Context, objectives and methodology

A reminder: aims and context of the study

A study to understand which image levers must be taken into account to reinforce the perception of archaeology and heritage in Europe.

- As part of the NEARCH project, Inrap and its European partners have wished to conduct a European study on the perception of archaeology and archaeological heritage. This study, which was conducted in 9 European countries (United-Kingdom, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, the Netherlands, Poland, Spain, and Sweden), aims to:
 - Evaluate the knowledge, the interest, and the attachment to archaeology as well as to archaeological heritage in each country.
 - Highlight the image of archaeology, its strengths and its weaknesses.
 - Study the knowledge and the perception of States & the UE in the saving of archaeological heritage, and what people expect from them.
 - Bring out the knowledge, as well as the archaeology and the heritage media. In particular, the impact of recent archaeology diffusion and promotion programs that were shown to a general audience should be apprehended.
- This study will be a tool to evaluate the perceptions that the French have about archeology and about public policies in terms of archeology and archeological heritage with a goal to strengthen relations with the public.



This report displays the results of the study that was conducted among a general audience in France.

Data collection

- Online survey realised from the Harris Interactive Panel.

- Conducted using a CAWI system for multiple media (web, mobile phone, tablet), with an invitation e-mail asking participants to respond to a questionnaire hosted on the Harris Interactive server.



- **Average length of the questionnaire:** 15 to 20 minutes.
- **Dates of fieldwork:** from December, 29th 2014 to January, 6th 2015.






I- Knowledge, interest and image of archaeology and heritage in France

1.1. Level of knowledge of archaeology and archaeologists




When asked to define archeology, the French define it first and foremost as a science that studies the past, and that serves to study ancient civilizations and human evolution.






For the French, archeology is useful primarily in order to appreciate and understand our past. They value, more than the average European, the benefit of understanding the past through archeology.

From a proposed list, 6 out 10 French people see archeology as a science: a slightly lesser proportion than the European average (-9%). More of them, though, see it as a cultural activity (+5%) and a profession (+3%).





People from higher social and professional classes are the ones who see it most as a science. Younger people see archeology as a job when older people see it as a cultural activity.



Three major roles are assigned to archeology: understand the past in order to better prepare for the future, preserve heritage and pass on to the next generation. Compared to their neighbors in Europe, the French believe more than others that archeology plays a role of uniting citizens around their shared heritage (+9). Less of them, however, accept its economic utility (-5%) or that it contributes to the understanding of history of France (-10).

People aged between 25 and 34 are more likely to acknowledge that archeology contributes to the understanding of French history (+13%) when people from lower social and professional classes are more likely to highlight its role of passing on to the next generation.



For the French, research institutes and universities are primarily where archeological research takes place. Research institutes and private businesses are cited most frequently by the average European.





Among men, upper class and older men are more likely to believe that archeological research is conducted in research institutes while younger men associate it firstly with universities.





1.2. Practices and information sources on archaeology




The French exhibit a clear interest in archeology. However, they are less commonly involved in the practice of archeology than the average European.


1.3. Interest in the field and level of knowledge of the principal archaeological sites worldwide





Women have a more positive view both of the value of archeology and of its emotional nature. Older people see it as more relevant.





Younger people want more information about archeology, whereas women are more vocal in defending programs aiming to safeguard archeological heritage.





Senior citizens, mention and higher social and professional classes mention the role of the government and the regions (administrative departments) in the administration of archeology.












