ABSTRACT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31 DECEMBER 1982

Officers and Members of Council

At the Annual General Meeting held on 3 March 1982, Mr. G. Burkinshaw, O.B.E., was re-elected Chairman for the ensuing year. The other Officers of the Society were duly confirmed or elected, together with four members of Council to serve for the period 1982-85: Mr. C. N. Moore, Dr. M. V. J. Seaborne, Mr. A. G. Veysey, and Dr. G. J. White. During 1982 the Society continued to be represented on the City of Chester Conservation Area Advisory Committee, the County Palatine of Chester Local History Committee of Cheshire Community Council, Group V of the Council for British Archaeology, and the St. John's House Trust.

Activities of the Society in 1982

The Society held its usual seven monthly meetings in 1982. There were two public lectures: the John Lowe Lecture for 1981-82 was given in April by Mr. H. Chesshyre, Chester Herald, on the work of the College of Arms; and the one for 1982-83 was given by Dr. J. Maddison on 'The Arrival of the Perpendicular Style in the North West'. Mr. T. J. Strickland lectured on 'Recent Archaeological Excavations in Chester' twice during the year, in January and October. The speaker engaged for the February lecture was unfortunately unable to give his talk, owing to illness, and the Honorary Secretary spoke instead on 'John Jones of Stalybridge'. Mr. C. N. Moore spoke after the Annual General Meeting on 'Recent Acquisitions to Grosvenor Museum Collections'. In December a joint meeting was arranged with the North Wales Metallurgical Society, at which Professor G. D. B. Jones spoke on 'Recent Research in Roman Mining in Wales and the Marches'.

Excursions were arranged to Bridgnorth, Wilderhope Manor, and Much Wenlock; to Dunham Massey and Rostherne; and to Oxford for a weekend in July. Other outings were arranged for members of the Industrial Archaeology Section of the Society, to Bersham, Runcorn docks, and the Alyn Valley. A party also visited the archaeological excavations at Beeston Castle. Social events included a hot pot supper, and a buffet held jointly with the Grosvenor Museum Society.

Issue No. 3 of the Society's *Newsletter* was published in September, and circulated to members with the 1982-83 membership cards.

The Society is most grateful to all those Officers and members whose efforts have enabled this varied programme to be carried out.

Membership

In December 1982, there were 187 Ordinary Members, 61 Institutional Members, 60 Associate Members, and 9 Honorary or *ex officio* Members of the Society.
