

FORMER INHABITANTS OF CHICHESTER.

The utility of printing the old lists of those, who contributed to the subsidies, is now admitted. The public records afford great facilities for this purpose in reference to the entire County, but Chichester is particularly favoured, for we have the names preserved in the subsidy of 1295¹, and also those who contributed to the poll-tax in 1380, and to the hearth money in 1670.

The early records of the City itself have been lost, and these returns, therefore, possess an additional value.

Those which I have taken after the poll-tax give us the names of those citizens who dwelt here at the time of the Reformation, and those who were here before, as well as those who were in the town after, the Commonwealth.

The return of 1295 gives us the names of several citizens who were returned to the Parliament, then first established, and many local surnames derived from neighbouring parishes, and among them of Boxgrove, Lordington, Rustington, Midhurst, Bosham, Eartham, and Slindon.

The poll-tax is peculiarly interesting, since it gives the names and the number of the servants in each family, and the names of the females. Their Christian names vary much from those of the present day. True it is that many, such as Agnes, Alice, Cecily, Edith, Isabel, and Juliana, are not obsolete, yet they were more largely used at the time of this return than now, whilst we find other Christian names, very little used at the present day, such as Christiana, Eva,

and in many of the village histories in our volumes the return has been also given.

Felicia, Joab, Rosa, Sibilla, and Williama. In the style of some of the trades, also, we find words which have dropped out of common use. Thus we find *sutor* used for shoemaker, *tavener* for innkeeper, *pasteler* for baker or pie-maker, and *webber* for weaver.

Subsequent to this return we have none, with names, till the time of Henry VIII.; and I therefore print the following list of Comptrollers of the Customs from the patent rolls:—

It will be seen that most, if not nearly all, of these are Chichester names. French, Wyne, atte More, Bradbridge, Clympesfold, and Glover, were all families of some mark in the City.

The return of 1523 gives the streets within the city, and the names of those foreigners, whether Frenchmen, Dutchmen, or Scotts, then dwelling here, as they did largely in most of the southern towns. The subsidy of this year extended to the lands, personals, and wages of aliens, and the tax upon them was double the amount fixed for natives. In some towns a separate list was made;² in this city, however, they were included in the general list of contributors.

The two later subsidies bring the names down to the time when the families are better known to us; for of those in the older lists very few indeed are remaining at this day. The hearth money is so specific that the sites of the houses could be traced.

It was, probably, about the end of Elizabeth's reign, or very

early in that of James II., that the occurrence took place, which is remembered in the "Roxburghe Ballads,"³ entitled "A most sweet Song of an English Merchant, borne at Chichester." He was sentenced to lose his head for killing a German at Emden town, in the Netherlands. A scaffold had been built in the Market-place for his execution. It was attempted to save him by the aid of the women and an offer of £2,000 by the merchants.



"Bare-headed was hee brought,
His hands were bound before,
A cambricke ruffe about his necke,
As white as milk, hee wore :
His stockings were of silke,
As fine as fine might be ;
Of person and of countenance
a proper man was hee."

And ten goodly maids prepared to beg his life if he would grant to them his love, but none of them his heart could love, and he added—

"And now, deare friends, farewell !
Sweet England, eake adieu !
And Chicester, where I was borne,
Where first this breath I drew !
And now, thou man of death,
Unto thy weapon stand.
'Ah, nay,' another damsell cry'd,
'sweet headsman, hold thy hand.'"

And then, having obtained his pardon—

“With musicke sounding sweet,
The foremost of the traine,
This gallant maiden, like a bride,
Did fetch him backe againe :
Yea, hand in hand they went
Unto the church that day,
And they were married presently
in sumptuous rich array.”

“A sweet thing is love,
It rules both heart and mind ;
There is no comfort in the world
to women that are kind.”

Which is the refrain of the whole ballad.

William Lawes (brother of Henry), and himself a well-known composer, was a member of the choir at the Cathedral, and was called hence, in 1602, to the office of Gentleman of the Chapel Royal;¹¹¹ dying at the siege of Chester, 1645; and *John Weldon*, organist and composer, of the Chapel Royal, was born in this city. He died 7th May, 1715.¹¹²
