edge and the greater part of the head of the cross with a small portion of the foliated foot are visible. The head consists of a trifoliated cross within a circle, the spaces between the arms being filled with penannular ornaments. The whole is a good example of late geometrical ornamentation. In the absence of any clue to identification it would be idle to speculate whose grave the slab once covered, but doubtless it was one of the lords of Willington in the fourteenth century. The broken pieces have been fastened together and fixed in the recently-built porch.
