

## NOTES ON SOME OF THE CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS VOLUME.

DAVIES-SHIEL, Michael. Born June 1929 at Bebington in Cheshire. Educated Wirral Grammar School, and Birmingham University where he gained a B.Sc. degree and Education Diploma, before doing National Service. Since then has taught at Windermere Grammar School and Lakes School (19 years), specialising in Environmental Studies. He is a Geologist by qualification, a Geographer by profession and a Field Historian by inclination. He pioneered new field mapping techniques for the New Land Use Survey of England & Wales and has written various papers and symposia for them. Recently he has produced articles for the Historical Metallurgy Group and co-authored two books on Lakeland's Industrial Archaeology, with Dr J. D. Marshall and also worked with him for the Northern History review. At present he is continuing research into local mediaeval industries of soap, wool and iron; plus specialist studies of Keswick's and Cockermouth's industries.

HENIG, Martin, was born in 1942 and educated at Merchant Taylors' School, Northwood, St Catherine's College, Cambridge, the Institute of Archaeology, London and Worcester College, Oxford. He is now engaged in the production of a corpus of engraved gems found in Britain.

KIPLING, Charlotte, M.A., was born in Liverpool and educated at St Leonards School, St Andrews, and Newnham College, Cambridge, where she read economics. After war service in the W.R.N.S. she attended a course in statistics at University College, London. She is a Fellow of the Royal Statistical Society. Since 1947 she has been employed as statistician by the Freshwater Biological Association, at first at Wray Castle and later at The Ferry House. Her chief interest at present is fish population dynamics. She has published sixteen papers, some jointly with various colleagues, mainly on the statistical aspects of investigations into pike, perch and char in Windermere. She is the author of "A salt spring in Borrowdale" published in 1961 (CW2 lxi).
