Burton Wold Solar Farm Northamptonshire: Site C

Desk Based Assessment

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Non – Technical Summary

In April 2014 Archaeology Wales was commissioned by Joanna Berlyn of Stratus Environmental Ltd. to carry out an archaeological desk-based assessment of a proposed solar farm on land to the south of Cranford St John, Kettering, Northamptonshire (NGR SP 92584 76429) as part of a planning application.

No designated historic landscape areas, Listed Buildings or Scheduled Ancient Monuments lie within the bounds of the proposed development. The villages of Cranford St John and Cranford St Andrew both lie within Conservation Areas and have a large number of listed buildings.

The regional Historic Environment Record lists 368 sites, events, find spots and listed buildings within the 2km search area under 59 group numbers, and the National Monuments Record lists 29 sites. None of these lie within the area of proposed development.

The site is currently used for pasture and although was enclosed in the early 19th century it was part of an older strip field system established prior to 1628. The area around the site was quarried extensively for both limestone and ironstone from the mid 19th century until the mid 20th century. In the 1950s and 60s the southern half of the site was cut away creating an artificial south facing slope bounded by a 7m to 10m quarry face.

Although there is a number of Roman finds and sites in the area, it is considered that there is low potential for as yet unrecorded archaeological remains to be present on the site. These remains, should they exist, may be affected by likely groundworks associated with the proposed development. It is therefore recommended that archaeological monitoring takes places during ground works on the northern half of the site.

1 Introduction

- 1.1 In April 2014 Archaeology Wales (AW) was commissioned by Joanna Berlyn of Stratus Environmental Ltd, to carry out an archaeological Desk-Based Assessment of a proposed solar farm on land to the south of Cranford St John, Kettering, Northamptonshire (SP 92584 76429, Figure 1, AW Project Number 2228).
- 1.2 The assessment is being undertaken for a planning application.
- 1.3 The purpose of the Desk-Based Assessment is to assess the impact of the proposed solar farm for a planning application. The aim, as set out in the following report, is to provide Status Environmental Ltd. with the information they are likely to need to make a decision on where to place the solar arrays and the visual impact the development may have in heritage assets in the area. This work is to highlight standing and buried remains of potential archaeological interest to ensure that they are fully investigated and recorded if they are disturbed or revealed as a result of any subsequent activities associated with the development.
- 1.4 The proposed development comprises plans for the construction of a south facing solar farm on a site (Site C) to the south of Cranford St John, Kettering, Northamptonshire (henceforth the site), currently divided into three fields and in use as a farm land laid out to pasture.

2 Site C Description

- 2.1 The site, centred on NRG SP 92584 76429, covers an area of approximately 16.42 hectares and lies 6km to the southeast of Kettering and 0.5km to the south of the village of Cranford St John Northamptonshire, separated by the A14 trunk road. It is formed of three fields which are currently used as pasture with no standing structures or buildings. Mature hawthorn hedgerows bound the site to the east and south while the north and west are contained by intermittent wire fencing and hedges. The site lies in a landscape that is bounded to the south by a 7 to 10m tall escarpment created through quarrying and to the east by the Cranford Landfill Site. The west and north limits are bounded by tracks and then the A14.
- 2.2 The northern half of the site is relatively level but the south has been quarried and has left a south facing slope bounded by the guarry face.
- 2.3 The site lies in a rural landscape to the west of the Cranford Landfill Site and is overlooked by the modern screening embankment of the site. There is not a direct line of sight from the villages of Cranford St John or Cranford St Andrew although a few chimneys from the houses can be seen from the site.
- 2.4 The site lies on Northampton Sand Formation Ironstone, Ooidal bedrock, overlain with mixed clay. A small patch of Blisworth Limestone Formation may survive in the south east of the site (BGS 2014).

3 Methodology

- 3.1 The methodology for this desk-based assessment follows that set out in the specification.
- 3.2 The primary objective is to assess the impact of the development proposals on the historic environment. This will inform design solutions and potential mitigation strategies for the detailed design for the planning permission. The aim is to make full and effective use of existing information in establishing the archaeological significance of the site, to elucidate the presence or absence of archaeological material, its character, distribution, extent, condition and relative significance.
- 3.3 The work includes a comprehensive assessment of regional context within which the archaeological evidence rests and aims to highlight any relevant research issues within national and regional research frameworks.
- 3.4 This report provides information of sufficient detail to allow informed planning decisions to be made which can safeguard the archaeological resource. Preservation in situ has been advocated where at all possible, but where engineering or other factors result in loss of archaeological deposits, preservation by record has been recommended.
- 3.5 This assessment considers the following:
 - a) The nature, extent and degree of survival of archaeological sites, structures, deposits and landscapes within the study area through assessment of various readily available primary sources:
 - Collation and assessment of all relevant information held in the regional HER at Northampton, including listed building records, within 2km radius of assessment area.
 - Assessment of all available excavation report and archives including unpublished and unprocessed material affecting the site and its setting.
 - Assessment of all relevant extant aerial photographic (AP) evidence.
 - All sources indexed in the County Archive
 - Records held by the developer e.g. bore hole logs, geological/geomorphological information, aerial photographs, maps, plans
 - Map regression analysis using all relevant cartographic sources e.g. All editions of the Ordnance Survey County Series, Tithe and early estate maps (as available).
 - Internet sourced satellite imagery
 - Historic documents (e.g. Charters, registers, estate papers).
 - b) The significance of any remains in their context both regionally and nationally and in light of the findings of the desk based study.
- 3.6 This work conforms to the Standard and Guidance for Archaeological Desk Based Assessment, as produced by the Institute for Archaeologists (IfA 2011).

4 Archaeological and Historical Background

4.1 Previous archaeological studies

- 4.1.1 No previous archaeological studies encompassing the site of the proposed development are recorded on the HER. However, several such studies are recorded within the 2km search area.
- 4.1.2 There have been few archaeological investigations undertaken close to the site, although field walking ahead of the construction of the A14 brought to light several unknown scatters of Roman and other material. Much of the previous work has tended to concentrate on building recording and landscape surveys to the north of the sites in the villages of Cranford St Andrew and Cranford St John.
- 4.1.3 There have also been a series of investigations at the site of Burton Wold Wind Farm some 2km to the southwest, which include Desk-Based Assessments, archaeological watching briefs, geophysical survey and archaeological evaluations. The work there has identified an emerging Roman agricultural landscape of settlements and enclosures.
- 4.1.4 The Single Onshore Borehole Index (SOBI 2014), as displayed by the British Geological Survey, has been examined. A row of seven boreholes were sunk in the 1930s along the eastern boundary of the site to search for Ironstone deposits (SP97NW171-177) and do not record the superficial deposits. Between 12ft to 18ft (3.6 to 5.4m) of limestone sat above clay with the top of the Ironstone being reached at 42ft to 47ft (12.8 to 14.3m). The pattern changes for the two northern boreholes (SP97NW176 and 177): the Ironstone is still at a similar depth but the strata become more complex with greater variation between them (although they are simply recorded as hard of soft). Two more boreholes were sunk in the northwest and west corners of the site (SP97NW181 and 182) as part of the same series. These both record a depth of at least 24ft (7.31m) and 35ft (10.69m) of limestone before hitting clay. Three more were sunk along what is now the top of the quarry face in the southwest and south limit of the site but only give the depth of the ironstone and none of the deposits overlying it.

4.2 The Historic Landscape

- 4.2.1 The proposed development falls within the Historic Landscape Character Area of Reinstated Mineral Extraction 8b the Lowick-Finedon Valley Side. Key characteristics are:
 - Large irregular field set among a wider 20th century fieldscape
 - Some land re-used as recreational facilities and land fill sites
 - Some historic woodland and parkland
 - Scarce ridge and furrow or other earthwork monuments
 - Frequent railways
- 4.2.2 The proposed development does not lie within any conservation areas, however Cranford Conservation Area has its limits 400m to the north of the site and lies entirely within the 2km search zone.

- 4.2.3 No further designated historic landscape or historic conservation areas lie within 2km of the proposed Site C (see Figure 2). However there are several Historic Parks and Gardens in the wider local area. Wickstead Park (Grade II) lies 4.7km to the west of the site, Boughton House (Grade I) Parks and Gardens 3.7km to the northwest, Drayton House (Grade I) 5.4km to the northeast and Great Harrowden Hall (Grade II*) 6.7km to the southwest.
- 4.2.4 The exposed quarry face has been designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest for its geology.

4.3 Scheduled Ancient Monuments

- 4.3.1 There are no Scheduled Monuments (SMs) within a 2km radius of the proposed site (see Figure 2).
- 4.3.2 The closest SMs are Barton Seagrove deserted village 4km to the west of the site, Three Hill Round Barrows 4.6km to the southeast of the site, Crow Hill Iron Age Hill Fort 5.8km to the southeast, and Slipton Lodge Moated Site 5.4km to the north. None of the SMs can be seen from the site nor is the site visible from them.

4.4 Listed Buildings

- 4.4.1 There are 40 listed buildings within the 2km search area (Figure 2), all of which are described in more detail in Appendix I. They include a range of structures, mainly limestone built houses and cottages from the 17th to 19th centuries. 4 are Grade II* while the rest are Grade II. All but two of the buildings lie within Cranford Conservation Area.
- 4.4.2 Three places of worship are listed. These include the parish churches of St John (650m to the north of the site) and St Andrew (840m north) as well as a Baptist chapel (530m north). The churches have 12th century origins with later 15th and 16th century additions. The Church of St Andrew was altered and restored in the 1840s while the Church of St John was restored and extended in the 1880s. The Baptist chapel dates from 1834.

4.5 Known archaeological remains and historical development

- 4.5.1 There are 368 sites or events listed on the HER within a 2km radius of the centre of the proposed development site. None are recorded within the bounds of the Site C itself. The full catalogue provided by Northamptonshire HER is included with an abridged table of SMR group numbers in the rear of this report (Figure 3, Appendix II). The sites are briefly described below, according to period, where they are incorporated in a summary of the historical development of the area.
- 4.5.2 There are twenty-nine sites listed on the National Record of the Historic Environment (NRHE) maintained by English Heritage (EH) within the 2km search area. Nineteen of these are duplicates of the HER records. None of these sites are recorded within the bounds of the development area. Information from the NRHE is included as an appendix in the rear of this report (Appendix III).

Early Prehistoric (c. 10,000-c.800CE)

- 4.5.3 There has been a human presence in the area of the site since the Mesolithic period. Small scale flint scatters have been recorded in the Ise Valley to the south of Burton Latimer and woodland clearance, carbon dated to the late Mesolithic or early Neolithic, has been located to the 3km west of the site (NHER 8077).
- 4.5.4 The earliest evidence for human activity in the vicinity of the site is a group of Bronze Age cremations discovered during ironstone mining 1845 and 1923 to the northeast of the site. Among this collection are two 'Saxon' cremations which are likely to have been misclassified at the time of discovery or are historic duplicates (HER 1938).

Iron Age (c.800CE-AD43)

- 4.5.5 The greater part of the known archaeological evidence from the area dates from the late Iron Age and Roman period. These take the form of enclosures and possible droveways or roads observed in aerial photographs and through geophysical survey. Excavations dug ahead of the construction of the Burton Wold wind farm and others investigations carried out in the area have concluded that it was a pastoralist landscape and there is evidence for relatively intensive settlement. Site HER 2162 was thought to have been a Bronze Age round barrow some 30m in diameter, but geophysical investigation has concluded that it is now likely to be large, late Iron Age round house sitting within a D-shaped settlement.
- 4.5.6 There are several more large and complex enclosures, many of quite a substantial size. HER 8316 is over 100m long by 85m wide and contains a number of circular structures which are likely to be round houses.

Roman (AD 43 - c. AD 410)

- 4.5.7 There is widespread evidence for Roman settlement in the area, usually in the form of cropmarks, but some excavation has taken place. Most of the evidence of Roman settlement comes from the excavation carried out at Burton Wold Wind Farm, 1.6km to the southwest of the site (HER 5319) but also from the recent excavations at Higham Road in Burton Latimer (HER 1920) 3km from the site. A settlement was established in the late 2nd century AD and remained in use until the late 4th century AD. As well as evidence of metal working and quarrying, the site was primarily an agricultural settlement with smaller enclosures and trackways linking them. There was a densely pack area of stones which formed the foundations to a substantial building, other evidence of buildings were limited to drip gullies.
- 4.5.8 Although agriculture was being carried out to the south of the site, it is probably that the north of the site was still relatively heavily wooded. Rockingham Forest covered a large part of the land to the north. However, the scattered corpmarks of enclosures and settlements seen in aerial photographs suggests that there was some clearance for agriculture.

Early Medieval (c. AD 410 - AD 1080)

4.5.9 There is little evidence of an Early Medieval presence in the locale. Whilst the twin villages of Cranford St John and Cranford St Andrew have Saxon origins little else has been identified from this period.

4.5.10 Cranford is mentioned in the Domesday Book of 1086 as two large, established manors but no verified Saxon remains have been located within either of the villages. In 1066 the owner of both was the Abbey of Peterborough, St Peter. The manors had a significant number of freemen but were not wealthy with the main industry being agriculture.

Medieval (1086 - 1540)

- 4.5.11 By the time of Domesday, the manors Cranford had been divided into 4 separate manors. There is no clear definition in which parish the manors were located as tenants held lands in both, but four separate holdings are mentioned. Two remained under the ownership of Peterborough Abbey, a third held by the Bishop of Coutances and the forth by Guy de Reinbuecurt (who also held Barton Latimer). The value of the land had risen significantly and could indicate that improvements in farming had come about, or that more land was under the plough.
- 4.5.12 The church of Cranford St Andrew is of late 12th century date with later editions but there are few medieval sites within the search area. A series of fishponds and earthworks in the northwest of the village may date from this period and could be the remnants of the medieval village.
- 4.5.13 Surrounding the sites are the fossilised remains of ridge and furrow but much has been masked by later agricultural and industrial practices.
- 4.5.14 A series of possible charcoal production sites have been observed through aerial photography to the south of the site. These are undated but as the Wold would once have been wooded it is possible that these sites may date from the medieval period or earlier.

Post-medieval (1536 - 1899)

- 4.5.15 The villages of Cranford St Andrew and Cranford St John have an abundance of post medieval buildings, many of which have been listed. The main building material tends to be limestone rubble collected from the quarries in the area. One of the earliest is the Manor House is dated 1629 but may have earlier origins.
- 4.5.16 Cranford Hall and Woodford Hall, with their accompanying parks were developed from the mid 18th Century, with later remodelling in the early 19th century. They reflect a period of British history that encouraged the gentrification of the landscape. Part of this process was the enclosure of previously open fields and the creation of designed views across the landscape. Whilst enclosure did happen in the early 1800s, there is little evidence to suggest that either Hall made a deliberate choice to affect their settings
- 4.5.17 Several roads are known to have been constructed during this period. The Peterborough to Wellingborough Turnpike (modern A510) was constructed in the mid 1700s.
- 4.5.18 The land surrounding the village was enclosed by private parliamentary acts in the early 1800s. There was also a period of land improvement with the introduction of field drains to the clay soils of the Wold which continued into the 20th century. However, it was also a period that saw greater industrialisation in the area. The landscape had been quarried and mined since the Roman period but the arrival

4.5.19 of the railway in 1866 (HER 7813) increased the intensity of production and brought down the price of shipping which in turn opened up new markets. During the latter half of the 19th century quarries for both ironstone and limestone were opened up across the area. Many (HER 8456, 8457, 8458, etc) had a significant amount of infrastructure in place with engine sheds, and tramways but some of them were also short lived.

Modern (c.1900 -)

- 4.5.20 Most of the sites recorded from the Modern period continue with the quarrying and associated industrial activity from the 1860s onwards.
- 4.5.21 In 1975 an excavation of a German WW2 bomber shot down in 1942, revealed an unexploded bomb with three more coming to light in 1993 (site 20). The crash site of a Halifax III plane that came down in 1945 (site 24)

Cropmarks

4.5.22 It should be mentioned that numerous cropmarks have been observed in the locale which have been recorded but have not been further investigated so their provenance cannot be fully ascertained at this point. It is possible that some relate to either mineral extraction or clay quarrying which has been carried out since the Roman period. This does not negate their archaeological value, merely shows the possible bias when recording landscapes of a rural appearance.

Quarrying

4.5.23 Across the search areas there are small quarries recorded on some maps or in the regional HER but no dates of operation are known. Some of these to the north of the site have been formally recorded as part of the Rockingham Forest Project (e.g. site 26) but others have yet to be examined.

5 Map Regression

5.1 A Map of the Manor of Cranford 1748 (Figure 4)

5.1.1 The map shows the entire site within its 18th century landscape including the strip fields in the south of the manor and the enclosed fields in the north. The site lay in the Middle Field (which were documented by 1628 Hall 1995: 240) and lay across seven furlongs. The north of the site lay across Carroot Garden and Pen-hedge, the east had Church headland and Shooting up to Thingdon Way with the southwest edge lying in Lang. The central part of the site is taken with Parker Close. A trackway, leading to the south and following the east boundary on to Burton Wold. No buildings are recorded within the site boundary

5.2 Ordnance Survey Original Survey Drawing 1817 (Figure 5)

5.2.1 One of the first maps to depict the layout of the field encompassing the site is the Ordnance Survey original surveyors' map drawn up in the early 19th century. The map of this area is dated 1817 and shows an agricultural landscape of fields and dispersed farmsteads.

5.2.2 The site area is shown with the field boundaries similar to those seen on the 1748 map suggesting that the enclosed landscape had formalised existing outer field boundaries as well merging the small headlands. The north-south trackway has not been recorded but a boundary line runs along the length of it.

5.3 Ordnance Survey 1834 (Figure 6)

5.3.1 This map is the formalised version of the original surveyor's map. The map has few details and no field boundaries are shown, however the trackway seen on the 1748 map has been restored, or recorded and leads to Cranford Field.

5.4 1st edition Ordnance Survey 1885 1: 10,560 (Figure 7)

- 5.5.1 The site lies in enclosed agricultural ground with the village of Cranford St John to the north. The railway has been cut through the land to the north of the site and there are a series of tramways running across to the east and west of the site associated with the guarrying industry.
- 5.5.2 The trackway seen in the 1748 map runs along the central part for the site following field edges. Parker Close (from 1748) is retained as a separate field although the western half has been truncated by a newer field boundary.

5.6 2nd edition Ordnance Survey map 1901 1: 10,560 (Figure 8)

- 5.6.1 At the start of the 20th century there is no apparent change in the immediate vicinity of the site. The only change indicated on the 1901 is the extension of the quarry to the east of the site .
- 5.6.2 In the wider landscape the fields and villages continue to follow the established pattern without any major changes.

5.7 Ordnance Survey 1927 1: 10,560

5.7.1 No change

5.8 Provisional edition Ordnance Survey 1938 1: 10,560

5.8.1 No change

5.9 Ordnance Survey 1958 1: 10,560

5.9.1 Although individual fields are not shown the site appears unchanged but shows the encroaching ironstone quarry from the east.

5.10 Ordnance Survey 1975 1: 10,000

5.10.1 The site has been truncated northwest to southeast by a quarry during the period from the last map which swings round the southern end of the site.

5.11 Ordnance Survey 1986 1: 10,000

5.11.1 No internal field boundaries are marked.

5.12 Ordnance Survey 1995 1: 10,000

5.12.1 Site is same a present map.

6 Aerial Photographs

- 6.1 Several aerial photographs covering the general site area were examined but in general the aerial photographs concentrate on the quarries to the north of the site or at such a distance as to obscure any specific features within the site. Perhaps the clearest photograph of the site was taken in 1946 by the RAF (Photo 1). It shows the area as depicted on the 1946 and 1958 maps with the quarry as yet uncut and a clear line of the tramway running from the existing quarry towards the railway line at Cranford St John.
- 6.2 Within the site boundary, the fossilised remnants of ridge and furrow following the same pattern as Ing Furlong shown on the 1748 map are visible. No other archaeological remains are visible.

7 Site Visit

- 7.1 A site visit was undertaken on the 14th April 2014. Conditions were initially overcast improving to bright and dry. Each field was visited with the perimeter being walked to ascertain that no features were visible in the hedgerows. The hedge and trees had only light leaf cover which did not greatly hinder the views across the landscape.
- 7.2 Site C occupies ground with a slight rise up to the south (Photos 2 and 3) which then drops away at the crest of the hill to a gentle slope into the bottom of the old quarry. The northern half of the site is relatively level but shows signs of past disturbance (Photo 4).
- 7.3 The quarry faces north east with the ground to the south being level, suggesting that the original ground surface was also fairly level (Photo 5)
- 7.4 From the top of the escarpment for the quarry, looking north and east, a light scar can be seen running the length of the western field. This is likely to have been the original ground surface before the quarry came into operation (Photo 6).
- 7.5 Photo 7 was taken looking south towards the site across Cranford St John. The houses in the village are below the line of the trees and do not have a direct view of the site.
- 7.6 The only listed building that can be seen from the site is the chimney of the Red Lion (Grade II) in the village of Cranford St John (Photo 8)
- 7.7 The other sites under consideration for solar farms (Site A & Site B) are not visible (Photos 5 and 8). The Round House (Grade II) can be seen, but only from the embankment of the landfill site to the east of the site approximately 5m above the highest point of the site
- 7.8 Woodford House and Park is not visible from the site as it is screened by the embankments of the Cranford Landfill Site (Photo 10).
- 7.9 No sites or features of archaeological interest were noted within the site but the possible remnants of the tramway marked on the 1887 map and seen in the 1945

aerial photograph could be seen on the ground in the eastern adjoining field as a slight north south aligned depression.

8 Visual Impact Assessment

The development has the potential to have an effect on the heritage assets and their settings. Potential effects on the heritage assets resulting from changes within their settings have been assessed and are described below. If there is no detailed description then any effects have been assessed as neutral. This will usually be on the basis of one of the following reasons:

- The asset is located within the ZVT but local condition such as woodland, topography
 or buildings mean that there would not be inter-visibility
- The change will not lead to and change to the significance of the asset, or the asset is of low or negligible importance

8.1 Scheduled Monuments

8.1.1 There are no scheduled monuments within 2km of the proposed solar farm.

8.2 Conservation Areas

- 8.2.1 The southern limit of Cranford Conservation area lies 0.5km to the north of the site. The village lies in a dip and is screened by established trees so does not have a line of sight to the development area although the chimneys of some buildings can be seen from the crest of the hill on the site (see Photo 7).
- 8.2.2 The overall effect of the proposals on the settings of Cranford Conservation will be no more than low given the fact there is not direct line of sight to the proposed development.

8.3 Registered Parks and Gardens

8.3.1 There are no registered parks or gardens within 2km of the proposed development site

8.4 Listed Buildings

- 8.4.1 Cranford Conservation Area is separated from the site by the A14. The settings of the buildings within the villages are in relationship to each other and the immediate surrounds rather than with the wider view. In addition, the density of buildings, along with the effect of trees and other vegetation means that the views towards the site are masked. With a maximum low change in setting, there will be no more than a negligible impact on any of the listed buildings in the village, leading to, at most, an overall minor effect.
- 8.4.2 Woodford House (1.7km to the east), Grade II, faces northwest and southeast. Its orientation and the dense woodland on southwest sides means that there will be no change in its setting
- 8.4.3 The Round House (1.8km to the southeast), a Grade II listed building, has a potential view to the topline of the site but is screened from the site by hedges and

plantations. Photo 9 was taken from the upper point of the Crandford Landfill Site embankment approximately 5 metres above the highest point of the development site and although building stands out against the skyline, the vista from the Round House towards the site is blurred by the topography, hedges and trees so the effects on its setting will be minor.

8.5 Other Sites

8.5.1 There are two other sites under the proposal: Site A, 1.9km to the southeast and Site B, 1.7km to the southwast. Parts of both sites fall within the ZTV for this site: Site A has significant coverage while Site B is limited to the northern limit. The sites though, are masked by landscape features such as the topography, hedges and trees so no clear line of site can be established.

9 Impact Assessment

9.1 Previous impacts

- 9.1.1 Research has suggested that the site was used as undeveloped agricultural land until the middle 20th century, when the Cranford East Quarry carved into the southern half of the site following the limestone. The activity removed 7 to 10 metres of material and left the escarpment visible on the site today.
- 9.1.2 The northern half of the site appears to have remained undeveloped throughout its known history but may have been disturbed during quarrying operations.

9.2 Potential impacts from proposed development

- 9.2.1 The final layout of the solar farm will be agreed through Condition following the granting of planning permission. The general area of solar panel deployment has been identified on the indicative layout. Mitigation measures, to be contained within a WSI, and Conditioned as part of any planning permission, will be informed by a detailed layout and method of construction.
- 9.2.2 Research has not identified any specific sites or features of archaeological interest within the bounds of the proposed development area. However, it clearly lies in an area relatively rich in prehistoric, Roman and medieval archaeological finds and sites. Therefore, there is a potential for as yet unrecorded finds and features of these periods to exist below ground. Any of the following activities associated with the proposed development could, therefore, have a negative impact on surviving archaeological remains:

9.2.3 Panels

The panels will be mounted onto posts and driven up to 1.5m in the ground. The standing height of the panels once erected would be 3m.

In areas of archaeological sensitivity the panels could be installed on floating concrete pads which would require a topsoil strip to approximately 0.20m.

9.2.4 Cabling

The rows of panels will be connected via the supporting racking limiting intrusive ground works. There will be a need for central trenches to link the panels to the invertor and the invertors to the substation, as well as a periphery cable circulating the wider site. The maximum depth of the cabling trenches will be 0.85m and .60m wide.

The layout of the cabling is not fixed and would be routed to avoid areas of archaeological sensitivity.

9.2.5 Invertors/Transformers

The site will require a number of invertors or transformers, currently 4 are expected to be constructed and their location is flexible within the site. They will be 8m x 3m x 2.5m high and will be positioned on concrete pads so will have minimal ground disturbance.

9.2.6 Substations

The site will have a substation that will measure $12m \times 4m \times 2.5m$ high. Their location within the site is flexible and the will be positioned on concrete pads to minimise impact on the historic landscape.

9.2.7 Access Tracks

Access to the site will be along existing tracks for the Burton Wold Wind Farm. New tracks will be required within the site, however, these can be routed to avoid archaeologically sensitive areas or constructed to 'float' on the existing ground level with minimal disturbance.

9.2.8 Landscaping

A programme of landscaping will be submitting with the application and will allow existing hedgerows to grow taller and plug any gaps.

10 Assessment of Archaeological Potential and Importance

10.1 Scheduled Monuments – High Importance

10.1.1 The nearest Scheduled Monument to the proposed development, the medieval deserted village at Barton Seagrove, lies 4km to the west of the site (see Figure 3). The Early Bronze Age round barrows at Three Hill are 4.6km to the southeast of the site and there are also a number of Iron Age or Roman sites, including Crow Hill Iron Age Fort that lie along the Nene Valley 5.8km to the southeast. The locations mean that all of these fall out of sight of the proposed development thus limiting the visual impact the development may have.

10.2 The Register of Parks and Gardens of Special Historic Interest in England

10.2.1 No Parks of Gardens fall within 2km of the proposed solar farm. The nearest is the Grade I garden and park (High Importance) at Boughton House a minimum of 3.7km to the northwest, Within 6km are the Grade I garden and park at Drayton House and the Grade II* park and garden at Great Horrowden Hall (both High Importance) and the Grade II garden and park Wickstead Park (Medium Importance). The limits of both Boughton House and Drayton House fall within the ZVT but screening by established trees and other landscaping means there is no line of sight between them.

10.3 Conservation Areas - Medium Importance

10.3.1 Cranford Conservation Area lies 400m to the north of the proposed development and wholly within that 2km search zone. There is no clear line of sight between it and the site and the construction of the solar farm is likely to have no impact either visually or physically.

10.4 Listed Buildings

10.4.1 Grade I and II* buildings are of High Importance and Grade II buildings are of medium importance. There are no listed buildings within the proposed solar farm area. There are 40 Listed Buildings within the 2km search area. Four are Grade II* while the rest are Grade II and most lie to the north within Cranford Conservation Area. To the southeast is the Grade II Round House on Thrapston Road (1.8km away). Woodford House (Grade II) stands 1.7km to the west.

10.5 Non-designated sites

10.5.1 The archaeological desk-based assessment has not identified any sites or features of archaeological significance within the bounds of the proposed development area. The work indicates that the site has consisted of undeveloped agricultural land throughout its history. Although remnants of the medieval field system might survive in the northern part of the site, it is also likely to have been disturbed when the quarry was in use during the 1950s and 60s.

Therefore, there is a low potential for as yet unrecorded archaeological finds, features and deposits to exist within the proposed development area.

10.6 Mitigation

10.6.1 Because of the potential for archaeological finds, features and deposits within the proposed development site, is recommended that an Archaeological Watching Brief be maintained during any ground-breaking works associated with the development in the northern part of the site.

11 Conclusions

11.1 The archaeological desk-based assessment determined that Cranford Conservation Area lies within the 2km search area drawn around the site. However, the proposed development is not considered likely to have a detrimental impact.

- 11.2 No Scheduled Monuments or Registered Parks or Gardens lie within the 2 km search area.
- 11.3 Forty Listed Buildings lie within the 2km search area. None of these sites lie within the bounds of the proposed development. Most lie in the villages of Cranford St John and Cranford St Andrew. Their setting, within a low valley, means there is no clear line of sight or inter-visibility with the site.
- 11.4 368 sites or events are recorded within the regional HER and 29 within the NRHE within the 2km search area. No sites are recorded within the limits of the proposed development, and no new sites were identified during the site visit.
- 11.5 The ridge and furrow, recorded from aerial photographs in the 1940s, has now been removed and no longer survives on site.
- 11.6 It is, therefore, concluded that there is no archaeological justification not to proceed with the proposed development of the site.
- 11.7 The area has relatively rich Late Iron Age and Roman archaeology with an emerging Roman agricultural landscape being pieced together to the south of the site. It is likely that throughout much of the medieval and post medieval period the site lay as undeveloped agricultural land. However, the Burton Wold plateau and its surroundings have been quarried for at least 100 years with ironstone and clay pits being backfilled with material from the next area to be quarried. It has, in effect, a well hidden industrial landscape.
- 11.8 Due to the prevalence of Iron Age and Roman archaeological remains within the surrounding area, there is the potential for further, as yet unrecorded finds, features and deposits of archaeological interest to exist within the site area. Given this potential, it is recommended that an archaeological watching brief is maintained during any ground-breaking activity associated with the proposed development in the northern section of the site.

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



Fig 1: Figure showing location of assessment area

Fig 2: Designated historic sites overlaid on ZTV map




Fig 3: Sites recorded on the HER (in purple) and NRHE (in blue) within the 2km search zone Where they identify the same feature, only the HER ref is labelled




Fig 5: Ordnance Survey original drawing of 1817 showing assessment area




Fig 6: Ordnance Survey 1st Series Map of of 1834 showing assessment area




Fig 7: 1885 1st Edition 1:10560 OS map showing assessment area




Fig 8: 1901 2nd Edition 1:10560 OS map showing assessment area

The previous owner of the garden remembers his father laying out the space as a kitchen garden approx 40 years ago; before this it would seem that the area was simply part of the plot surrounding the Old Rectory.

It is now certain that these tramways carried limestone, not ironstone; they were short lines on the surface, where the ironstone lay under a thick layer of limestone. The east site was worked opencast by Cranford Ironstone Co Ltd in the 1960s with the aid of heavy quarry machinery capable of removing the overburden, which here was up to 70ft thick. Part of the Cranford East quarry system.

At the east site the narrow gauge tramway was unusual in that it crossed the MR by the side of the road bridge and then ran down to a tipping dock alongside a siding on the north side of the line, a somewhat inconvenient arrangement dictated by the existence of the MR siding and weighbridge that had been used in the 1870s by carts bringing ironstone from the Cranford Hall estate. There was a stable near where the line came to the roadside, suggesting that horses were used for haulage. The owners may well have been Butlin Bevan & Co. But this is not certain. In 1896 Kettering Iron & Coal Co Ltd leased the site for limestone, and apparently extended the tipping dock. In the 1950s the course of the line was a coppice that clothed traces of early working, but the trees had been cut down by 1963, and a few years later the stables disappeared, the whole area having been redeveloped by extensions to Cranford South Quarry.

The area was reached by a tramway extension that tunnelled beneath the road to land leased from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Cranford Glebe), the Duke of Buccleuch (later becoming the Cranford Manor Estate), Sir John Robinson and Geddington Poors Charity. There were three pit faces Cranford South Pit (from 1900), Five Willows Pit (from 1902) and Middle Pit (from 1904). Production all went to the joint owners' furnaces at Staveley and Alfreton, Wagons were wooden end-tippers holding a ton of ore, these were all sold off in 1924 presumably at the end of the narrow gauge operation. At the end of WWI demand fell generally, but at Cranford fresh leases for 40 years were granted probably since the ironstone here was regarded as some of the best in the district. However, the reserves were under a much greater depth of cover than hitherto dealt with. Opencast working was still used, with quarry machines to remove the overburden, and everything was operated on a heftier scale than previously. Standard gauge was introduced, but whilst the change-over was being made continuity of output was maintained in 1921/2 by a system of mixed gauge to the Middle and Five Willows Pits, with the standard gauge rails outside the metre line. Production at the quarries continued up to 1969, albeit with breaks in production during periods of recession. All the track has been lifted, but in 1991 the final layout of the quarries was still traceable, probably due to the considerable depth of the workings. The final working face close to Cranford Station was 60-70ft high. Close to the Thrapston Road, between the tramway route and the Wellingborough Road, is a plantation of Scots pine on the site of former hill-and-dale workings, of considerable age, and in the gullet nearby are plenty of pieces of calcinated ore from the old clamps.
