

A reminder : aims and context of the study




A study to understand which image levers must be taken into account to reinforce the perception of archaeology and heritage in Europe.

- As part of the NEARCH project, Inrap and its European partners have wished to conduct a European study on the perception of archaeology and archaeological heritage. This study, which was conducted in 9 European countries (United Kingdom, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, the Netherlands, Poland, Spain, and Sweden), aims to:
 - Evaluate the knowledge, the interest, and the attachment to archaeology as well as to archaeological heritage in each country.
 - Highlight the image of archaeology, its strengths and its weaknesses.
 - Study the knowledge and the perception of States & the UE in the saving of archaeological heritage, and what people expect from them.
 - Bring out the knowledge, as well as the archaeology and the heritage media. In particular, the impact of recent archaeology diffusion and promotion programs that were shown to a general audience should be apprehended.
- This study is a steering tool that allows us to find out what are the archaeology levers at the European level; it can also strengthen its ties with citizens and local politicians.



This report displays the results of the study that was conducted among a general audience in Poland.






Methodology



Sample	Rent .	500 persons aged 18+ years old who are representative of the Polish population.
Data		- Online survey realised from the Harris Interactive Panel.
collection		 Conducted using a CAWI system for multiple media (web, mobile phone, tablet), with an invitation e-mail asking participants to respond to a questionnaire hosted on the Harris Interactive server.
Dates		- Average length of the questionnaire : 15 to 20 minutes .
Dates		- Dates of fieldwork : from December, 29 th 2014 to January, 6 th 2015.
Methodologica note	I	Quota method was applied on the following socio-demographics criteria : gender, age, socio-professional category and region of residence.







For about 7 Polish out of 10, archaeology is first seen as a science, and then as a knowledge by 6 Polish out of 10. This last affirmation is far stronger than in the European average (+24%). On the other side, archaeology is less viewed as a cultural activity (-11%).



Older generations see more archaeology than other age groups as a study and the protection of the cultural heritage as well as a submission to younger generations.









1.2. Practices and information sources in relation to archaeology



Polish people demonstrate a certain interest about archaeology; especially for watching films, documentaries or for visiting an archaeological site. Those practices are more important than in other European countries.



Some exceptions can be noted, though: visiting an archaeological site or attending a conference about archaeology do not seem to interest Polish people as much as Europeans' average.



Men, and more particularly upper socio-professional categories, seem to be the most interested in archaeology than the Polish people's average. As for the young generation, it has more declared having attended a conference about archaeology.

Programs on TV, films at the cinema and publications are the main sources of information on archaeology. These two last ways of being informed are more practiced by Polish people than in Europeans' average. On the contrary, visits (of sites or of an exhibitions) in correlation to actual practices are less mentioned.










1.4. Image of, attachment to and commitment to archaeology


II- Positioning of archaeology

To older generation, the national government is more involved in the managing of archaeology in Poland.














2.2. Preventive/development-led archaeology








