#### Introduction




Figure 1. Site outline (red) relative to previous phases of monitoring (grey)

Several visits were made to the site to record the stripping of plough soil prior to quarrying of the sand and gravel geology for aggregate in Phases 6 and 9 of the quarry. Previous work on two partial areas within these phases was completed last year and reported on at the time (SACIC report no. 2015/072 / OASIS report no. 225124). The site was between two areas already stripped and cleared previously under HER codes WGN 038 and 047 (Fig. 1) and on land previously evaluated under HER code WGN 034. This report forms an addendum to the earlier works, which should be addressed for further details regarding archaeological and historical background and methodology (Brooks, 2014). The groundworks were undertaken by Frimstone Ltd., and the work is now under the supervision of Kate Batt (Suffolk County Council Archaeological Service Curatorial Team). An OASIS form has been completed for this report (reference no. suffolka1-266358) and a digital copy submitted for inclusion on the Archaeology Data Service database (http://ads.ahds.ac.uk/catalogue/library/greylit).

#### Groundworks

The two stripped areas combined cover approximately 4.3ha and between 0.3m and 0.4m of topsoil was stripped off using a 34-tonne tracked excavator with a flat-bladed bucket down to the top of the gravel natural with spoil stockpiled in a bund along the western edge of Area 6 on land monitored in 2011

#### Results

No archaeological features or finds were recorded across the site and no further stripping is to take place at the present time; as with earlier phases of the quarry the whole area is anticipated to be stripped intermittently as aggregate is required and land is released by the farm. The geology was pale yellow to mid orange sandy gravel in the southern area, while the northern area had a sandier consistency. Two large hollows were observed crossing the northern area can passing through the eastern end of the southern area but on investigation were determined to be natural depressions/eroded channels through the sand/gravel. Natural geological levels varied from 13.2m to 15.2m OD across the site.
