

*Note on the Roman pottery from the evaluation at Crossrail: Moorgate Shaft, 91-109
Moorgate, EC2M (XSP10)*

Seven sherds of pottery were recovered from the evaluation shaft (Context [2]). Aside from one small abraded sherd of Late Iron Age flint-tempered ware (FLIN) these are all Roman in date. The Roman material also shows signs of abrasion and may have been disturbed from the original place of deposition. The assemblage is dated AD 150–200 based on a sherd of an east Gaulish samian Dragendorff form 33 cup (SAMEG 6DR33); interestingly this is the best preserved sherd from the group. The range of fabrics present includes black-burnished wares typical of the 2nd-century AD.
