ANALYSIS OF SAMPLE OF FILLING OF PIPKIN FROM X39

by John Evans

Emission spectrographic analysis showed the sample to contain calcium with traces of silicon, aluminium, magnesium, and iron. The trace elements are most probably caused by soil contamination. Anion analysis showed the presence of carbonate and traces of sulphate.

At first sight the sample would seem to be calcium carbonate but the rate of reaction of the sample with dilute hydrochloric acid was very slow. This indicated that the carbonate was only a surface coating. The presence of calcium hydroxide was thus suspected. Analysis by differential thermal analysis, infrared spectroscopy, and pH determination confirmed that the sample was mainly calcium hydroxide.

No organic materials were present. No sand or other aggregates were present. No charcoal, ash, or other kiln debris were present.

The sample was composed of calcium hydroxide (hydrated lime) which had been protected by a surface coating of calcium carbonate and, to a lesser extent, calcium sulphate. The absence of aggregate, kiln debris, etc suggests that the material was for a wall finish.

The inventory suggests the appraisers moving from room to room. The "finale" before the tenth item appears to indicate the last item in the bedroom, followed by the

contents of an (?) ante room, of the (?) hall and kitchen,
and then the animals, presumably in outbuildings.

Inventories of personal possessions, made for any reason,
are rare before the 17th century. The thoroughness of this
example therefore gives it particular importance.
