of stem fragments with relatively large bores, suggesting that in tandem with the bowls, they too date to the c late 17th century.

### **Conclusion**

This small assemblage is unremarkable; however, it does contain a relatively high proportion of clay tobacco-pipe fragments which appear to date to the late 17th century.

## 6 Discussion

The fieldwalking survey recovered artefacts from the Neolithic through to the post-medieval/modern period although generally present in low quantities.

There was a general trend of a higher concentration of prehistoric and Roman finds towards the northern part of the survey area, especially the north-western corner. There was a notable decline in finds towards the southern boundary in the western corner; though here the ground conditions were wetter than in other parts of the survey area (Fig 5).

### ***Prehistoric***

The low flint scatter generally dated from the Neolithic through to the late Neolithic/early Bronze Age was suggestive of low level prehistoric activity. Flint was more prevalent in the two westernmost walked fields.

### ***Roman***

A geophysical survey revealed anomalies in Fields 4, 7, 10 and 11 (Fig 3) (Butler and Fisher 2008 and Walford 2016). These anomalies were interpreted as late Iron Age to early Romano-British settlement activity. The fieldwalking survey revealed a low scatter of Roman pottery, with the majority being recovered from Field 5 and dating to the 1st to 4th centuries AD (Figs 3 and 9). A fieldwalking survey previously carried out in 1987 revealed a scatter of Romano-British pottery (Parker 1997). It was concentrated towards the western part of the Field 4, being densest above the features detected in the geophysical survey and rapidly decreasing in quantity to a light scatter at the eastern boundary of the field. Iron Age pottery is less likely to survive within plough soil due to its friability, but the presence of the Romano-British cluster suggests small scale Romano-British occupation located within the north-west part of the study area.

### ***Saxon***

Three Saxon burial grounds are thought to have been located within the site (Dawson 2016). The fieldwalking has found no Saxon remains but this may not be significant. Saxon artefacts are rarely found in fieldwalking. This is especially true for pottery (as well as Prehistoric pottery) where soft handmade sherds mostly do not survive in the plough soil.

### ***Medieval***

The geophysical survey found ridge and furrow in all of the surveyed fields. The medieval and late medieval pottery showed no substantial concentrations, suggestive of manure scatter. The Heritage Assessment noted that in the medieval periods the land surrounding Melton Mowbray was arable land (Dawson 2016).

### ***Post-medieval/modern***

There was a widespread, high density scatter of post-medieval pottery covering the survey area. A higher concentration was noted towards the centre of Field 5, roughly coinciding with the two large areas of disturbance identified in the geophysical survey. During the survey it was noted that there was a high surface concentration of brick and tile fragments in this location.
