I am a lecturer in Roman Archaeology at the Institute of Archaeology, UCL, but today I'm in the midst of a short research visit to the Topoi Excellence Cluster at Freie Universität Berlin. Topoi is a large research cluster dedicated to the study of space and knowledge in antiquity, and has a full programme of workshops and meetings which bring together researchers from many disciplines and institutions. I'm here as a Senior Fellow for a month, working with Dr Kerstin Hofmann and colleagues in the key topic group 'Identities: space and knowledge related identification'. In addition to getting on with my own research on Roman Britain, it's fantastic to have the opportunity to discuss various issues in the archaeology of identity with scholars based here. While there are many points of contact, there are also of course differences in the traditions of study into past identity in the UK/US and Germany, and it's really interesting to learn more about these.
