St. John's House.

Tenancy of St. John's House was given up by the County Council in September 1957. At the request of the Trustees of the House three representatives of the Ministry of Works visited Chester on October 2nd to discuss with the Trustees the long-planned transfer of the property to the Ministry by Deed of Gift and the subsequent excavation and preservation of the Amphitheatre. A trial excavation has been conducted to determine the exact northern boundaries of the Amphitheatre and a necessary diversion of Little St. John Street is planned for the autumn of 1958. The Society has agreed to demolish St. John's House and leave the site ready for excavation by the Ministry of Works at the end of the year.

COUNCIL MEETINGS.

The Council met on three occasions; the principal matter discussed was that of St. John's House referred to above. In May a letter was sent by the Council to the Town Clerk expressing the Society's concern at the suggestion that the "Nine Houses" in Park Street might be demolished. The Society will have been gratified to learn that these houses are to be preserved.

EXCAVATIONS.

At the beginning of the year a Roman building first located in 1951 in the Infirmary Field was thoroughly explored. It measured 40 feet by 50 feet, divided by crosswalls to form six rooms, and was most probably an isolated small house built outside the western defences of the fortress. In March when the Old Light-Cake Shop at 16, Northgate Street was about to be incorporated into Quaintway's building a careful photographic and drawn record was made of the mediaeval cellars, probably 13th century, with their segmental arches at the rear. A timber framed wall containing the original wattle-and-daub infilling with traces of painted decoration was also exposed. In April further operations at a site in Nicholas Street made it possible to complete the plan of a rampart building on the western legionary defences and an interval tower $21\frac{1}{2}$ ft. by 17ft. at the rear of the wall was discovered. The last excavation was that of October to determine the northern boundary of the Amphitheatre.

LIBRARY.

The pattern of use of the Society's Library has been similar to that of recent years. Twenty-two members borrowed eighty volumes between them compared with eighty-eight volumes borrowed by eighteen members in 1956. It is a pity that more members do not take advantage of the facilities of this most useful collection. It may be helpful to inform new members that the Society's Library is housed in Chester Public Library, St. John Street, and is available, either for reference or borrowing during normal library hours.

There was no expenditure on rebinding during 1957.

MEMBERSHIP.

During the year thirty-four new members joined the Society. Twenty-four members died, resigned or were lost trace of. Membership at 31st December 1957, was 301, including 39 Libraries, 3 ex-Officio and 11 Associate members. This constituted a new record total.
