EXCAVATIONS.

During the year the Society organised excavations in the Linenhall Street area, under the guidance of Mr. G. Webster, but unfortunately this had to be postponed before much work could be done owing to lack of labour. One or two unusual features were, however, found.

A hoard of Saxon coins was found in Castle Esplanade and as a result of the energetic work undertaken by Mr. Webster over 570 coins were recovered together with a portion of the jar in which they were contained. It is hoped that a number of these coins, which have been sent up to the British Museum, will be eventually deposited in the Grosvenor Museum.

Since the end of the year Mr. Webster has given a lecture on work carried out during the year under review.

GENERAL.

During the year the Council of the Society have met on three occasions and various sub-committees have met on a number of occasions. Decisions upon certain amendments to the form and printing of the Society's Journal have been made and a large number of matters have been discussed and instructions given to the Hon. Secretary.

Negotiations are in progress with the Ministry of Works with a view to commencing work on the excavation of the Roman Amphitheatre.

The Society's Library has been handed over to the Chester Corporation and the arrangements entered into with the Corporation are working satisfactorily.

EXCAVATIONS:

Owing to lack of labour the Society was unable to organize the exploration of the northern rampart of the Fortress, in the Deanery Field as expected, but Mr. Graham Webster carried out excavations in the Infirmary Field in the hope of finding a Roman Burial. He did not succeed in this but found a Roman building, the function of which has yet to be established.

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GENERAL:

During the year the Council has had a large number of matters under consideration, foremost amongst them being the publication of the Journal in a new form, which appears to have met with general approval.

The Ministry of Works has been approached with a view to expediting the excavations on the site of the Roman Amphitheatre. Progress is being made with the proposal to transfer the site to them and it is hoped that this matter will be brought to a satisfactory conclusion in the current year.

The Society's negatives and lantern slides have been handed over to the Chester Corporation for care and attention prior to deposit at the Grosvenor Museum.

The Society's Library, which was handed over to the Corporation last year has been considerably repaired, over 600 volumes having been rebound.
