SPOT DATING REPORT 287 ON POTTERY FROM EXCAVATIONS AT SUDBROOKE (ROMAN VILLA), LINCOLNSHIRE, SUD06-07

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The pottery from these two years comes from 74 contexts (2006, 24; 2007, 40), and has been spot dated pending preparation of a full archive database. Approximate sherd counts are: 2006, 942; 2007, 852 sherds.

This report is only a short statement of what has been found in view of continuing excavation. Since much of the pottery came from the upper layers of the site, it is not suitable for any detailed analysis. Nearly all is very fragmented and heavily abraded, leading to difficulties of identification and dating. The pottery dating and notable vessels or fabrics by context is summarised for each season in Appendix 1.

2006 Excavations in Areas C and D

Area C

360 sherds. The lowest identified deposit with pottery was context 25, a disturbed deposit of plough with fragmentary stone tile and *opus signinum*, the only datable sherd being a rim from a wide-mouthed bowl dating to probably the mid to late 3rd century, although the type continues into the 4th century. The later, mostly small, contexts contain pottery up to the 3rd century, and the larger deposits are from the topsoil, and surface finds.

The pottery includes Central Gaulish samian, one possibly from Les Martres de Veyre of earlier 2nd century date, while other early pottery indicators are rough-cast beakers, rusticated wares, and a hooked-rim mortarium.

Area D

582 sherds. The lowest deposit, context 49 was not fully excavated, but contained a very abraded Mancetter-Hartshill mortarium dating to the mid to late 3rd century. Other contexts were mainly late deposits, with the bulk of the material from post-Roman upper layers.

There was less samian, later mortaria types, more Nene Valley colour-coated vessels, all beakers, and dales ware shell-gritted jars. The earlier pottery included rusticated sherds, parisian type plain body sherds, flagon fragments and a possible 2nd century local type of type B321. The earliest sherds from both areas are probably the rusticated sherds, although these jars continue into the middle of the 2nd century.

2007 Excavations in Area E

The earliest deposits appear to be 142 which contained a single shell-gritted storage jar, only loosely datable to the 1st to 2nd centuries, but more importantly the ditch or pit contexts 161-2 which produced the most important early finds. These are sherds from a Lyon ware beaker from (162 ditch or pit 141), and a mica-dusted bobble beaker with sherds from robber trench 146, ditch or pit 141 and 103 at the base of topsoil. Importation of Lyon ware ceases *c*. AD 75, and the distribution of the ware is strongly related to military sites. Despite Lincoln being a legionary fortress, Lyon ware is rare there, although the same type of mica-dusted beaker, stamped by the potter CAMARO, probably from Belgium, came from an early cremation

burial (Rigby 1999), and in early deposits from The Park excavation (Darling 1999, fig 28, no 59).

The first sherds from the 3rd century occur in robber trenches 191 and 146. The samian is mostly Central Gaulish, but at least two sherds might be earlier, from either South Gaul or Les Martres de Veyre, fitting into a later 1st to early 2nd century range. There is also a sherd from a Moselkeramik beaker from (101 topsoil), and sherds from Dressel 20 olive oil amphorae. Mortaria sherds include a later vessel from the Nene Valley and earlier sherds, including an unusual spout, from a hooked-rim type.

The 2nd century is fairly well represented with rusticated ware, certain specifically local types of bowl or dish, B334 and B333, and a copy of a Gallo-Belgic plate, D452 (Darling and Precious, forthcoming). Cream flagon sherds are more likely to be of 1st-2nd century date, including an early ring-necked type (119, ?robbing), and there is also a fragment of a BB1 (Black-Burnished ware 1) from Dorset of early to mid 2nd century date.

An unusual bowl with decoration on the interior came from the dumbbell shaped burnt feature 147, and the bowl type and internal decoration can be paralled in a large Lincoln deposit at the Lower City west gate (Darling 1999, fig 36, no 369; fig 37, no 379) which contained quantities of 3rd century and earlier pottery. There is also a very strange large open form from (105), a mixed group with post-Medieval sherds. Both will require further research.

A single context with pottery, 158, is noted as not used. Since there is no cut noted on the matrix for the wall 159, is this related to that? The few sherds are not closely datable.

Summary

Overall, the pottery is strongly related to that occurring in Lincoln, particularly in the 2nd century. The early imported fine wares from Lyon and Central Gaul provide very important new evidence. The dating for both is Neronian rather than later, although both could be still around into the later 1st century, c. AD 75. As fine table wares, such vessels could have a relatively long life. Further evidence is desirable to confirm the earliest date for the occupation on the site. As noted previously (Darling 2006), there are no sherd for which a 4th century date is applicable. Moreover, to date, all the Nene Valley colour-coated wares have excluded the known later open forms, most sherds being from beakers. Such aspects will aid determining the closing date.

Some vessels from these excavations will be selected for illustration, reserved pending further excavation on the site. Equally the samian will be extracted as a specialist report will be required.
