

NAMES FROM THE REGISTER BOOKS OF THE PARISH OF GLYNDE, FROM 1558 TO 1812.

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Mr. Blencowe, in an early volume of our "Collections" (iv., p. 243), directed attention to the Parish Registers, treating, as was somewhat his wont, of the curiosities and eccentricities to be observed therein. The work which I have undertaken is the compilation of an alphabetical list of the names which appear in the old register books of the parish of Glynde, and I have done so in accordance with the suggestion given by the Rev. E. B. Ellman, in vol. xxii. p. 22, and I have, in general, followed the plan adopted by him, giving the entries from 1558 to 1812, and noting from the books, after the latter date, the last entry of names which have now disappeared from the parish. After 1812 the entries have been made in the books, and the copies thereof returned to the registry, in a more regular and systematic manner.

The law of the case, *i.e.*, the injunctions of Lord Cromwell, in 1538, and the canon of 1603, may be found in Mr. Ellman's Paper, vol. xxii., p. 22-23. But neither injunction nor canon seem to have been complied with by those to whom they were addressed, at all events with that strictness and accuracy which in such matters might be expected. Indeed the canon (70th), which was intended to secure attention to the previous injunctions, must have had a tendency rather in a contrary direction. A coffer, with three locks, and the same number of keys—one in the keeping of the minister, and the other two with the churchwardens severally—would necessitate the simultaneous attendance of the three persons concerned, for the purpose of making the entries. And these

entries were to be made once in the week, *i.e.*, on the Sunday, so that the minister would have to trust to his memory for the particulars, or if in any way distrustful of that, to jot down memoranda, from which he might make transcripts at his convenience. This, I find, was frequently the case. Not only is it evident by the handwriting that the entries were not made as need and law required, but were transcribed in whole pages, and also in many consecutive pages, by one hand and at one time, but it is, here and there, again and again, recorded that the entries were transcribed from a *pocket book*, and in more than one instance it is added "*kept for the purpose.*" The natural result is, that there is much of confusion in the book, the transcripts being made at "*haphazard*"—several entries made twice over—the dates given with uncertainty, as *e.g.*, "*about*" such a date—and again thus, "*1702 or 1703.*" Though the injunction was plain enough that the minister and churchwardens should sign their names at the bottom of the page, as the page became filled, it seems to have been generally disregarded, for you may examine very many pages of the book without ascertaining "*by whom the ceremony was performed,*" as our modern "church books" phrase it. The attesting signatures are not to be found until 1725, when the name of the vicar, "*J. Hawes,*" appears. During his incumbency the registers were more correctly kept, and in page 39 there is this record in his handwriting: "A Copy of Christenings Registered in a Pocket Book kept by the late Rev. Mr. Carr, Vicar of Glynd, for that purpose from 1702 to 1720." Also on p. 54, in the same hand, we find "Burials as found Registered in a Pocket Book kept by the late Rev. Mr. Alan Carr for y^e purpose, A.D., 1720." This vicar was evidently more strict in matters of business than his predecessor, but a trifle remiss in some other particulars, as I find an entry 1740, in a churchwarden's account book, "*J^e 12. paid y^e Rev^d Mr. John Hawes for two Visitation diners (sic) which he never came there to eat, 10s.*" The Rev. Thos. Davies, who succeeded Mr. Hawes, took especial pains with the Register Book, not only making his own entries plainly and systematically, but, after much evident labour, reducing to some slight degree of consecutive order the chaos of entries made before his time.

The earlier pages of the Register Book contain many entries which it is by no means easy to decipher. The handwriting is often very bad—cramped and in bad form—and the ink used was not always possessed of the quality of indelibility, neither was the parchment evenly capable of receiving, or retaining, the impressions of the pen. The first page is in a style of writing which would be good at any period. It is headed thus:—"The Register Booke of all suche weddinges, Christeninges, and buryalls as have byn recorded and registred in the parish of Glynde, in the Countie of Sussex, as they have byn collected and gathered out of the old Bookes and papers, and faithfullie transcribed accordinglie by me, John Bohune, Vicar of Glynd, Anno Domini 1558." The "Weddinges, Christeninges, and Buryalls," are all intermixed, but annotated in the margin by the initial letters, respectively, W. C. B. Of course, there is the usual difficulty in compiling a list of names from these old writings arising from the variation in the mode of spelling the names. In some cases the variation probably is due to the pronunciation of the name in the Parish or Neighbourhood. But as a rule, the names of the chief personages of the Parish are given with sufficient accuracy. "Morley" is plain enough throughout. The Norman "de Haia" is given as "Haies," "Hayes," till it appears as the brief modern patronymic of "Hay." In the Alphabetical List of Names I give the variations as I find them.

The earliest copies of the Registers for Glynde, in the Registry of Lewes, are in 1662. Possibly this comparatively late date may be accounted for by the fact that *Glynde* was a "*peculiar*." At p. 16 of the Glynde Register Book, A.D. 1690, there appears to be a gap of fourteen years. B. Husey Hunt, Esq., kindly admitted me to inspect the copies in the Registry, and therein I found this gap supplied. But here the years 1676-77 are missing, as are also the years 1686-7-8. At this period the entries were very irregular, the Revd. Alan Carr (to whose Pocket Book Entries I have already alluded) being then the Vicar, and the copies (?) which I found in the Registry supplying the gap of fourteen years from 1690, were returned with his signature attached to nearly all.

In the list of names of persons *married* at Glynde, and

entered as being of other parishes, I note with * those who were married "before Harbert Morley, Esq.," and these extend over a period from July 17th, 1655, to November 16th, 1657. Mr. Blencowe remarks (vol. iv., p. 287) that "during the time of the Commonwealth marriages were performed in a very easy manner. From the following extracts taken from the register of Wartling, it would appear that some regiment was quartered there, and the officers officiated as the priests of Hymen." Then follow three extracts showing marriages "by Capitaine Jenner," "by Mr. Paul Durande," and "by Capitaine Stapley." In the Glynde Register Book the title of "*Colonel*" is dropped, and the entry is in each case "*before Harbert Morley, Esq.*" In however easy a manner these marriages were "*performed*" then, the modern Registrar can accomplish the feat with at least equal ease and rapidity. But in the case of the marriages "*before Harbert Morley, Esq.*" persons who had a "*purpose of marriage*" must surely—if they put in a personal appearance—have been subjected to some amount of trouble, if we consider the distances they must have traversed in order to be married "*before Harbert Morley,*" at Glynde. They must have had a "*good will for their journey,*" for such places as "Kingston Bowsey," "Mayfield," "Seaford," "Buxted," "Hastings," &c., &c., were not immediately contiguous to Glynde. Neither did they participate, it would seem, in the aversion of the immortal "*Lydia Languish*" to be cried three times in a country church, and have "an unmannerly fat clerk ask the consent of every butcher in the parish," for their banns were to be published in the Parish Church or Meeting, or else *thrice in "Lewes Market,"* whence a certificate of the same was to be brought.

This Harbert Morley, the son of Robert Morley, was baptised the 2nd of April, 1616. There were three sons born to him, *i. e.* Robert, 1650; Harbert, 1652; William, 1653. I mention these sons because, in a note (S. A. C., vol. v., p. 95), it is stated that William Morley was Colonel Harbert Morley's *only* son. There is, in the Register Book, a note under date "1656, September 18th," "buried that precious Gentlewoman of blessed memory, Mrs. Mary Morley, the wife of Colonel Harbert Morley, Esq." In the List of

Names I give "1683" as the last date at which a member of this family appears by name in the Register Book, but it is to be seen by a stone in the church that Mrs. Francis Morley, daughter of Robert Morley, Esq., was buried here in 1712. This is one of the many omissions of the Register Book consequent upon the system of keeping the entries in pocket books.

I add the following directions to explain the method of the list:—A single date attached to a name denotes that such name is found entered at that date, and at that date only. Two dates, with a line thus — between them, denote that the name to which they are attached is to be found entered, more or less frequently, between the years noted. The date with a * denotes that such is the latest date after 1812 at which the name is to be found. The date with the mark thus — after it denotes that there are at present (1872) inhabitants of the parish bearing the name, and presumably of the family. The names marked † are those found by me in the transcripts at the Registrar's Office, but not to be found in the Register Book here.
