## A Survey of the Soake and Manor of Wirksworth.

Communicated by Rev. Canon Arkwright, M.A.



N May 19th, 1649, the memorable Act was passed which declared "that the people of England and of all the dominions and territories thereunto belonging are and shall be and are hereby constituted, made, established

and confirmed to be a Commonwealth and Free State, and shall henceforth be governed as a Commonwealth and Free State by the Supreme Authority of this nation, the representatives of the people in Parliament, and by such as they shall appoint and constitute officers and ministers for the good of the people, and that without any King or House of Lords." Not long after this the Commissioners began to make a survey and valuation of the lands belonging to the Crown and the Duchy of Lancashire. The official heading to this survey, which has been copied from the Ministers' Accounts of the Duchy of Lancaster, tells its own tale.

Kirk Ireton Parwich and Hognaston and of the Mannor of Ireton Wood & of the Members thereof viz.) Blackwall & Hayes and of the Mannor of Bonsall & a Hamlett thereunto belonging called Slaley And of the Mannor of Brassington All lying in the sayd Countie of Derby and then belonging to the Crowne did compound with the King to make their ffines certaine And to have and use divers other priviledges And for the Quiett setling of the same they had a Decree in the Dutchy Cort to confirme their Customes And by the Decree and their own consent they were Ordered to pay Thirtie ffive Yeares Cheif and Auntient Rent for the same The Moitie whereof they were to pay within Three Monthes after the Decree was passed which they did accordingly pay And the other Mojtie they were to pay within Three Months next after the Decree should bee confirmed by Act of Parlyament unto them which is not yett done And those only that payd their Composicion whose names are in Scedule annexed unto the Decree were to have the benifitt of the Decree and the other Copyholders were to have none And by this Decree (which is inrouled with the Auditor) They were Ordered to pay for their whole composicion
