Systematic List.

Carrion-Crow. Corvus c. corone. Two shot in the act of killing six weeks old Leghorn chicks (H.J.W.); Winter roost as usual in Radbourne Rough (W.K.M.).

Rook, Corvus f. frugilegus. From 20th December to 22nd February none roosted at the Parwich Hall rookery, but were frequently present in the daytime, assembling in the evening and flying to roost at Alsop-en-le-Dale. On 23rd April pellets were found under the roosting trees, composed of vegetable matter, stones and beetle elytra (C.L.C.); Returned to rookery 3rd March, 51 nests (69 in 1941), Bretby (H.J.W.); First egg 20th March (same as 1941), Heath Wood, Foremark (R.S.F.C.); 270 and 271 nests in the two main rookeries; a third has gradually grown to 45 nests, Radbourne (W.K.M.).

Magpie, Pica p. pica. Increase reported in many places.

Jay, Garrulus glandarius rufitergum. Two at Hoon in October; not seen here previously (C.M.B.).

Goldfinch, Carduelis c. britannica. One Buxton 7th February and 5th April (R.C.M.); a few Foremark 18th April (C.H.); one nest Bretby (H.J.W.); absent from the Ashbourne district until mid-summer (K.H.); probably nests at Hathersage (R.C.); one, 25th October and 10th November, Radbourne (W.K.M.).

Siskin, Carduelis spinus. Twelve, 18th January, Allestree (S.W.).

Bullfinch, *Pyrrhula p. pyrrhula*. One, Buxton, 8th February and subsequently (R.C.M.).

Hawfinch, Coccothrautses c. coccothraustes. 12th April and 9th August, Buxton (R.C.M.); one, 18th April, Foremark (C.H.); nest and two young in a holly, Kedleston Road, Derby (H.C.); single birds and small parties, December, 1941 to mid-April, 1942, Ashbourne district (K.H.); one male, 29th March, Allestree, two, Littleover, one, Duffield Road, Derby, 16th April (S.W.); none during the winter, Radbourne (W.K.M.).

Mealy-Redpoll, Carduelis f. flammes. One, feeding on

willowherb seeds, 26th January, Clifton (K.H.).

Lesser Redpoll, Carduelis linaria cabaret. Few in centre of Buxton, June (A.E.J.).

Meadow-Pipit, Anthus pratensis. 29th March, Buxton

(R.C.M.).

Twite, Carduelis fl. pipilans. Nest with one young and two addled eggs, 12th June, Buxton (R.C.M.).

Crossbil, Loxia c. curvirostra. About twelve flying south-west, 7th September, Buxton (R.C.M.); 22nd November, fifty, Grindleford (R.C.).

Corn-Bunting, Emberiza c. calandra. 17th May

Winter (R.E.).

Yellow-Bunting, *Emberiza c. citrinella*. Very abundant; twelve nests found within three miles of Repton (R.S.F.C.)

Cirl-Bunting, Emberiza c. cirlus. Nest and four eggs,

12th June, Melbourne (H.J.W.).

Tree-Sparrow, Passer m. montanus. More abundant than generally supposed; nested at Bretby, Ticknall, Foremark, Newton Solney (H.J.W.); a few breeding pairs; two in nest boxes at Repton (R.S.F.C.); a pair nested in a box but deserted the young; both birds fed the young, Radbourne (W.K.M.).

Yellow-Wagtail, Motacilla flava rayi. Five nesting pairs within a mile of Parwich village compared with eight in 1941 (C.L.C.); none in usual locality Newton Solney (C.H.); not so abundant as usual (R.S.F.C.);

increase maintained in North Derbyshire (R.C.).

Whinchat, *Saxicola r. rubetra*. Appeared to be well distributed this year (R.C.); increasing, Repton district (R.S.F.C.).

Dipper, Cinclus c. gularis. Nested in old nest repaired, 13th April, Buxton (R.C.M.), faeces in pool below next (R.C.).

Ring Ouzel, *Turdus t. torquatus*. One singing, 29th March, Buxton. On 2nd May, 1942 I found a 1941 nest containing bits of 1941 egg shells. On 10th May it had been relined and contained two eggs which on 13th May were deserted; I removed them and four more were laid and hatched; on 20th June this pair had built another nest with five eggs six yards from the nest used in 1941 and 1942, four of which were reared (R.C.M.); several pairs, June, Axe Edge and Goyt (A.E.J.); none in the spring but two on 14th August, Abney Moor (H.C.B.B.). Several passing through Markeaton, 26th March (R.E.).

Redstart, *Phoenicurus p. phoenicurus*. Three pairs, June, Axe Edge and Goyt (A.E.J.).

Black-Redstart, *Phoenicurus ochrurus gibraltariensis*. One male 30th June, on ruined building in centre of Sheffield (C.H.W.).

Common-Whitethroat, Sylvia c. communis. Decreasing; five nests found compared with ten in 1941 (R.S.F.C.); less abundant (H.J.W.; W.K.M.).

Reed-Warbler, Acrocephalus s. scirpaceus. Increasing (R.S.F.C.).

Blackbird, *Turdus m. merula*. Nest with six eggs, 24th May, near Sheffield (C.H.W.).

Starling, *Sturnus v. vulgaris*. The roost in Hilton Gorse was used in August, September, until middle October, when they left (C.M.B.).

Willow-Tit, Parus a. kleinschmidti. One, 10th January, Parwich (C.L.C.); bred at Radbourne (W.K.M.).

Longtailed-Tit, Ægithalos caudatus roseus. Families seen in the autumn, Radbourne and Sudbury, but has not vet recovered to former numbers (W.K.M.).

Goldcrest, Regulus r. anglorum. 24th February, Buxton (R.C.M.); 11th June, Windley, 30th March,

Sudbury, none at Radbourne (W.K.M.).

Nuthatch, Sitta europoea affinis. Definite increase in numbers in recent years. Nested at Calton, Bretby, Foremark, Calke and Melbourne (H.J.W.); nested at Allestree (S.W.); increase to three pairs Sudbury, two pairs as usual Radbourne (W.K.M.).

Redbacked-Shrike, Lanius c. collurio. As in 1941 a pair reared young at Cromford. Another pair seen at

Matlock Bath (R.E.).

Pied-Flycatcher, Musicapa h. hypoleuca. One female, 13th May, Hulland Ward (W.K.M.).

Nightjar, Caprimulgus e. europoeus. Nested at Repton

(H.J.W.).

Shorteared-Owl, Asio f. flammeus. Very much on the increase; six pairs probably nested, three lots of young seen, Derwent (E.H.P.); two pairs throughout the nesting season in a district which definitely indicates an extension of range (C.H.W.); none in Via Gellia and on Matlock Moor where they were in 1941 (R.E.).

Tawny-Owl, Strix aluco sylvatica. Increased, Rad-

bourne (W.K.M.).

Black-Grouse, Lyrurus tetrix britannicus. 24th February, Buxton (R.C.M.); one old cock and two old hens, August; an old hen shot on 14th August had four eggs in her, Abney Moor (H.C.B.B.).

Red-Grouse, Lagopus s. scoticus. A very good breeding season, Derwent (E.H.P.); twelve dead grouse, Whitsun-

tide, Kinderscout (R.E.).

Partridge, *Perdix p. perdix*. Paired, 31st January, Radbourne. Considerable increase in numbers reported generally. It seems, therefore, that the artificial manures used in 1942 do not harm them (W.K.M.).

Redlegged-Partridge, *Alectoris r. rufa*. One strong covey between Cubley and Alkmonton (L.M.W.).

Kestrel, Falco t. tinnumculus. Increasing in numbers (R.S.F.C.).

Merlin, Falco columbarius oesalon. A pair, 31st May, Buxton (R.C.M.). Several on Abney Moor (H.C.B.B.).

Common Buzzard, Buteo b. buteo. One in August and September, Derwent (E.H.P.); one male from 14th November, 1941 until 8th March, 1942 when it was killed by a dog when it was feeding on the ground, Melbourne (H.J.W.).

Sparrow-Hawk, Accipiter n. nisus. A pair roosted on the house eaves, Hoon; were often mobbed by large flocks of starlings (C.M.B.); less prevalent than in 1941; ten nests found (R.S.F.C.); nest and four eggs twenty yards from and three feet higher than nest photographed in 1941; this 1942 nest was robbed, Radbourne (S.W.).

Montagu's Harrier, *Circus pygargus*. One 12th and 24th June, 5th July, Goyt Moss (R.C.M.); one, unidentified but a female by the size, 28th August, Derwent (E.H.P.).

Peregrine, Falco p. peregrinus. A tiercel, 29th November, River Dove (K.H.).

Geese. Flying over Parwich at 11-30 p.m. 12th January (C.L.C.); Flying over Buxton district 27th September (R.C.M.).

Teal, *Anas c. crecca*. 20th March, passing over Buxton (R.C.M.); Bred near Hathersage (R.C.).

Wigeon, Anas penelope. One pair, 21st March, Allestree (S.W.); two drake, one of which was immature, 23rd November, Osmaston (K.H.).

Tufted-Duck, Nyroca fuligula. Fourteen pairs, 21st March; four pairs 29th March; up to twelve pairs until 10th June; absent until 7th July; did not breed, Allestree (S.W.); two pairs throughout the spring and summer, did not breed, Sudbury (W.K.M.); three immature, 14th September, Monsal Dale (R.C.M.); forty, 8th to 22nd February, near Burton-on-Trent (C.H.); over

100 at Ingleby (H.J.W.); one, 3rd March, Spring Gardens, Buxton (W.S.).

Pintail, *Dafila a. acuta*. One drake, winter plumage, 23rd November, Osmaston (K.H.).

Shoveller, Spatula clypeata. One, 13th February, Drakelowe (C.H.).

Pochard, Nyroca f. ferina. Four drakes, 6th January and 23rd November, Osmaston; one, 23rd March, Ednaston (K.H.); one drake, 30th March, Sudbury (W.K.M.).

Goosander, Mergus merganser merganser. A pair, March, Howden Dam, not previously seen here (E.H.P.); one female, 11th February, Wortley (C.H.W.).

Great Crested-Grebe, *Podiceps c. cristatus*. Four, 4th October, Coombes Reservoir (R.C.M.); two pairs, 18th April, Melbourne (C.H.); one pair, 28th May, Kedleston, arrived, 23rd March, Melbourne (H.J.W.); two, 2nd May, Coombes Reservoir (W.S.); three pairs, 25th April, one pair 7th September, Melbourne (H.C.); one pair during the summer, did not breed, Osmaston (K.H.); one male arrived, 1st April, and called at night until 14th May, when a pair arrived. The latter did not breed and left on 19th June. The odd male left 10th August, Allestree (S.W.); one male, 23rd March, female 30th March, Sudbury (W.K.M.).

Little-Grebe, *Podiceps r. ruficollis*. One, in hard weather, for two or three weeks, Spring Gardens, Buxton (W.S.).

Rednecked-Grebe, *Podiceps g. griseigena*. One, found dead, 27th January, Eyam (R.C.).

Green-Plover, Vanellus vanellus. 15th March, on lower slopes, Buxton (R.C.M.); Many hundreds, 6th July, Sudbury (C.H.); 8th March, Longshaw (R.C.); 3rd March, returned to nesting ground, Burton-on-Trent district (C.H.).

Golden-Plover, Pluvialis a. apricaria. 15th March,

calling on hill-tops, Buxton (R.C.M.); 13th March, six, Hoon (C.M.B.); very scarce in 1941 and 1942, Derwent (E.H.P.); the usual flock of about fifty arrived in the middle of February; heavy snow fell and all left; only a few pairs bred, usually twenty to thirty pairs, Abney Moor (H.C.B.B.); four, 7th January, Sturston (K.H.); large flock flying over Allestree at night, 18th March (S.W.).

Dunlin, *Calidris a. schinzii*. Only one pair, usually about a dozen, Derwent (E.H.P.); two black-breasted birds, 30th April, Ashbourne Hall Pond (K.H.).

Common-Snipe, Capella g. gallinago. One, 21st February, Spring Gardens, Buxton (W.S.); Returned to nesting ground 15th March, Bretby (H.J.W.).

Green-Sandpiper, *Tringa ochropus*. Two, December, 1941 and January, 1942, Cubley (K.H.); one 12th October, Sudbury (W.K.M.); one, 15th November, Hungry Bentley (K.H.).

Redshank, T. t. Britannica. None breeding in their usual place Hoon (C.M.B.); Newton Solney (C.H.); 5th February, Derby (R.E.); returned to nesting ground 21st March, Bretby (H.J.W.); nested at Swarkestone Bridge, three yards from the nest of Green-Plover (R.S.F.C.); one, 14th March, Norbury (K.H.); 15th March, Barton Blount (W.K.M.); 30th March, Hilton Brook (C.M.B.).

Woodcock, *Scolopax r. rusticola*. Two pairs in April and two birds in August, Abney Moor (H.C.B.B.); bred near Rowsley (R.E.).

Curlew, *Numenius a. arquata*. A lot this season, Derwent (E.H.P.); The young from a nest at 575 feet were moved to the highest ground in the vicinity a few days after hatching, Parwich (C.L.C.); nested at Repton, Twyford, Walton-on-Trent, Willington and Swarkestone (R.S.F.C.); and (H.J.W.); about the usual number nested Abney Moor (H.C.B.B.); again present during the spring, Atlow Rough (K.H.); 5th February, Derby (R.E.).

Herring-Gull, Larus a. argentatus. One, immature,

11th February, Hoon (C.M.B.).

Common-Gull, Larus c. canus. One adult, 22nd January, 11 adults, 8th, one adult 16th November, Ashbourne; two, probably more, 19th July, north Staffs. border (K.H.).

Blackheaded-Gull, *Larus r. ridibundus*. Nineteen, 11th February, Hoon (C.M.B.); at a gullery near Baslow, not reported of recent years, there were about a dozen pairs and five nests were found. At one time there were over a hundred nests (H.C.B.B.); about ninety pairs nesting at Spondon (R.S.F.C.).

Lesser Blackbacked-Gull, Larus fuscus graellsi. Two, probably of this species, flying north-west over Parwich

(C.L.C.); one, 19th October, Kingsmills (R.E.).

Cormorant, *Phalacrocorax c. carbo*. One, for two weeks in August, on the Derwent between Darley Dale and Rowsley (R.E.).

Heron, Ardea c. cinerea. 27 nests, Calke Abbey

(H.J.W.).

Common-Tern, Sterna h. hirundo. Over Dunstall, Staffs., 2nd September (C.C.).

Little-Auk, Alle alle. On canal, Dunstall, 17th Novem-

ber (C.C.).

Spoonbill, *Platalea i. leucorodia*. Three, flying southwest over Lea, Whit Monday (R.E.).

Corncrake, *Crex crex*. One, 11th July, Hathersage (R.C.); one remained two weeks from 16th May, Cromford (R.E.); one at Willington (H.J.W.); either side Trent, S. of Burton (C.C.).

Quail, Coturnix c. coturnix. One, 23rd June, Parwich

(C.L.C.).
