**Reasons for watching brief:** An archaeological watching brief was conducted during investigations into a proposed enlargement of a sewer overflow. The remains of a Roman road and a series of burials had been recorded to the northeast of the site.

**Results**: The site was located on the River Ouse floodplain to the north of the centre of the city of York. The proposal to enlarge the sewer overflow involved the monitoring of two test pits 2 metres apart.

The test pits were excavated using a mini-digger KX36 with an 18 inch bucket. Any relevant sections were photographed and drawn and the soil descriptions recorded. Test pit 1 was 'L'-shaped and measured approximately  $2.2m \times 2m \times 2.15m$  deep. Test pit 2 measured  $1m \times 1.7m \times 2.1m$  deep.

Both pits demonstrated the presence of disturbed backfill deposits, which included lenses of mixed soil types, coal and ash. Post–medieval finds including pottery, clay tobacco pipe, glass and ceramic building material were recovered from both pits and later discarded.

**Documentation**: The archive consists of a photographic record consisting of several 35mm prints and slides; sketch drawings of the relevant sections and context sheets with soil descriptions.

**Archive deposition**: All finds were discarded.
