## INTRODUCTION

### The Gazetteer and the Card Index of Sites\*

This Gazetteer is only one of the two tangible products of the C.B.A. Palaeolithic and Mesolithic Research Committee's project of preparing a corpus of the British Lower and Middle Palaeolithic material. There is also a card index of the sites, in which many of the artifacts from them have been described in some detail, and fuller notes have been made on some of the collections. Additional references have been listed, and further details of the sites themselves have been noted in many cases.

It is intended that this card index should be available for consultation as a supplement to the Gazetteer now published, and it is hoped that the obvious limitations of the Gazetteer itself are better explained by the existence of the card index than by bad planning. The Committee hopes that it will eventually be possible for copies of the card index to be placed in suitable centres of archaeological research in Britain.

To some extent, then, the Gazetteer is a guide to the card index, and a summary of it, but it is also intended to be a useful document in itself which will reveal for the first time something of the full quantity of British Lower and Middle Palaeolithic sites, and the remarkable amounts of material that have come from them. For many research purposes, the listing of simply classified artifact totals may well provide sufficient information by itself. In any case, another main purpose of the Gazetteer is to indicate the whereabouts of extant material, so that the artifacts listed may be traced without consulting the card index. Apart from cards for every site in the Gazetteer, the card index will also contain cards for sites whose names are known, but whose location has not been established. It will also be kept up to date.

The Gazetteer lists as now presented are intended to cover the British Palaeolithic sequence up to and including the rather limited traces of Mousterian occupation which occur mainly in the caves. No attempt has been made to include the material of, geologically early date or uncertain date whose artificial nature has often been claimed but still remains open to the gravest doubt - the eoliths, pre-crag industries and so forth.

In the acceptance of artifacts for inclusion in the lists, definite evidence for their Palaeolithic age has always been sought, such as undeniable incorporation in a Pleistocene river-gravel. However, where finds have been made on the surface or otherwise not *in situ*, it has been necessary to rely on purely typological criteria, with perhaps some consideration of the physical state of the artifact.

Artifacts of doubtful age have therefore been omitted, except in a few cases where the possibility of their being Palaeolithic is of particular interest - e.g. from the point of view of distribution. In such entries the dubious nature of the artifacts is noted.

The notes which follow explain the contents of each column in the format used throughout the Gazetteer. The sites are listed by counties, in alphabetical order; London and the Isle of Wight are treated as counties. A map showing county boundaries is provided.

### PROVENANCE.

#### Place.

Ideally, this column should contain the name of the parish in which the material listed in each entry was found. However, it has not always been possible to determine this, as for example when a find-spot is only vaguely known, or when it has a now disused field name. Another snag is that implements have often been marked, or even published, with a place name which is not that of the correct parish, and it seems desirable in the present lists to retain such names, to avoid confusion. Therefore the entries in the 'Place' column must usually be thought of as towns or villages close to the actual find-spot (in so far as this is known in further detail), which may be, but are not necessarily, the names of the containing parishes.

**Map references:** The six-figure references given are intended for use with the Ordnance Survey 1" to the mile sheets. The reference is given in the 'Place' column only if no more accurate location of the find-spot is known, or else is known by name but cannot be pin-pointed on the map; otherwise the map reference appears in the second column 'Site or Location'.

Each reference is qualified by the addition of a letter: G (General), E (Estimated), or A (Accurate).

A 'General' reference is merely included to locate the place in question in general terms, and is thus only a guide to the area in which the find was made, and does not pretend to indicate the exact find-spot. These 'General' references are taken from the middle of the place concerned, or any convenient feature, - a road junction, a church, a station, the centre of the densest area of buildings, - or sometimes a conveniently placed intersection of national grid lines may be used.

\* In the present publication, the word 'site' is used to indicate a find-spot of one or more artifacts. Proper undisturbed occupation sites of Lower or Middle Palaeolithic date are outstandingly rare in Britain.

An 'Estimated' reference is an attempt to locate the find-spot from information provided with the material, or in a publication, e.g. such information as "about three-quarters of a mile north-west of the church". 'Estimated' references are also used in certain other circumstances, for example when a place-name has gone out of use and does not occur on the maps, but the locality referred to can be reasonably deduced.

'Accurate' references are regrettably few. They are given where an exact find-spot is known or published, or can be calculated from carefully recorded distances and compass-bearings of sufficient detail. They are also used when the exact location of a vanished site (e.g. a disused and built-over gravel pit) has been specially supplied by a qualified local authority or field-worker; for example, many accurate references for old find-spots in Farnham (Surrey) were supplied by the late W. F. Rankine. Sometimes a feature can be located accurately enough, but the feature itself is so large (even some gravel pits are examples of this) that a 'General' reference has to be used, unless it is known that the finds come from one specific part of it.

Sometimes, in place of a map reference, the abbreviations NL or NSR will be found. NL stands for 'Not Located', indicating that it has not been possible to trace and supply a map reference for a site or location of which the name is known and given. Very occasionally this abbreviation occurs in the 'Place' column, where a place name has been definitely assigned to a specific county, but has still not been traced further. NSR stands for 'No Specific Reference', and is used where a large feature is named, e.g. a river or a railway, for which there is no point in giving a 'General' reference, and it is not known exactly where within this feature the find was made.

#### Site or Location.

In this column, any further available information is given for the actual find-spot of the implement. Entries here usually represent districts within or near the place listed in the 'Place' column, or feature names, road names or gravel pit names. Map references are given where known, qualified as explained above with the letter G, E, or A. The occurrence of NL or NSR in this column is wherever possible covered by an actual map reference in the 'Place' column, whether for this particular entry or for a previous one belonging to the same place-name.

The designation 'General' will frequently be found in the 'Site or Location' column: it is applied to material marked only with the name of a place, when that same place has also produced one or more specified sites. Thus, the entry SWANSCOMBE - General in the Kent list is followed by entries for the several specified Swanscombe sites with pit or feature names, such as SWANSCOMBE - Barnfield Pit. The material included under the SWANSCOMBE - General entry consists of artifacts which are only marked "Swanscombe", and cannot safely be attributed to any of the specified sites which follow.

When the 'Site or Location' column is left blank, this indicates that no further information is available about the find-spot than has already been given in the 'Place' column, and there are no further specified sites to be listed under that particular place-name.

#### IMPLEMENTES.

General principles of classification. The Gazetteer does not purport to offer a cultural classification of the British Lower and Middle Palaeolithic material, but simply to list its quantity and whereabouts. The whole question of typology within the Old Stone Age is currently too much in the melting pot for there to be much value in presenting at this stage what would be essentially one person's subjective cultural classification, by subdividing the tool types under such headings as Abbevillian, Clactonian, Acheulian and so forth, or by trying to incorporate stages of typological development within some such cultural classification. The one exception is that Levalloisian cores and flakes are picked out, and even this is intended to refer to Levalloisian technique, and not to beg the question of whether a separate Levalloisian culture is represented.

The classification is therefore in terms of simple broad artifact classes\*, since this, taken with the information under 'COLLECTIONS OR SOURCES' should prove most useful to future research workers. Much fuller information has naturally been recorded in the card index.

Even in assigning the material listed to one of the simple categories used, a cautious attitude has been deliberately adopted where any doubt exists: this especially applies to the diagnosis of retouch on flakes, and to the acceptance of Levalloisian cores and flakes.

The extant collections abound with flakes labelled as retouched, by no means all convincingly. The confidence with which past workers have thus claimed to distinguish by eye artificial secondary flaking of an edge from the scars produced on a flake during its incorporation in a river gravel, often in an abraded and battered condition, is not shared by the compiler of

\* The reader who is unfamiliar with the basic classification of flint implements into cores, flakes and various simple implement types, can obtain this information in almost any popular archaeological handbook. The technology of flint artifacts and the basic definitions are very clearly and accessibly set forth in the latest editions of K.P. Oakley's Man the Toolmaker (British Museum (Natural History) London), or W. Watson's Flint Implements (British Museum, London), both of which are small and inexpensive works.

these lists. The scars on most surface finds of Palaeolithic flakes, especially from ploughed fields, also demand more careful scrutiny than they have sometimes received. Something pretty definite has therefore been demanded before flakes have been accepted as retouched, but in some cases the diagnoses which have been incorporated in these lists have necessarily been accepted at second hand.

It is perhaps even more important to set rigorous standards for the identification of Levalloisian cores and flakes, because of the chronological and cultural implications so often attached to the presence of Levalloisian technique - not always justifiably. It is fortunately at last becoming a commonplace in the literature relating to the Lower and Middle Palaeolithic periods that the presence of a faceted striking platform on a flake is not itself diagnostic of Levalloisian technique, since the more sophisticated handaxe manufacturers were accustomed to prepare striking platforms for the careful removal of well-planned trimming flakes (see for example J. Wymer in *The Swanscombe Skull* (1964), page 45). Also, workers have not always been careful enough in the past in distinguishing primary facetting of a platform from damage or retouch which has occurred after the removal of the flake from the core, so that many flakes whose 'faceted' platforms are not primary have been classed as Levalloisian. The acceptance of Levalloisian cores has also been somewhat haphazard. On the other hand, not all true Levalloisian artifacts are typical: one need look no further than the great Levalloisian site at Baker's Hole (Northfleet, Kent) itself, to see abundant Levalloisian flakes with unfaceted striking platforms alongside the classic faceted-platform ones. Any such flakes occurring in isolation from 'typical' Levalloisian material will not normally have been classified as Levalloisian in this Gazetteer; also, many broken possible Levalloisian flakes which have lost their diagnostic features have also been left out of the Levalloisian columns for safety, a note being made if they are present in quantity and there is a reasonable case for supposing them to have been Levalloisian.

Accuracy of the totals listed. As much material as possible has been actually handled for classification in this Gazetteer, but sometimes the information given is wholly dependent on published sources, or for some reason has not been confirmed at first hand. In some of these cases a note, or even a direct quotation, is given in place of figures in the columns. This relates especially to published sources of early date; for example, the term 'handaxe' was not in use when Sir John Evans' Ancient Stone Implements (Second Revised Edition) appeared in 1897. Thus Evans writes that one or so many implements were found at a given site, often meaning handaxes, but by no means invariably. Frequently too only generalised totals can be given, but to give a detailed explanation in each case would increase the length of the Gazetteer beyond all reason. So, too, plus signs are used with some of the figures quoted, for example when further material from a site is known to have passed into a private collection not yet traced or no longer extant. Where vague or generalised totals are given, or where plus signs are used, the reader must accept that each single case has been carefully assessed, so that what appears in the lists is the fairest possible account of what the site must have produced, in the light of the information at present received or recorded, care having been taken not to over-estimate. Fuller details will usually be available in the card index itself. (See also below: General note on the extent of the collection of information). It has also to be remembered that most of the material listed for any place name followed by the designation 'General' in the 'Site or Location' column is likely to belong to one or more of the specified sites following under the same place name, but the proper break-down cannot be calculated. The totals for many of the sites listed necessarily suffer from this built-in inaccuracy.

#### Handaxes.

All types are included in the first column, broken implements being listed along with the whole ones, unless the break can be clearly shown to have occurred in manufacture, so that the implement was never finished. While handaxes are typically core tools, with full bifacial working, there are abundant examples of their manufacture from large or even moderately small flakes, not fully worked on the bulbar surface. Some even are not worked at all on the bulbar side; good examples of such unifacial handaxes occur in the Swanscombe (Kent) and Warsash (Hampshire) collections. There is clearly some risk here of overlapping between the categories of handaxes and flake tools, and no doubt other workers would differ about individual artifacts. As a general rule it may be said that Lower Palaeolithic flake tools of typical kind lack the regular shape and elaboration of a handaxe; they have a relatively short working edge, whether designed for piercing, scraping or cutting. It seems rare, too, for a flake tool of this age to combine several functions, though a pointed handaxe, for example, often has an edge of far greater length than is demanded by the production of a sharp acute tip; such edges indeed often run completely round the implement. In doubtful cases each artifact has been attributed according to these principles, and with regard to its size, general proportions and assumed function. In fact overlapping between the two classes is more apparent than real, because completely unifacial handaxes are rare.

The rather rough, often asymmetrical, implements most readily described as choppers may also fall near this dividing line between handaxes and flake tools. At their best, they merge with the finely made fully bifacial cleavers\*, which have here been listed as handaxes and whose distinguishing feature is a clear transverse cutting edge, usually at the top, very occasionally at the side. At the other extreme, choppers are little more than haphazard tools-of-the-moment: some substantial flake or fragment offering a suitable chopping edge with the minimum of further working required. In the Gazetteer, choppers with a fair amount of bifacial working, and of generally symmetrical form, have been listed with the handaxes, and those which seem in principle unifacial and irregular have been regarded as flake tools. A few others have been classed as miscellaneous. They are simply not

\* All the cleavers seen have been bifacial to some extent at least. No wholly unifacial true flake cleaver in the African tradition was encountered, the nearest approach being one from the Middle Gravels at Swanscombe, now in the British Museum; but even this artifact shows a limited amount of working on the bulbar side.

standardised enough as a tool-type, and are not present in great quantity, nor, as tools-of-the-moment, do they seem to have much cultural significance. A guiding principle in the classification has been that many artifacts simply cannot be forced into any but loose categories with both internal variation and a certain amount of external overlapping.

Unfinished handaxes and roughouts are listed in the second column. They are of course difficult to pick out with absolute certainty, except where an implement has been broken during manufacture and abandoned unfinished. Otherwise, there is no magic method of deciding between the incomplete work of a competent handaxe-maker, and the unsuccessful clumsily finished product of an inexperienced one. Implements have been classified as unfinished when this seems warranted by the number, nature and disposition of the flake scars on both faces; sometimes it has been helpful to compare unquestionably finished implements from the same site - depending, however, on the nature of the site. But the judgement is necessarily subjective.

#### Cores.

All types except Levalloisian are included here, broken or complete. In the case of the few Clactonian assemblages, the possible use of some cores as chopping tools has not prevented their being listed as cores, but in general a core has been regarded as a waste product: the rejected residue after flakes have been struck from a block or nodule of raw material.

#### Flakes.

Retouched flakes and flake implements: all except Levalloisian examples are included. Flakes which can clearly be shown to have been utilised, though lacking clear retouch, have been included OS flake implements, but these are rather rare, since the material must be in mint fresh condition for this assessment to be safe.

See also the remarks above, under Handaxes and in the note on General principles of classification.

Unretouched flakes: all except Levalloisian are included. The flakes are mainly those struck from a core but never utilised or retouched, and those struck off in the shaping of implements, particularly handaxes.

#### Miscellaneous, worked fragments, etc.

This category is designed to receive all those artifacts which have defied even the unambitious classification offered by the other columns. Mostly they are broken pieces, too small to reveal from what they have come, or else artifacts too battered or rolled to be classifiable, although their artificial character remains clear. Also included is a certain amount of material whose classification is second hand, expressed in terms which cannot be reconciled with the categories here adopted: such engaging but vague terms as 'Palaeolithic lump' may sometimes be encountered in the published sources (see for example Sturge Collection, pages 123 and 126).

#### Levalloisian artifacts.

Levalloisian cores have been accepted only with caution (see above). It is clear enough, however, that there are atypical as well as classic tortoise cores associated with Levalloisian industries, and these have been listed in this column whenever their Levalloisian nature seems certain. Both struck and unstruck Levalloisian cores are listed in this column without distinction.

These remarks apply equally in general principle to Levalloisian flakes (see above). It is perhaps worth mentioning that there are many flakes in a Levalloisian industry which are not Levalloisian flakes in the usual sense, e.g. the flakes struck off in the initial shaping and preparation of a tortoise core. These of course are listed not here but in the column for unretouched flakes.

Both retouched and unretouched true Levalloisian flakes are listed here without distinction. Levalloisian flakes are usually regarded as finished implements in themselves, but many do bear secondary retouch, usually of a blunting nature, while clear traces of utilisation can often be found on perfectly fresh examples. Unsuccessfully struck and broken Levalloisian flakes are also included without distinction, provided the diagnostic features are clear; so are the plunging flakes sometimes encountered.

#### COLLECTIONS OR SOURCES.

No attempt has been made in the Gazetteer to provide a comprehensive bibliography for the sites listed. The purpose of this final column is merely to justify the figures quoted, and this is achieved in two ways:

(a) by listing the museums or other collections where material from the site was seen or reported;

(b) by quoting the minimum necessary number of published sources which refer to material certainly or probably additional to that actually seen. It is taken for granted that the user of the Gazetteer will always follow up any further references quoted in the published sources, because for reasons of space these subsidiary references cannot be set out with the main ones.

The collections are listed alphabetically, with the museums first and any private collections after; those which contain a particularly large or important part of the total yield of a site are distinguished by an asterisk. Asterisks are only used where a site has produced a substantial amount of material which has since been unequally split up.

It has, for lack of space, been impossible to list the exact amounts of material in each collection separately, but this information can usually be got from the card index if required.

Full lists are supplied of the abbreviations used for both collections and documentary\* sources. The user of the Gazetteer is recommended to check each abbreviation against these lists, since not all are as self-evident as they may seem: this especially applies to museum collections in towns where there is more than one museum.

General note on the extent of the collection of information.

No claim is made, nor could one possibly be contemplated, that the Gazetteer lists all the British material that there is. It has of course proved out of the question in part-time work even over five years to visit, or even to hear of, all extant collections. Very few private collections have been taken into account, although news of their existence was always sought. A very few known minor museum collections remain unvisited, but every attempt has been made to establish that they contain no new sites, or material of importance from known sites.

It is very much to be hoped that this publication of a major part of the extant material will stimulate the owners or administrators of collections which have been omitted, or others who have access to such collections, to make available details of them in the simple form which has been adopted here. The Gazetteer's shortcomings are a matter for practical amendment, and not for passive criticism. If every entry in these lists were revealed as an under-estimation of the material from the site concerned, their publication would still be amply justified - provided the revelation took the form of collectors' sending in details of the additional unrecorded material, so that it could be added to the card index and included in any future revised version of the Gazetteer. Only in this way can an approach ever be made to the unlikely goal of a full and accurate corpus of the British material as a contribution to world Palaeolithic studies.

If major public collections have been omitted, this is certainly unintentioned. At a few museums, time inevitably ran out, subsequent chance to revisit has presented itself; these cases are marked by the occurrence of estimated amounts in certain entries, usually in the flake material, care having been taken that the estimates should not err on the high side. In the case of the vast Stopes Collection, the bulk of which is in store at the National Museum of Wales, Cardiff, only a part has so far been examined in detail. No numerical estimates have been attempted. Care was taken to extract all possible information from the manuscript catalogue; what is missing is actual totals of artifacts collected from pits in the Swanscombe area which are already known to be outstandingly prolific. It is thus hoped that the amount of information lost in this case is not too serious; any other course would have delayed beyond justification the appearance of the Gazetteer. This missing information must be added to the card index as soon as possible, and meanwhile the attention of anyone concerned with the North Kent material is directed to this additional source. No attempt could be made to look for British material that has strayed to museums or private collections abroad, and the extent of it is simply not known.

The nature of the written sources used will be readily apparent: the main ones are national and local archaeological periodicals, especially those of county archaeological societies, plus the very few specialist works on the British Lower and Middle Palaeolithic material, such as the appropriate chapters of Sir John Evans' Ancient Stone Implements (Second Edition, 1897), and Worthington G. Smith's Man the Primeval Savage (1894). Another useful source has been the relevant sections of various more general works, notably certain volumes of the Victoria History of the Counties of England. Geological and general scientific periodicals have also proved fruitful.

ALPHABETICAL LIST OF SOURCES, WITH THE ABBREVIATIONS USED IN THE GAZETTEER.

1. COLLECTIONS.

Note: Space unfortunately does not permit the separate listing of the various individual collections, many of them extremely important, which make up the cumulative Palaeolithic collection of each Museum. Thus, for example, the abbreviation BM for British Museum in the Gazetteer lists is the same, whether the artifacts concerned come from the Wellcome Collection, the Warren Collection, the Calkin Collection, the Worthington Smith Collection, the Sturge Collection, the Christie Collection, or any of a host of others.

Many Museums in Britain owe much for the richness of their Palaeolithic collections to the life's work of individual great collectors, who are thus not properly acknowledged here: as typical examples chosen at random may be cited the Oxford University Museum (Treacher Collection), the Ashmolean Museum (Evans Collection), the National Museum of Wales (Stopes Collection), or the Red House Museum, Christchurch, (Druitt Collection). Many other cases could be quoted, and examples could also be given of collections like those of Benjamin Harrison or Worthington Smith, which have been split up and have enriched many Museums.

The Museums themselves are listed above, and practically every name in the list stands also for at least one kind and helpful person on the staff, and often several more, to whom I am most grateful. A few have even sent me lists of collections so lucid and accurate as to render a visit unnecessary, - a particularly helpful service in view of all the travelling that had to be done. (In a very few instances I have made use of published or specially supplied information that certain material is in a certain collection, without visiting it myself, but this only applies to small amounts).

I am deeply indebted to the skill, care, patience and help of all the private collectors whose material is included in these lists. In some cases details of their collections were supplied to me by those Museums which have been able to keep records, often with drawings or photographs, of Lower and Middle Palaeolithic material in private hands from sites in their county or area\*.

Certain other kind people, not necessarily themselves collectors or on the staffs of Museums, have been good enough to list or classify whole collections of some magnitude, or to check through at my request the lists of material I had gathered for a whole area or county, making many helpful additions or corrections. Once again, the list of such people is too long to give in full, which is perhaps an encouraging reflection of the widespread interest in the compilation of the Gazetteer. I am not prepared however to omit the names of the following, because their contributions have been large and either were not made in the capacity of Curator or private collector, or else were made in addition to help already given in such a capacity:

Mr. J.B. Calkin, Mr. J.N. Carreck, the Late R.R. Clarke, Miss E.B. Green, Miss F.E.S. Greig (now my wife), Mr. A.D. Hallam, Dom Aidan Harker, Mrs. J. Hebditch, Mr. A.D. Lacaillé and Mrs. C.F. Hayes, Mr. E.W. Mackie, Miss L. Millard, Dr K.P. Oakley and other members of the staff of the Sub-Department of Anthropology at the British Museum (Natural History), the late W.F. Rankine, Mr. P.J. Tester, Mr. J. Wymer.

I am also extremely grateful to Miss Beatrice de Cardi and the staff of the Council for British Archaeology, for their very considerable part in bringing the Gazetteer to the point of publication, and their prompt and unfailing help and guidance at all stages of the work. I would also like to thank the various C.B.A. Regional Group Secretaries who gave me welcome assistance when I first took over the task of compiling the Gazetteer.

Lastly, it would be wrong and ungrateful not to mention, even if only in general, all those who were authors of, or in any other way responsible for, the published sources which I have relied on so heavily in compiling the Gazetteer lists. Their work is spread over the last hundred years or so, and, as will be readily apparent, a large quantity of the information collected survives only through their efforts. Had there been more of them, these lists would be more complete and more accurate, as well as longer. Their successors will already doubtless have contrived to render the Gazetteer slightly out of date during the time it has been in the press. May they long continue to make the present lists further out of date, by adding more published facts and figures, both new ones and corrections to those presented. Their contribution to the cumulative corpus of knowledge of this subject is permanent and utterly indispensable.

## GAZETTEER OF BRITISH LOWER AND MIDDLE PALAEOLITHIC SITES

### S U M M A R Y .

The Gazetteer of British Lower and Middle Palaeolithic Sites reveals for the first time something of the full quantity of artifacts of these periods which have been found in Britain. A card index is also being prepared by the author for the Palaeolithic and Mesolithic Research Committee of the Council for British Archaeology, in which the sites listed in this Gazetteer are described in more detail, but this has not yet been completed.

In the Gazetteer, the sites are listed in alphabetical order by counties; a map is provided to show the location of the counties of England and Wales. British National Grid map references are quoted as often as possible for the find-spots. The one-inch-to-the-mile maps published by H.M.Ordnance Survey are most suitable for use with the Gazetteer.

The lists cover the British Palaeolithic sequence up to and including the Mousterian period, but the so-called Crag industries, Pre-Crag industries, eoliths, etc., have been omitted. Artifacts of uncertain age have also been omitted, except where the possibility of their being Palaeolithic is of particular interest - for example, from the point of view of distribution.

No cultural classification has been attempted, and the material has been listed according to simple artifact classes. When artifacts have been classified as 'Levalloisian cores' or 'Levalloisian flakes', these titles refer only to the use of Levalloisian technique, and do not therefore necessarily imply Levalloisian culture. The author has taken particular care on every possible occasion to satisfy himself as to the genuine nature of 'retouch' on artifacts in the class 'retouched flakes and flake implements', and also to check the correctness of all attributions to the classes 'Levalloisian cores' and 'Levalloisian flakes'.

In the many cases where it has not been possible to give exact classified totals for the artifacts from a site, the most accurate possible estimated totals have been given, with some indication that the figures are only approximate.

The sources of the figures and information supplied for each site are indicated, in the form of lists of collections, and references. The more important collections are indicated by an asterisk. No attempt has been made to offer a full bibliography for each site: the references given are only the fewest necessary which refer to artifacts certainly additional to those which the author has himself seen. Lists are supplied of the abbreviations used for collections and written sources.

It is certain that much more British Lower and Middle Palaeolithic material must exist than has been listed in the Gazetteer. Many private collections probably remain which the author has not been able to visit and record. Also, no attempt has yet been made to include British material which is now in museums or private collections outside Britain. It is hoped that those who possess, or know of, British Lower and Middle Palaeolithic artifacts which have not been included in the lists, will send information to the Council for British Archaeology, or direct to the author.

### S O M M A I R E

Le présent répertoire des stations britanniques du Paléolithique ancien et moyen nous donne pour la première fois un aperçu de la quantité d'objets façonnés de ces périodes qui ont été trouvés en Grande-Bretagne. L'auteur prépare aussi un fichier pour la Commission de recherches paléolithiques et mésolithiques du "Council for British Archaeology", dans lequel les stations énumérées dans le répertoire sont décrites plus en détail, mais ce travail n'est pas encore achevé.

Dans cet ouvrage les stations sont énumérées en ordre alphabétique, par comtés; une carte de l'Angleterre et du Pays de Galles montre la délimitation. On a donné, dans la mesure du possible, les coordonnées "National Grid" des sites. Le lecteur a intérêt à utiliser avec le répertoire les cartes à l'échelle du 1/63360 publiées chez "H.M. Ordnance Survey".

La liste comprend la série des industries du Paléolithique britannique jusqu'à et y compris la période moustérienne. Mais on n'a pas inclus les outillages litigieux appelés "Crag", "Pre-Crag", "Eolithiques", etc. On a également omis les objets d'un âge incertain, à part ceux qui pourraient être d'époque paléolithique et présenteraient de ce fait un intérêt particulier, par exemple en ce qui concerne la répartition.

On n'a pas essayé de classer les industries; les matériaux trouvés ont été classifiés selon des catégories simples, et en parlant de nucléus ou d'éclats "levalloisiens" on fait seulement allusion à la technique en cause; cela n'implique donc pas nécessairement l'existence d'une industrie. L'auteur a mis tout son soin à s'assurer autant que possible de l'authenticité des outils retouchés dans la catégorie "éclats retouchés et éclats-outils"; il a également vérifié l'exactitude de toutes les attributions aux classes "nucléus levalloisiens" et "éclats levalloisiens".

Dans les nombreux cas où il n'a pas été possible de donner des totaux classifiés exacts pour les objets provenant de chaque station, on a donné des approximations aussi exactes que possible, en indiquant que les chiffres ne sont qu'approximatifs.

Les sources des renseignements et des chiffres fournis pour chaque station sont indiquées au moyen d'une liste de collections et d'ouvrages de référence; les collections les plus importantes sont marquées d'un astérisque. Mais on n'a pas donné de bibliographie complète pour chaque station, et on a limité au minimum les ouvrages cités, qui se réfèrent aux objets qui devraient certainement s'ajouter à ceux que l'auteur a vérifiés. On y trouve aussi une liste des abréviations qui indiquent les collections et les sources écrites.

Il est certain qu'il doit exister beaucoup plus de matériaux du Paléolithique ancien et moyen britannique qui ne sont pas énumérés dans le répertoire. Il reste probablement beaucoup de collections privées que l'auteur n'a pu ni examiner ni enregistrer. De plus, on n'a pas encore tenté d'y ajouter les matériaux d'origine britannique qui se trouvent maintenant dans des musées ou des collections privées en dehors de la Grande-Bretagne. On espère que ceux qui possèdent ou connaissent des matériaux appartenant à ces catégories qui ne figurent pas dans cette liste enverront les renseignements nécessaires au "Council for British Archaeology" ou directement à l'auteur.

#### Z U S A M M E N F A S S U N G

The Gazetteer of British Lower and Middle Palaeolithic Sites (Geographische Nachschlagewerk über Fundorte des Britischen Nieder- und Mittel-Palaeolithicus) zeigt zum ersten Male die grosse Anzahl der Werkzeuge aus diesen Zeitabschnitten, die in Gross-Britannien existieren. Ebenfalls ist ein Karten-Index von demselben Author für den Palaeolithischen und Mesolithischen Forschungsausschuss des Rates für Britische Archäologie (Council for British Archaeology) in Vorbereitung, in welchem die in diesem Nachschlagewerk aufgeführten Gebiete in grösseren Einzelheiten beschrieben werden. Dieser ist jedoch noch nicht vollendet.

In dem Nachschlagewerk sind die Fundorte in alphabetischer Reihenfolge nach Bezirken angeführt; es ist mit einer Karte versehen, welche die geographische Lage der Bezirke von England und Wales anzeigt. Für die Fundorte sind Britische National Grid Karten-Bezeichnungen so oft wie möglich angegeben. Die von H.M. Ordnance Survey herausgegebenen Karten (ein Inch pro Meile) sind am besten für den Gebrauch des Nachschlagewerkes geeignet.

Die Listen umfassen das Britische Palaeolithicum bis einschliesslich der Moustier-Periode, jedoch wurden die sogenannten Crag Industrien, Pre-Crag Industrien, Eoliten usw. nicht mit eingeschlossen. Ebenso wurden Werkzeuge unbestimmten Alters weggelassen, ausser denjenigen die evtl. palaeolithisch sind, und aus besonderen Gründen, zum Beispiel aus dem der Verbreitung, besonders wichtig sind.

Es wurde keine kulturelle Klassifikation angestrebt, und das Material wurde nur in grundlegende Werkzeug-Gruppen eingeteilt. Wenn Werkzeuge 'Levalloisian Cores' oder 'Levalloisian Flakes' (Levalloisiens Nuclei oder Abschläge) genannt wurden, so beziehen sich diese Titel lediglich auf den Gebrauch der Levalloisiens Technik, und schliessen deshalb nicht unbedingt "Levalloisiens Kultur" mit ein. Der Author hat bei jeder möglichen Gelegenheit besondere Sorgfalt angewandt, um selbst festzustellen ob die Abschläge in der Klassifizierung 'Retouched Flakes and Flake Implements' (retouschierte Abschläge und Abschlagwerkzeuge) wirklich retouschiert wurden, und hat ebenfalls die Richtigkeit der Zuordnungen zu den Klassen 'Levalloisian Cores' und 'Levalloisian Flakes' überprüft.

In den vielen Fällen, bei denen es nicht möglich war, genau klassifizierte Endergebnisse für die Werkzeuge eines Fundortes anzugeben, wurden die, so genau wie nur möglich geschätzten Endergebnisse gegeben, aber mit dem Hinweis, dass die Zahlen nur annähernd stimmen.

Die Quellen der Zahlen und Informationen von jedem Fundort sind in Form von Listen der Sammlungen (Museen, usw.) und mit Verweisen angegeben. Die wichtigeren Sammlungen sind mit einem Stern versehen. Es steht keine vollständige Bibliographie für jeden Fundort zur Verfügung: die angegebenen Referenzen beziehen sich nur auf Werkzeuge, die der Author selbst nicht hat sehen können, die der Literatur nach, aber existieren. Listen mit den Abkürzungen, die für Sammlungen und niedergeschriebene Quellen benutzt wurden, sind beigelegt.

Es ist sicher, dass es bedeutend mehr Britisches Nieder- und Mittel-Palaeolithisches Material geben muss, als es in dem Nachschlagewerk aufgeführt ist, hauptsächlich in vielen privaten Sammlungen, die der Author nicht hat aufsuchen und einschliessen können. Es ist auch noch kein Versuch unternommen worden, britisches Material, das sich heute in Museen oder privaten Sammlungen ausserhalb Gross-Britanniens befindet, mit einzubeziehen. Der Verfasser wäre dankbar wenn alldiejenigen, die Britische Nieder- und Mittel-Palaeolithische Werkzeuge, welche nicht in den Listen eingeschlossen sind, besitzen, oder von ihnen wissen, Auskunft darüber an den Rat für Britische Archäologie (Council for British Archaeology), oder direkt an den Author, schicken würden.

NOTES -

See also a reference to an extremely prolific site in the Ebbsfleet Valley near Northfleet. Spurrell claimed to have obtained or examined numerous 'hadnes', some unfinished, many thousand flakes, numerous 'flint hammers and knapping tools' and some elegant sickles or scrapers of peculiar form. It is not clear whether this site may have been an early exposure of the Baker's Hole working floor, nor is it known whether Spurrell preserved all the material, and if so, what became of it. The site was about half a mile South-West of a point 'quarter of a mile West of Northfleet Church'.

Existing collections of Northfleet material are confusing, because it is clear that much material from the Baker's Hole pit was only marked 'Northfleet.'

## INDEX

The index has been prepared in two parts. The first Part, Place Names, is essentially an index to all names occurring in the first column throughout the Gazetteer itself, and the second part, Site or Location Names, includes all those in the second column. Anyone wishing to look up a name in the index should certainly check both parts for it, because whether a name counts as a place name or a site name often depends on how artefacts have been previously published, or how they have been marked by their finders. The existence of the double index should ensure that any name can be quickly located, even if its placing in the first or second column might otherwise seem surprising.
