#### **Discussion**

The method of the excavation meant that the pottery recovered from the archaeological deposits is only a small sample of the ceramic material, with often only one small sized sherd representing one fabric. Therefore the pottery in the above spot dating list does not give a true reflection of the diversity of fabrics and forms that are present on the site. The ceramics are best used as a dating mechanism, and the few contexts where a higher level of quantification could be used, Phase V context (137), are not enough to compare and contrast the activities on site within phases and over time. Very few contexts contained vessels with near or complete profiles useful for illustration.

The pottery recovered does demonstrated that there is a continuity of form use over time at the Hunting Lodge and showed domestic activity largely concerned with the preparation and serving of food and drink and no unusual forms were noted. The quality of the pottery is above average, with few inclusions of high status wares, Chinese Porcelain and Tin Glazed Earthenwares.

The pottery as an agent for dating does show disagreements with the phasing of the site, even when taking into account residual and contaminating sherds of ceramic. Context (128), Phase VI, has pottery only of a 17th century date, context (5a) is dated too early in Phase III, as it is clearly a 19th century deposit. This error may be the result of numbers being wrongly assigned to contexts or problems during finds processing. It is therefore suggested that the pottery together with the glass and especially the clay tobacco pipes be used to re-phase these contexts.

#### **Further work required**

As mentioned above, there is little justification in quantifying the pottery beyond the level of the spot dating list. There is some validity in illustrating some of the vessels, or displaying them at the Hunting Lodge, notably the Nottingham/Derby Stoneware Jug and the Metropolitan Slipware dishes.

It is clear from the pottery above that any further excavation work (involving larger sized trenches) would yield an important post-medieval ceramic assemblage, which when quantified at a high level would show the activities across time at the Hunting Lodge. The residual sherds of medieval and late medieval pottery also indicate activity prior to the Hunting Lodges construction, which may come to light in the event of further archaeological excavation work
