

TABLE 3: CONTEXT REGISTER. (All contexts revealed below context 2 and above 'natural' unless otherwise specified.)

(This is an up to date register of the contexts revealed and as such differs in some detail to the originals which were not amended at the close of excavations.)

9	C. 0.1m thick, c. 4.5 x 2.8 m layer of yellow – grey brown clay with dark patches below (7) & (8), above (10), (18). Possible bedding/leveller for (8)? May be interface or upper level of 'natural' (10)
10	Yellow clay soil with brick fragment inclusions in upper levels that may be remnants of (9). Below (7), (8) & (9). Is possibly natural subsoil.

11	c. 2.5 m long, c. 0.7 m wide east – west aligned brick drain walling and brick/ stone flooring . Runs over/ on wall (3). Walls comprise two rows of brickwork.

13	C. 2 m wide Layer of yellow-grey soil between (14) and (20), patchy to west of (17). Continuation of subsoil as with (12)?
14	Cut of c. 4 m long robbed out drain feature on N/S alignment. Below (2) and (7). Filled with (15). Relates to (11)/ (16)
15	0.18 m deep fill of robbed out feature (14), comprises dark, grey-brown coarse sandy loam with cbm inclusions

16	Cut of east – west aligned brick drain (11) to c. 0.2 m depth. Below (2), (22), (37). Possibly related to (14).
17	7 cm thick loose, grey-brown sandy loam fill within upper levels of (16). Also between drain walls (11) and (39). Merges with (15)
18	3 cm thick, narrow band/layer of yellow clay below (9) and above (13)
19	Straight sided cut of linear feature on N/S alignment for c. 19.5 m. Is c. 0.6m wide, 0.36m deep. Cuts (13) and (27). Probable robbed out wall. Contains 'spine' wall for Phase 2.
20	Dark grey-brown loam fill of robber trench (19). Contains cbm rubble and is above (51).
21	Small area of brickwork possibly related to (3). Comprises bricks and fine white mortar. Above (5) and (6).
22	2.2 m by 0.6 m light brown layer with cbm and mortar inclusions in area of (19) and (13). Above (46). Same as (12), (13)?

23	5 cm thick demolition layer in area of (19) and (47). C. 1.4m x 1.17m in size. Above (24) and possibly extends further than trench limits
24	Mid – dark-grey layer of mixed rubble, similar to (22) revealed below (23). C. 4 m long by 0.52 m wide. Is above (48).
25/198	Thin, fragile spread of sandy mortar (4.2 m by 2.16 m), at southern end of site to immediate north of brickwork (197), below (2) and (24). Possible base of flooring. Is same as (198)
26	0.75 m long 'wall', 0.4 m wide between (3) and (20) (adjacent to drain (4)). Continues westward. Possible cross passage structure.
27	C 8 m long by 0.8 wide layer of compact, yellow-grey clay north and south of (26) and was possibly above (26)?
28	Cut of square shaped post-hole, 0.7 m by 0.6 m, north of (4) in alignment with (30), (32), (43), (61).
29	Fill of (28) to depth of 0.25 m
30	Cut of oval - square shaped post-hole cut through (4). 0.82 m by 0.58 m.
31	Loose, orange-grey sandy loam fill of (30)
32	Cut of square shaped post-hole, south of (4). 0.6 m by 0.7 m.
33	Loose, grey-brown soil fill of (32) to 0.31 m depth
34	Cut of square shaped post-hole, in area (14) and cut by (15). Same alignment as (28), (30), (32), (43). 0.56 m by 0.56 m.
35	Yellow – brown mottled clay rubble fill of (34) to depth of 0.56 m

40	C. 13 m long, East – West aligned cut for robbed out wall. Cuts (3)/(45). 0.61 m wide, 0.96 m deep. Formed ‘south’ wall of (90)
41	Mid. Brown-grey compact, rubble soil and mortar fills of (40) to depth
42	C. 50mm thick Layer of crushed brick, c. 1 m diameter – may relate to (3) where it is cut by (40). Is above (13).
43	0.63 m by 0.59 m, square shaped, steep sided cut of post-hole, northernmost of row that includes (28), (30), (32), (61).
44	Mid. Dark-grey brown, compact clay fill of (43) to 0.2 m depth
45/ 3	3.5 m long by 0.54 m wide, north – south stretch of brick wall on north side of (40). Seen as a continuation of alignment of (3).
46	Distinctive yellow/ orange clay fill below (22). One of a few for robber trench 5
46b-d	Further fills of cut 5
47	Demolition rubble and in-situ(?) mortared brickwork. May relate to (197)/(198). Is above (46)
48	Mortar layer below (24), between (19) and (112)

49	North – south vertical cut of foundation trench for wall (51), on west side. Continues entire length. Is 0.28 m wide.
50	Orange clay loam and brick fill of (49) to 0.42 m depth, below (23)
50 b-d	Further fills in cut 49. Below (50), (50b) and (50d) and (50b) respectively
51/208	In-situ brick wall foundation, 19.5 m long, north – south aligned, below (20). Disturbed by (19)? Ribble at south end is (208)
52	Disturbed natural geology(?), to west of (49). Below (48)
53	North-south narrow cut/ foundation trench of (3)

54	Backfill of foundation trench (53) to depth. Associated with wall (3)
55	East – west aligned band of yellow- orange clay with cbm inclusions, north of (41), within upper levels of (90) and is above (91)
56	0.68 m wide cut relating to (40). Is probable robbed out buttress
57	Light mid-brown/grey silty soil and rubble fill of robber trench (56)
58	Light brown and grey layer of clay soil extending along entire length of (55). Is below (2) and (126). Possibly redeposited natural
59	Layer of yellow-grey clay/ soil east of (45)/ (3), at north end of trench (also into low lying area/ valley bottom). Possibly redeposited natural.
60	Layer of dark-grey sandy clay soil with charcoal inclusions in area of (59) and (45). Possible demolition layer

61	Square shaped, vertically cut post hole forming an alignment with (28), (30), (32), (43). Below (8), (9) and (18)
62	Dark brown/grey clay and rubble fill of (61) to depth (0.24 m). Below (2) and (7)
63	A dark, ashy soil fill below (41) in robber trench (40), below (41). Overlaps (41). Is above (64). One of the tip-lines seen in (40)
64	A dark brown silty clay soil with orange flecks at base of robber trench (40), below (41) and (63). One of several fills within (40). May include post demolition silting
65	A c. 0.27 m thick, circular layer/spread of dark grey and brown mixed soils/ burnt material c. 0.74 m wide and possibly extending eastwards beyond limit of excavation. Possibly also extends northwards where it becomes (66). Truncated by post hole (67)(?)
66	Dark – grey brown sandy soil and burnt material, c. 0.73 m long to the immediate north of (65). Is probably a continuation of (65)
67	C. 0.5 m diameter, loosely square shaped cut of post-hole wedged between (65) and (66). Forms one in an alignment of post-holes; (69), (71), (85), (92)
68	Dark grey-brown, loose loam fill of (67), to 0.14 m depth. One of two fills to 0.14 m depth
68a	Orange – pink clay/ mortar and cbm fill of (67). Seen to be ‘lining’ interior of cut as with (70) to 0.31 m depth
69	Loosely square shaped cut of post-hole on alignment with (67) etc. c. 0.65 by 0.61 m, 0.31 m deep
70	Orange – pink clay packed around upper half of internal face of (69) to 0.18 m depth
70a	Dark brown, loose soil and Mortar fill within and below (70) in (69), to depth

71	C 0.5 m wide square shaped cut of post-hole on alignment with (67) etc. 0.26 m deep
72/72a	Dark grey-brown silty loam fill of (71) to 0.26m depth. (72a) is pink clay element of fill, as with above
73	0.48 m by 0.30 m cut seemingly attached (or cut by?) wall (76). Similar to above but smaller
74/ 74a	Two fills of (73); (74) is pink clay seemingly capping feature. Below is (74a); dark grey-brown loose loam to 0.3 m depth
75	0.7 m wide, vertical sided cut of north – south aligned robber trench. Bottoms at 0.32 m. Is related to and runs parallel with (76). Truncates (4), butts up to (40). Is related to 2 nd phase building
76	Dark grey-brown soil fill of (75) with abundant cbm rubble inclusions to 0.32 m depth. Is demolition rubble similar to (20)
76a	Fill of feature related to (76) within drain (4). Comprises abundant material as with (76) but is concentrated in the area of the drain. Is within (75) and 'below' (76). Found to be covered in broken brickwork
77	1.8 m by 1.1 m spread of demolition material west of (75), below (2). Similar to (7). May be overflow of backfill/ demolition rubble (76)
78	General spread of dark orange-brown loam and demolition material east of (75). Maybe (76) overspill
79	0.5 m by 0.5 m cut of a post hole on alignment with (76), (69) etc.
80/ 80a	Orange-pink clay and soil fills of (79), similar to (68), (70), (72), (74), (86), to depth of 0.35 m. (80) appears to cap (80a) as with (74)
81	Large c. 2 m x 1 m cut into (75). Larger than previously mentioned post-holes. In area of (67) and (69).
82	Dark grey-brown, sandy loam fill of (81) to depth of 0.43 m. 'Overflows' onto (76)

83	0.33 m wide, 17 m long, straight sided cut of foundation trench running parallel to the west side of (75)/ (76).
84	Compact orange-grey and grey brown patchy soil fill of cut (83) to depth of 0.28 m
85	Loosely square shaped cut to north of (67). Forms an alignment with (67), (69), (71) etc. is 0.6 m by 0.57 m, 0.23 m deep. On alignment with (79) etc.
86/ 86a	Dark grey-brown soil fill of (85) to depth. (86a) is pink clay 'lining' as above
87	Layer of burnt material and dark brown soil between (86) and (89), above drain (4). Similar to (65), (66)
88	Loosely square shaped cut of 'post-hole' forming alignment with (85) etc. 0.26 m by 0.25 m. On alignment with (85) etc.
89/89a	Light grey-brown sandy loam and Orange – pink clay fills of (88) to depth of 0.23 m
90	C. 14 m long straight sided, vertical cut of east – west aligned linear feature (drain), running parallel/ alongside (40). When excavated found to be c. 1 m wide by 1 m deep. Contains (55) and (91) etc

91	Brick surface (0.3 m high), at base of (90), below (55). Laid purposefully/ mortared together and probably formed the floor of the drain. Some robbing apparent and small gulleys seen to cut into it. The bricks are not laid in any particular bond
92	Square shaped cut of post-hole on alignment with (88) etc. Is 0.5 m by 0.5m and 0.38 m deep
93/ 93a	Dark grey-brown sandy loam soil and pink clay fills of (92) to depth. Pink clay (93a) appears to line internal face of cut
94	Yellow-orange clay layer at northeast corner of site, below (124). May be 'natural' with cbm flecks transferred from context above.

95	Square cut at northeast end of (40) and (90) for east facing robbed out buttress. 0.8 m long by 0.56 m wide and 0.8 m deep.
96	Light grey-brown mortar and soil fill of (95) to depth. Brickwork below may be remains of (91). Is backfill of robbed out buttress
97	Square cut at northeast corner of (40) and (90) for north facing robbed out buttress (at right angles with (95)), similar dimensions to (95)
98	Light grey-brown mortar and soil fill of cut (97) to depth. (91) remains seen below. Is backfill of robbed out buttress
99	Circular cut for 'post hole', c. 0.23 m diameter, 0.25 m deep, in mortar layer (25)/(198). Is unlike postholes with pink clay fill
100	Grey-brown loose loam fill of (99) to depth
101	0.77 m by 0.63 m cut of 'post hole' south of (111). Forms alignment with (105), (107), (109) etc. vertical sides to 0.48 m depth
102	Dark grey sandy loam fill of (101) to depth. Also appears to contain a small amount of redeposited 'natural'
103	North-south aligned narrow (3 – 6cm wide) groove filled with dark, loose soil for c. 5 m to east of (101). Probable plough line. Cuts through (195), (197), (190). Several 'plough' lines were noted at the south end of the site but are not numbered. All seem to cut through 1 st phase features but this cannot be verified – not recorded at the time
104	Yellow-grey clay layer/ spledge below (2) and (25)/(198). Contains patches of mortar that may be remnants of (25)/(198). Is cut into by (101), (105), (107) – layer may be 'natural'
105	0.64 m diameter, vertical sided cut of posthole on alignment with (101), (107) etc. Is 0.43 m deep
106	Light grey-brown sandy soil fill of (105) to depth

107	c. 0.56 m by 0.49 m, loosely square cut of post hole on alignment with (101), (105) etc. Is c. 0.46 m deep
108	Light orange-brown, sandy loam and rubble fill of (107) to depth. Contains mortar, cbm and charcoal flecks

109	Area of in-situ brickwork at south end of north – south aligned, robbed out linear feature, see (110), (111). Single course on 'natural'
110	c. 10.5 m long 'cut' of north-south robbed linear feature. Filled by (109) and (111). Truncated by (40) and (90)
111	Rubble 'fill' at north end of robbed feature (110). Relates to (109)
112	c. 15.76 m stretch of 'cut' of north – south aligned linear feature, possibly wall, below (2). (123) is northern stretch. Feature is truncated by (40) and (90). Phase 1 west wall
113	In-situ brick work within (112)/ (123). 0.4 m wide, 5 – 6 courses high to 0.5 m. Tile course 3 brick courses from base. North end (123) butts up to (166). At south end is scar of possible removed buttress (152)?
114	0.26 m thick, narrow strip of clay and rubble mix between (113) and (154) below 1
115	Layer, similar and to the north of (114)
116	Layer similar to (114) and (115), further north
117	Demolition rubble in area of (114), (115) and (116). May relate to (120)
118	North – south aligned, c. 20 m long cut of robbed feature, dog-legged midway along its course. Is c. 0.2 m deep. West wall of Phase 2
119	Fill of (118) to depth. Rubble element more concentrated at north end

120	Large area of dark brown and grey mortar soil demolition rubble west of (119). Is above (114), (115), (117), (119), (127), (128), (132) and (139)
121	Cut (?) at northwest end/area of (41) and (90). 0.8 m by 0.48 m by 0.8 m deep. May relate to (205) as is in area of
122	Appears to be rubble fill of (121). When removed was interpreted as a demolition layer
123	North end of wall (112)/ (113), below (2). Truncated by (40) and (90). Grubbed out at north end, c. 3 m length remaining
124	Layer of compact orange-brown soil to north of (94) at northeast corner of site
125	Cut of a small, roughly circular feature in area of double buttress (95) and (97). 0.12 m by 0.1 m, 0.1 m deep. Uncertain posthole?
126	Orange-brown loose, sandy loam fill of (125) to depth

127	Layer of light orange-brown compact clay loam below (120). May be disturbed 'natural'
128	'Layer' in general area of (120) and (144). May be 'natural', same as (127)
129	Large spread/ layer of material, some of it burnt, west of (128). Interpreted as midden due to large amounts of mixed material (artefact and ecofact), within a dark brown/ black loose loam. Extends beyond western boundary of site into surrounding field. Depth not recorded
130/ 131	Rectangular shaped brick feature (0.50 m by 0.36 m), jutting westwards from (112), on east-west alignment. One course deep on silty clay, below (120). Relates to drain (154)
132	C. 19 m long, north-south aligned feature comprising a thin layer of crushed brick/ rubble, becoming more substantial northwards. At this end the brickwork steps down to compensate for lower land. Butts up to west end of (166). Is same as

	(144).
133	Cut at south end of west side of trench. Steep sided, 0.37 m by 0.51 m, 0.2 m deep
134/134a	Fill of dark grey loose loam with cbm inclusions in (133) to depth. (134a) is additional fill of pink clay
135	Straight sided cut to west of (118), cutting into (154). C. 0.75 m by 0.49 m, 0.21 m deep. Is below (120)
136/136a	Dark brown loam soil and orange-pink clay fills of (135). Pink clay fill (136a) appears to deliberately line internal face of (135)
137	Cut of 0.43 m diameter vertical sided posthole on alignment with (135). 0.17 m deep. Revealed below (2)
138/138a	Dark brown loam/ demolition rubble and pink clay fill of (137). As with (136a) pink clay appears to line (137)
139	C. 4 m long, north-south aligned, in-situ brick feature possibly relating to (154). Cut by (150), (209)
140	Oval shaped cut north of (142) and (137). 0.54 m by 0.47 m, 0.38 m deep
141/141a	Light grey-brown, loose sandy soil fill of (140) to depth. Additional fill of (140); orange-pink clay on west internal side of feature
142	Cut at west side of (140) in alignment with (150), (209). C. 0.4 m diameter
143/143a	Soil and pink clay fill of (143)
144	c. 19 m long wall on north-south alignment. Spread of brickwork becoming courses of towards north end. Is same as (132)
145	Layer of clay below (120), in area of (144). Consists of light yellow and grey clay, probably redeposited or disturbed 'natural'. Similar to (127) and (128)
146	West side cut of narrow foundation trench for (113), present at south end – petering out northwards. Below (1)

147	Medium grey-brown, loose clay loam fill of (146)
148	East side cut of foundation trench for (113)
149	Fill of (148) for (113). Poss. same as (147)
150	Cut of loosely circular feature on alignment with (137) and (209). C. 0.55 m diameter, 0.36 m deep. Below (127)
151/151a	Yellow-brown, crumbly sandy soil fill of (150) to depth. (151a) is additional pink clay fill seen as lining internal walls of cut. Below (120) and (127)
152	In-situ brickwork at base of cut (146), below (147). Interpreted as rubble base for (113)
153	In-situ brickwork at base of (148), below (149). Probably continuation of rubble base for (113) (on east side), therefore relates to (152)
154	C. 5 m long in-situ, linear brick feature, north-south aligned. Truncated by (118)/ (119). Robbed out a further 2 m length at north end. Is brick-lined drain below (120)
155	Cut of linear feature on north-south alignment at north end of (112). Possibly remnant of (112) and (123). Truncated by (40)
156	Is same as (113)
157	Layer of bricks laid horizontally in a north-south alignment for c. 4 m. Similar to (139) but not part of. Below (2) and (120). Relates to Phase 1a
158	Straight sided cut of robber trench for buttress (159) at west end of (40). C. 1.08 m by 1.2 m, 0.65 m deep. Relates to buttress 219

159	Grey-brown, sandy, mortar soil-fill of (158). Similar in nature to (41)
160/ 161	Same as (121) and (122)
162	Considerably large layer of rubble in northwest area of overall trench. Comprises brick and tile. Covers sloped ground and therefore ranges in depth between 0.2 m to 0.7 m thick. Contains abundant cbm and fallen masonry probably from (144)

163	One brick deep, layer of bricks close to western extent of excavation site. Within (129). At first considered to be in-situ brick feature but on further investigation found not to be
164	Thin layer of loose chalk on either side of drain (4), 7.6 m along its course. Possibly aided soaking up overflowing water. Is below (2), (12), (65), (87)
165	L shaped, <i>in-situ</i> brick feature in northwest area of site, within the Phase 1a extension. Could be remnant of flooring
166	East-west aligned brick wall. Relates to (144) and (45). C. 4 m long, 0.37 m to 0.62 m wide and 0.7 m. at highest point. Substantially built, steps down to compensate for low ground at northwest corner of site. Relates to (144) and (123)
167	15 m long layer of hard mortar above reused brick work in spine wall, above (168)/ (169), all composites of feature (51). Below (20)
168	Lumps of mortared brickwork forming the west side of wall (51) for c. 15 m. Below (167)
169	Opposing brickwork on east side of (51), below (167)
170	North – south cut of shallow slot in (90). C. 1 m long by 0.4 m wide. Revealed below (55). Cuts through (91). Drain gully
171	Fill of grey streaked silty clay – probably the silt from drainage within (170)

172	Cut, as (170). 1 m long by 0.2 – 3 m wide
173	Fill, as (171)
174	Cut, as (170, (172). 0.8 m by 0.35 m
175	Fill, as (171), (173)
176	Cut, as (170) etc. 0.85 m by 0.22 m
177	Fill, as (171) etc.
178	Cut, as (170) etc. 0.8 m by 0.3 m
179	Fill, as (171) etc.
180	East – west cut similar to (170), below (95). ‘opens’ into (182) at west end
181	Fill, as (171) etc.
182	Cut of slot similar to (170) etc. slightly curvilinear. C. 1.4 m by 0.4 m
183	Fill, as (171) etc.
184	In-situ brick pier/ buttress, c. 0.65 m long (at base), in drain (90). Would have butted up to north wall of (40). 13 brick courses high (0.95 m), ‘sitting’ on (91). Has small opening at base probably for drainage. Is only remaining of four along wall (4)
185	Cut of a small post-hole like feature immediately northeast of cut (69)

187	Cut of small post-hole like feature on alignment with (185), (220) and located close to (71)
188	Fill of cut (187)
189	Layer immediately east of (75), in area of (71) and (187). Indistinct, possibly remnant of (76)
190	Thin layer of burnt material, possibly relating to demolition, between (112) and (168) at south end of site. Fairly indistinct; above (195)
191	Vertical sided cut of a post-hole like feature at southeast corner of site; c. 0.45 m diameter, 0.2 m deep
192/192a	Brown soil and pink clay fills of (191) to depth
193	East – west aligned brick feature at southeast of site, below (2) and (120). Substantial structure in two parts with c. 1 m gap between. Stands c. 0.9 m high; 5 courses visible. Appears to have been truncated by (118) seen running through the gap. Related to/ bonded with wall (144) and (122). Phase 1a
194	Layer of bricks, one brick deep between two-part feature (193), below (2) and (119). 0.50 m by 0.34 m; may relate to (193) as foundation layer. Cut by (118)?
195	East-west aligned, c. 6 m long, substantial, mortared brickwork cut by (19). Butts up to (196) and (197). Is 0.57 m wide and 0.29 m high. Comprises c. 5 courses. Relates to (193). Phase 1a
196	Area of substantial, mortared brickwork butting up to north side of (195). Relates to (197) and wall (3) which butts up to north side. Is cut through by (19/208). Phase 1
197	East – west aligned strip of brickwork on north side of (195). Appearance of grubbing and probably relates to (196). Phase 1

198	Mortar layer, with outline of bricks present on surface, to immediate north of (197). Is same as (25); flooring(?)
199	Vertical sided cut of a loosely square feature on alignment with (191), midway along robbed wall (201/202) close to (206)

200/200a	Dark grey-brown loam and pink clay fills of (199)
201	c. 13 m long by c. 0.5 m wide cut of east-west aligned trench feature (robbed out wall), at southern end of site. Relates to southern end of Phase 2 building
202	Grey-brown soil and demolition rubble fill of (201), below (2) and (120).
203	Single row of bricks on east west alignment, at south end of (204), southeast corner of site. One brick deep


204	c. 5 m long by 1.6 m wide, 8 cm thick layer of demolition rubble spreading north from (203). May be remains of flooring/courtyard?
205	In-situ base of brick pier/ buttress revealed at north west end of (40) below (41/55). One course surviving above brick surface (91) and contains an opening for draining. Is one of several buttresses supporting wall (41). Was grubbed out along with wall and backfilled with rubble. Gulley (229) and associated contexts are within and below (205). Phase 2
206	Cut of c. 0.45 m diameter circular feature at south end of (19), in area of (199). Is c. 0.17 m deep
